

#### RF Exposure evaluation

According to 447498 D01 General RF Exposure Guidance v05

The 1-g and 10-g SAR test exclusion thresholds for 100 MHz to 6 GHz at test separation distances  $\leq 50$  mm are determined by:

$$[(\text{max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW}) / (\text{min. test separation distance, mm})] \cdot [\sqrt{f(\text{GHz})}] \leq 3.0 \text{ for 1-g SAR and } \leq 7.5 \text{ for 10-g extremity SAR, where}$$

$f(\text{GHz})$  is the RF channel transmit frequency in GHz

Power and distance are rounded to the nearest mW and mm before calculation

The result is rounded to one decimal place for comparison

#### WIFI:

Worse case is as below: [2437MHz 7.73dBm ( 5.93 mW) output power]

$(5.93 \text{ mW} / 5\text{mm}) \cdot [\sqrt{2.441(\text{GHz})}] = 1.86 < 3.0 \text{ for 1-g SAR}$

#### BT:

Worse case is as below: [2480MHz 7.85dBm ( 6.095 mW) output power]

$(6.095 \text{ mW} / 5\text{mm}) \cdot [\sqrt{2.480(\text{GHz})}] = 1.93 < 3.0 \text{ for 1-g SAR}$

Then SAR evaluation is not required
