Getting Started

This guide helps you learn about your device hardware, assembly-procedures, and how to get started using your device.

Assemble Your Device


Before using the device, you must install the SIM card, memory card, and charge the battery.

Your device uses a nano-SIM card. The SIM card may come preinstalled or you can use your old SIM card.

Installing an SD Card/SIM Card

To install a SIM card or a micro-SD, power off the device and follow the below steps:

1. Insert the SIM pin tool into the SIM pinhole on the tray to open the tray.
2. Insert the microSD card with the gold contacts facing down and close the tray.




Charging the Battery

Before using your phone, you must fully charge the battery (100%).

Warning! Use only approved charging devices and batteries. Using other accessories may void your warranty and may damage your device.

1. Plug the USB cable into the USB power adapter.
2. Plug the power adapter into a standard outlet.
3. Plug the other end of the USB cable into the phone's micro USB port.
4. The USB icon on the cable should always face up when connecting the cable to your device, as shown.



NOTE:

- Charge your device's battery with the device turned off to maximize efficiency.
- Over time, battery life decreases steadily.
- Do not charge the battery for longer than eight hours.

Set Up Your Device

Turn Your Device ON/OFF

The instructions below explain how to turn your device ON or OFF.

To Turn the Device ON

- Press and hold the **Power/Lock** key until the device turns ON.

NOTE: The first time you use your phone, you'll need to set it up.

To Turn the Device OFF

- If the display is off, press the **Power/Lock** to turn it back on.
- Press and hold the **Power/Lock** for a few seconds.
- When the phone options menu appears, tap **Power OFF**.
- Tap **OK**.

Initial Setup

The first time you turn your device ON (or after a reset to factory settings), the on-screen prompts guide you through the basics of setting up your device.

Follow the prompts to choose a default language, set up accounts, choose location services, learn about your device's features, and more.

Secure Your Device

You can use your device's screen lock features to secure your device.

- To lock the device, press the **Power** key.
- To unlock the device, press the **Power** key and swipe up to unlock.


Touchscreen Gestures

Tap	You can select the on-screen items such as application icons or settings buttons by touching them with your finger.
Tap and Hold	Touch and hold your finger over the item to open its options.
Swipe or Slide	Drag your finger horizontally or vertically across the screen.
Drag	Tap and hold your finger before you begin to drag and hold your finger down until the item reaches your desired location.
Flick	Swiping the screen is similar to flicking, but you need to swipe it with lighter and quicker strokes instead. Finger gestures are always vertical. For example, flicking through contacts or messages.
Rotate	You can change the orientation of most screens from portrait to landscape simply by turning the phone sideways. Turning the phone sideways will bring up a larger on-screen keyboard.

Know Your Device

Home Screen

The Home screen serves as the start of your experience.



The Home screen is displayed when the device is in idle mode.

The Home screen allows you to add shortcuts, folders, and widgets to your favorite apps to be easily accessible.

To access the Home screen,

- Press Home ● to return to the center of the home screen.

Previewing the Home Screen

From any Home screen, tap and hold the desired application. The application moves to your selected Home screen once you select it.

Customizing the Home Screen

You can customize the Home screens and the display wallpaper.

Moving an Item on the Home Screen

1. Open the Home screen you want to customize.
2. Tap and hold the item you want to move until it vibrates.
3. Drag the item to a new location on your Home screen.
4. Point your finger at the location where you want the item.

NOTE: To add shortcuts to a Home screen, swipe up from your app list to reveal all your applications. Next, find the app you wish to add, tap and hold on the item, and drag it onto the Home screen.

Removing an Item from the Home Screen

1. From the Home screen, tap and hold an item until it vibrates.
2. Drag the item to **X** to remove the item.

Changing the Wallpaper of the Home Screen

1. From the Home screen, tap and hold any empty area on the Home screen for a few seconds.
2. Tap **Wallpapers**. Choose a photo from your camera gallery or memory card.
3. Tap **Set Wallpaper**.

Widgets

Widgets are extensions for applications that appear on the Home screen. Widgets include links to a specific contact, Internet bookmarks, Gmail and email accounts, and many more.

Add a Widget to a Home Screen

1. Touch and hold any empty area on the Home screen > select **Widgets**.
2. Touch and hold the required widget, drag it to the Home screen and release it.

Remove a Widget

1. From the Home screen, touch and hold the widget you want to remove.
2. Drag the widget to **X Remove** and release it.

NOTE: By removing a widget, you are not deleting it but rather removing it from the Home screen.

App Shortcuts

You can add a shortcut to the Home screen.

Adding an App Shortcut

1. Touch and hold any preloaded or downloaded app on the Home screen.
2. Drag the app to the screen and release it.

Removing the Shortcut

1. Touch and hold the app shortcut you want to remove from the Home screen.
2. Drag the app shortcut to **X Remove** and release it.

Folders

Use folders to organize items on your Home screen.

Creating/Removing a Folder

1. Drag one application over another to create a folder.
2. You can name a folder and drag other applications into it.
3. You can move folders in the same way that you move applications.
4. To remove a folder, touch and hold the folder that you want to remove, drag the folder to **X Remove** and release it.

Status Bar

The Status Bar at the top of the home screen provides device information (such as network status, battery charge, and time) on the right side and notification alerts on the left.



Notification Panel

Notification icons on the Status Bar display calendar events, device status, and much more.

Viewing and Responding to Notifications

1. Tap and hold the Status bar, and slide your finger downward to open the Notifications panel.



2. If you have multiple notifications, you may have to scroll to them all.
3. Tap the desired notification to respond.
4. To close the notification panel, drag the bottom bar of the panel or tap **Back**.

Using the On-screen Keyboard

Type your text input using the onboard keyboard. The keyboard opens automatically in some applications. For others, tap anywhere in a text field to launch the keyboard.

1. Tap each letter on the on-screen keypad.
2. Tap and hold a letter for additional key options (not all keys have additional options). Additional key options include numbers and letters with accent marks. If options are available, you will see a box with all the options shown. Slide your finger to select the character you want.
3. You may continue until the word is complete.



- Tap the key marked **3** above while you type. When you release the key, the lowercase letters reappear.
- Turn caps lock on - double-tap or touch & hold.
- Tap the key marked **3** and tap the shift key again to return to lowercase.
- Tap the key marked **1** to delete words, tap **4** so you can change the number and sign on the keyboard.
- To hide the Android keyboard, tap the **Back**.
- When writing a new message, you can tap **2** to skip from the receiver frame to the text frame.

NOTE: You can select input methods when typing in the notification panel.

Adding/Editing/Deleting Words in the User Dictionary

The predictive text dictionary may require the addition of a word, for example, a name or a technical term.

If you want to add a word to your User Dictionary while typing,

- Double-tap it to highlight > tap and hold the word, and select **Add to dictionary**.

If you want to add a word manually,

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your Apps  > find and tap the **Settings** .
2. Scroll down and tap the **System** .
3. Tap **Language & input** .
4. Tap **Personal Dictionary** and tap the **plus sign**.
5. Type the word > tap  **Enter** on the keyboard.

Editing/Deleting a Word

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your **Apps**  > find and tap the **Settings** .
2. Scroll down and Tap the **System** .
3. Tap **Language & input**  > **Advanced**.
4. Tap **Personal Dictionary** > tap the word to delete or edit.
5. Tap  to delete the word.

Editing Text

You can select, copy or cut the text you've entered, then paste it in another text field within the user interface.


NOTE: Some applications may offer different text editing methods.

Select the Text

1. Tap the text field.
2. Move the cursor to the beginning or end of the desired text by tapping in the location you want the cursor.
3. Tap and hold the text field.
4. Tap **Select word** in the pop-up menu or tap **Select all** to select all the text in the text field.
5. Drag your finger to move the text cursor to the letter within the text that you want to select. The selected text is highlighted in orange.

Cut/Copy the Text

1. Double-click to select the text to cut or copy it.
2. Tap and hold the selected text.
3. Tap **Cut** or **Copy** in the menu that opens.



- If you tap **Cut**, the selected text is removed from the text field. In this case, the text is saved to the clipboard so you can paste it into another text field.

Paste the Text

1. Cut or copy the text to paste.
2. Tap the text field where you want to paste the text and move the cursor to your desired location.
 - You can paste text that you copied from one application into the text field in any other application.
3. Tap and hold, then select Paste in the pop-up menu.
 - The text is inserted after the cursor, and the text remains in the clipboard so that you can paste that same text into another location.

NOTE: When you type, the notification panel will have a “select input method” so you can set the input methods.

Glide Typing

The Google Keyboard lets you slide your finger across the letters to spell the word.

To enable glide typing

1. Touch and hold the comma (,) > tap **Settings > Glide Typing**.
2. Touch **Enable Gesture Typing** to turn ON/OFF. Slide your finger from letter to letter to spell a word.
3. Do not lift your finger until you have completed spelling a word.

Google Voice Typing

Use voice recognition to convert speech to text. You must be connected to mobile data or Wi-Fi.

To enable Google voice typing,

1. Tap  on the Google search bar.
2. When “Try saying something” appears, speak your text.
3. Tap  to end recording.

Adding, Editing or Deleting Words in the User Dictionary

Sometimes you may need to add a word to the predictive text dictionary, for example, a name or a specialized technical word. If you want to add a word to your User dictionary while entering text, double-tap the word to highlight it, then tap and hold the word and select Add ** to the dictionary.

Adding a word manually

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your **Apps**  > find and tap the **Settings**  > **System**.
2. Tap **Language & input** > **Personal dictionary**.
3. Tap the plus sign and type the word and the shortcut.
4. Hit **Enter** on the keyboard to save.

Editing or deleting a word

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your **Apps**  > find and tap the **Settings** .
2. Tap **Language & input** > **Personal dictionary**.
3. Type the word to delete or edit.
4. Tap the trash can to delete the word or Enter to save the edit.

Selecting Text

You can select, copy or cut the text you've entered, then paste it in another text field within the user interface.

NOTE: Some applications may offer different text editing methods.

Selecting text

1. Tap the text field.
2. Move the cursor to the beginning or end of the desired text by tapping in the location you want the cursor.
3. Tap and hold the text field.
4. Tap **Select word** in the pop-up menu or tap **Select all** to select all the text in the text field.
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Pasting the Text

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2. Tap the text field where you want to paste the text and move the cursor to your desired location.
 - You can paste text that you copied from one application into the text field in any other application.
3. Tap and hold, then select Paste in the pop-up menu.
 - The text is inserted after the cursor, and the text remains in the clipboard so that you can paste that same text into another location.

Screen Timeout/Sleep Mode ON

Sleep mode saves battery power by turning off your display. You will still receive messages and calls when the display is turned off.

Switching to Screen timeout mode

1. Press **Power/Lock** to switch your phone to Screen timeout mode.
2. Your phone automatically turns off the display after a period of inactivity.

To customize the screen timeout settings,

- From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your **Apps**  > **Settings**  > **Display** > **Screen timeout**.

Waking up from Screen timeout mode

1. Your phone automatically wakes up when you have an incoming call.
2. To wake it up manually, press **Power/Lock**. You'll need to unlock the screen as described below.


Unlocking the screen

- Press and hold the **Lock** screen to unlock the screen.

NOTE: If you have set up a screen unlock pattern, pin, or password, you will be asked to draw the pattern on the screen or enter the PIN or password to access the phone software.

Activating Secure Screen Lock

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your **Apps**  > then find and tap **Settings**  > **Security** > **Screen lock**.
 - If you have already configured the screen lock, tap **Screen lock** to change.
2. Tap Pattern, PIN, or Password.
3. Enter the custom pattern, PIN, or password as prompted.



- If you select '**None**', the screen unlock security will be cancelled.

Adjusting Volume

Ringtone and Media volume is independent of each other and adjusted separately.

Adjusting the Ringer Volume

From the Home screen, press **Volume up** or **Volume down** on the right side of the phone to -

- Adjust the ringer volume to your desired level.
- While in the lowest ringer volume level, press Volume Down once to set your phone to Silent mode.
- While in the Silent, press Volume Up once to switch to ring-tone mode.

Adjusting the Media Volume

While playing music, watching a video or using preloaded or downloaded games or applications, press Volume Up or Volume Down on the right side of the phone to adjust the media volume.

Adjusting the Earpiece Volume for Phone Calls

During a phone call, press Volume Up or Volume Down.

Adjusting the volume via Settings menu

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your **Apps** :::: > then find and tap **Settings** .
2. Tap **Sound**.
3. Drag the volume sliders left or right to adjust your phone's Media, Call, Ring & notification, and Alarm.
4. Your phone plays a sample tone at the selected volume level while you drag the slider.

Connecting Your Phone to the Computer

You can copy your music, photos, and other files to the microSD card of your phone.

NOTE: This option is available only when a microSD card is inserted into the slot of your phone. While your phone is connected to a computer, USB Mass storage mode prevents you from using applications that access the memory card.

1. Connect your phone to your computer using the supplied USB cable.
2. Open the Notifications panel > tap USB options.
3. The connected phone is recognized as a removable hard drive on your computer.
4. Navigate to the removable drive and open it.
5. Choose one of the following:
 - Copy the files from the computer to the microSD card's root folder.
 - Copy the files from the phone's microSD card to a folder in your computer.
6. After copying the files, unmount the removable drive (that is, your phone) as required by your computer's operating system to remove your phone safely.
7. After unmounting the removable drive, you can disconnect the phone from the computer.

Phone Calls

Making Calls

The simplest way to make a call is to dial the number directly. You can also call numbers listed in your call log or Contacts list.

Making a call from the dialer screen

1. From the Home screen, tap . Or Swipe up to reveal all your **Apps**  , then find and tap .
2. Tap  > and then the number you want to dial.
 - If you make a mistake, tap  to erase a single character. > Tap and hold  to erase the entire string.
3. Tap  .
 - The Calling screen appears in the Status bar while the call is active.
 - To change the volume during a call, press **Volume Up** / **Volume Down**.
4. Tap  to end the call.

Making an International Call

1. From the Home screen, tap .
2. Tap and hold **0** until the international prefix ‘+’ appears.
3. Tap the country code, area code, and phone number.
4. Tap .

Making a Call from the Contact list

1. From the Home screen, tap  > **Contacts**  or Swipe up to reveal all your **Apps** >  **Contacts** .
2. Scroll through the contact list.
 - To find a specific contact, you can search by tapping  **Search**. Enter the name of the contact you're searching for. As you type, contacts with matching names appear below the search box. Or you can use the tab on the right side of the screen to scroll through the alphabetical contacts.
3. Tap the contact you want to call.

Making an Emergency Call

Your phone supports international emergency numbers such as 911. Emergency calling is supported anywhere the phone has a network signal.

To make an emergency call

1. From the Home screen, tap .
2. Tap the emergency number for your location. This is usually 911, *911 or #911.
3. Tap  to place the call.
4. Tap  to end the emergency call.

Making an emergency call while the phone is locked

When your phone has no service status, the **Emergency call** button is displayed on the lock screen.

1. Tap **Emergency call**.
2. Tap the emergency number for your location. The emergency numbers are default set to 911, *911, or #911.


3. Tap  to place the call.
4. Tap  to end the call.

Answering or Declining an Incoming Call

You can either answer or decline a call from the notification of the incoming call that displays on the screen.

To answer or decline a call

1. Press **DECLINE** to reject the call or press **ANSWER** to answer the call.
 - If you are already on a call, the first call is placed on hold during answering the new call.
 - To silence the ringer before answering the call, press the volume keys.



Checking Missed Calls

- If you miss a call,  is displayed in the Status bar.
- If you open the Notifications panel, you will see the number of missed calls. Tap the notification to be taken to the call log and view detailed information.

Using In-Call Options

When a call is in progress, the following options are available:

Dial Pad	Tap Dial Pad to enter additional numbers during your call.
Mute	You can unmute the microphone by tapping Mute icon again.
Audio	You can turn the speakerphone off by tapping the Speaker icon again. The speaker is turned off automatically when your current call ends.
Add call	Tap Add call to put the current phone call on hold and add another person to the phone call.
Bluetooth	When a Bluetooth device is paired and connected to your phone, you can conduct all calls using Bluetooth for hands-free conversation. When using Bluetooth headset during a call, the current call screen has a blue border and the Ongoing Call icon turns blue in the Status bar. Tap Bluetooth icon to toggle in-call audio to and from the Bluetooth accessory.

NOTE: To avoid damaging your hearing, do not hold the phone up to your ear when the speaker phone is ON.



Using the Recent Call Menu

The phone stores the numbers of all incoming and outgoing calls in the Call log. The recent call displays the details of the call including time, date, and duration.

Opening the Recents menu

1. From the Home screen, tap  >  **Recents**.
 - Calls are listed with the most recent at the top. Calls of the same phone number are grouped together. Scroll to view earlier entries in the log.

Note: You can tap and hold the desired number in the call log list to select options such as **Copy number, Edit number before call, Block number, Delete**.



Calling a number from the Recent calls


1. From the Home screen, tap  >  **Recents**.
2. If you want to call a number directly, tap  to the right of the entry. Or select a contact > tap  to place the call.
 - If you want to edit a number before calling, tap and hold the desired entry, and then tap **Edit number before call**.

Adding a phone number from your Recent calls to your Contacts list

1. From the Home screen, tap  >  **Recents**.
2. Tap the desired entry > **Add to contacts**.
3. In the list of contacts that opens, tap **Create new contact** or add to an existing contact.
4. Tap **Done**.

Sending a text message from Recent calls

1. From the Home screen, tap  >  **Recents**.
2. Tap the contact > **Send text message**.
3. Enter your message and tap the letter that appears right beside the space to add text to  **Send**.



Clearing the Call log

1. From the Home screen, tap  >  **Recents**.
2. Tap  **Option** > **Call History** > Tap  **Option** > **Clear call history** > **OK**.
 - To remove just one entry from the Recents menu, touch and hold the entry. In the pop-up options, tap **Delete** > **OK**.

Listening to Your Voicemail

Voicemail application is displayed only when phone calls are available. When you have a new voicemail message,  appears in the Status bar.

Calling your voicemail from the Dial Pad

- From the Home screen, tap .
- Tap your phone number and .

Calling your voicemail from the Notification panel

- Open the Notifications panel and tap **“New voicemail”**.

Using Voice Dialer

You can use the Voice Search application or Voice Dialer application to place a phone call by speaking the name of a contact or a phone number.

1. From the Home screen, tap **Phone** > Search contacts.
 - If you have a Bluetooth headset that supports “voicerecognition” or “voice-dialing,” you may be able to open Voice Search by pressing and holding your headset’s main button and dial by voice using your headset. For details, see your headset manual.

- Say the name of the contact you want to call or follow one of the suggestions for dialing a number or controlling your phone in other ways.


Messaging

You can send and view messages by conversation.

To access message

- From the Home screen, tap  to open the message screen.

Sending a Message

- Launch the message app and tap .
- Add recipinets in the **To** field.
- Type your message in the text message field.
 - To record and send a voice message, tap and hold , say your message, and then release your finger. The recording icon appears only while the message input field is empty.
 - To include an attachment in the message, tap .
- Tap  to send the message.

Replies / Forwarding a Message

- Launch the message app and select the the message that you want to reply or forward.
- Edit the message, if required.
- Tap  to send the message.

Deleting a Message/Thread

1. On the message screen, **touch and hold** the message or the message thread that you want to delete.
2. Tap  to delete the message.
3. Confirm the prompt to delete the selected message/thread.

Message Settings

1. On the message screen, tap  and tap **Settings**.
2. You can block unwanted messages, change notification settings, and much more.

Email

Use the Email app to view and manage your email accounts. You can add multiple email accounts to your Orbic device.

To access the email account

- Tap **Home**  key > swipe up for apps > **Settings**  > **Passwords & accounts**.

Adding an Account

To add an account,

1. Launch **Settings > Passwords & accounts**.
2. Tap the type of account you wish to add.
3. Enter the email address and password.
4. Follow the prompts to set up your email account.

Removing an Account

To remove an account,

1. Tap **Accounts** and select the account that you want to remove.
2. Tap **Remove Account**.
3. Confirm the prompt to remove the account or **Cancel** to retain the account.

Composing an Email

To compose a new email,

1. From the **Home screen** > tap **Google** > **Gmail** .
2. Tap  to compose a new email.
3. Tap the **To** field to add an email address manually or tap to

select a recipient from Contacts.

- If entering the recipients manually, enter additional recipients by separating each with a semicolon (;).

4. Enter the subject for the email and compose the message.
 - Tap to insert an attachment (Files, Images, Audio, and much more), if required.
5. Review your message and tap  to send the composed email.

Responding to an Email

To respond to an email,

1. From the Home screen > tap **Google** > sign into **Gmail** with the **email address** and **password**.
2. Select the email from your inbox to read.
 - Tap  to reply to the sender.
 - Tap  > Forward to forward the email to another person.
 - Tap > tap Forward to forward the email to another person.
3. Compose your message and tap to send.

Switching Between Google Accounts

If you have set up two or more Google Accounts on your phone, you can switch between them in **Gmail**. Gmail displays only one Google Account at a time. The current account is shown at the top right of any message list.

1. From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your **Apps**  > then find and tap on **Gmail** .
2. From any message list, tap  **Option** > **Accounts**.
3. Tap the account that you want to view. You can also tap the account name at the top of the screen to see a list of your accounts.
4. **Labeling email messages** You can organize your emails by label. Gmail has preset labels, or you can create your own labels in Gmail when viewed on a computer. (Note: Custom label colors created on the web are not supported on your phone).

Labeling an Email

1. From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your **Apps**  > then find and tap on **Gmail** .
2. When reading a **message**, tap  > **Change labels**.
3. Select a label > tap **OK**.

Viewing emails by label

1. From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your **Apps**  > then find and tap on **Gmail** .
2. From any message list, tap  > Go to labels.
3. Tap a label to view matching email messages.

Starring/un-starring an email message

You can star an important email to make it easy to find again. Starred emails are assigned the Starred labels.

1. From the Home screen, tap **Apps**  > **Gmail** .
2. From any message list, Tap to star a message, tap to un-star a message.

Email Settings

These settings allow you to customize your email settings.

NOTE: You can use these settings for all your email accounts.

1. From the Home screen > tap Google > Gmail.
2. Tap **Settings** > **General Settings**.
3. Customize the settings based on your preferences.

NOTE: Certain apps require you to sign into your Google account.

Maps

Use Maps to find your current location and get directions. You can search for addresses, landmarks and businesses directly on a street map or satellite image.

Note: You need an active mobile data or Wi-Fi connection to use Maps. To see your location and get directions, you must turn on location services. From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your  **Apps** > then find and tap on  **Settings** >  **Location**. Switch on **Use Location**. Maps may not be available for all locations.

Opening and viewing Maps

Viewing your location

1. From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your  **Apps** > then find and tap on  **Maps**.
2. Shows your location on the map and points north for your reference.

Using Maps

1. From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your  **Apps** > then find and tap on  **Maps**.
2. While viewing a map, swipe to any direction on the screen.

Viewing Location Details

1. From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your  **Apps** > then find and tap on  **Maps**.
2. While viewing a map, tap and hold a location, starred place, or a search result on the map.
 - A balloon opens over the location, with summary information.

3. Tap the balloon to see the address or more information.

Viewing a location in Street view

Street view mode provides a street-level view of the location. Street view may not be available for all areas.

1. From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your  **Apps** > then find and tap on  **Maps**.
2. While viewing information for a location, tap.
3. Select **Street View** 

- To view surrounding areas, swipe the screen in any direction.

Searching for a location

You can search Google Maps for specific locations, company names, or business types.

1. From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your  **Apps** > then find and tap on  **Maps**.
2. Tap **Search here** .
3. Enter the search criteria. As you type, suggested matches from your contacts, the web, and previously searched items are displayed.
 - Tap  to search.
 - Tap a suggested search term.
4. The search results are displayed as  markers with letter labels on the map.
 - Tap markers and titles to view more information.

Viewing map layers

Initially, Google Maps opens with a street map. You can view additional map layers, such as satellite images and traffic information. You can also view custom Web created Google Maps.

1. From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your **Apps** > then find and tap on  **Maps**.
2. Tap  **Map Type**. A dialog opens with a list of layers.
3. Turn layers on or off by tapping the layer name. A highlighted mark surrounding the **Map type** indicates the layer is selected.
 - Tap  **Map Type** and tap on the Map type you want to deselect.

Getting directions

1. From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your **Apps** > then find and tap on  **Maps**.
2. Tap  **Directions**.
3. Use your current location as the starting point, or enter a location in the **Start point** field.
4. Enter your destination in the **End point** field.
5. Tap your desired method of transportation > tap **Get directions**.

Camera

Use the Camera app to take pictures and record videos.

To access camera

- From the Home screen > Tap .

Capturing a Photo

To capture a photo,

- Tap  to access the **camera**.
- Aim the camera at the subject using the device's main display screen as a viewfinder.
- Pinch the screen to zoom in or pinch open to zoom out.
- Before taking a picture, you can tap on the screen icons to access various camera options and settings.
- Tap  to click a photo. You can also use the volume keys to click a picture.

WARNING! Use the flash from a safe distance. Keep the flash away from people and animals' eyes.

Recording a Video

To record a video,

- From the Home screen tap .
- Tap **Video** on the screen to switch to the video mode.
- Aim the camera at the subject using the device's main display screen as a viewfinder.
- Pinch the screen to zoom in or pinch open to zoom out.
- Tap  to start recording the video.

Camera Settings

Before capturing a picture or video, you can adjust the camera settings to suit your preferences.

1. From the **Home** screen > tap  > **Settings** on the top right corner of the screen.
2. Customize the settings based on your preferences.

Calendar

Use the calendar app to manage your tasks and events.

To access Calendar

- Tap the **Home** key  > swipe up for apps > **Calendar** .

Creating an Event

To create a new event,

1. Launch Calendar > tap  **Add Calendar** > **New event**.
2. Enter the name, time, location, description, and optional details for your event.
3. Tap **Save**.

Editing/Deleting an Event

To edit or delete an event,

1. In the event details view, select the event >  **Edit event**.
2. Make necessary changes to the event > tap **Done**.

Sharing an Event

To share an event,

1. Launch Calendar and select the event you want to share.
2. Tap **Forward** to share the selected event.

Clock

Use the Clock app to set alarms, check the current time in many cities worldwide, time an event, or select a specific duration.

To access the clock

- Tap the **Home** key  > swipe up for apps > **Clock** .

Set the Clock

To set the clock,

1. Launch Clock > tap  for alarm.
2. Tap  to create a new alarm.
3. You can choose from the following options -
 - Tap  view the current time.
 - Tap  to set the stopwatch.
 - Tap  to set the bedtime.

Google Photos

Use the Google Photos app to view, edit, and manage photos and videos.

To access Google Photos

- From the **Home** screen > tap **Google Photos** 

Sharing Albums, Photos, or Videos

To share albums, photos, or videos

- Tap an album, photo, or video to view it.
- Tap  to send to others or share them via social network services.

Deleting Albums, Photos, or Videos

To delete albums, photos, or videos,

- Tap and hold an album, picture, or video to select it.
- Select the items you want to delete.
- Tap  > **Remove to Trash**.

Editing Photos

To edit photos,

- Tap the photo to view it on full screen.
- Tap  to view the editing options.
- Select from the list of the available options to edit the selected photo.

Music

Use the YT Music app to view and play music files on your device.

To access Play Music

- From the **Home** key  > swipe for apps > tap **YT Music** .

Viewing your Music Library

To view your music library,

- Tap the **Home** key  > swipe up for apps > **YT Music** .
- Tap  > **Audio**.
 - If you are a subscribed user of Google Play Music, tap **Home** key  > swipe up for apps > **YT Music**  >  > **Music library**.

Copying Music Files to the Device

To copy music files to the device,

- Connect the device to your computer via a USB cable.
- Tap **Media Device (PTP)** as your connection type if prompted.
- Transfer music files from your computer to your device's microSD card.

NOTE: Additionally, Google Play Music provides music files for downloading (subscription required).

Getting Connected

The instructions below describe how to connect your device through Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and USB cable.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi refers to certain types of Wireless Local Area Networks (WLAN), and Communication via Wi-Fi requires an access point.

To access Wi-Fi,

- Touch the **Home key**  > swipe up for **apps** > **Settings**  > **Network & Internet** > **Wi-Fi**.

Turn Wi-Fi ON

Turning on Wi-Fi will make your device discover and connect to wireless APs within range.

To turn ON the Wi-Fi,

1. Launch Wi-Fi.
2. Tap  to turn Wi-Fi ON or OFF.
3. Once the Wi-Fi is ON, you will see a list of available Wi-Fi networks.
4. Tap a network to connect. The network you choose will ask for a password if it is secure.
5. Tap **Connect**.

Adding a Wi-Fi Network

You can manually add a Wi-Fi network if it does not appear in the list of available networks.

To add a Wi-Fi network,

1. Launch Wi-Fi and make sure the Wi-Fi is turned ON.

2. Tap **Add Network**.
3. Enter the network SSID and other required network information.
4. Tap **Save**.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth, or short-range communications, allows you to wirelessly connect your device to several Bluetooth devices that are compatible with your devices, such as headsets, computers, printers, and wireless devices that are Bluetooth-enabled.

NOTE: The Bluetooth communication range is approximately 30 feet.

Turn Bluetooth ON/OFF

1. Touch the **Home key**  > swipe up for **apps** > **Settings**  > **Connected devices** > **Connection preferences** > **Bluetooth**.
2. Tap  to turn the Bluetooth ON or OFF.
 - Once the Bluetooth is ON, the  will appear in the status bar, scan for nearby Bluetooth devices, and display them.
 - To manually perform a scan, tap **Scan**.

Pair Bluetooth Devices

Bluetooth pairing allows you to establish trusted connections between your device and another Bluetooth device.

1. Touch the **Home key**  > swipe up for **apps** > **Settings**  > **Connected devices** > **Connection preferences** > **Bluetooth**.
2. Tap  to turn the Bluetooth ON or OFF. Your device will scan and display the names of all available Bluetooth devices in the area.

3. Tap the name of the device you want to pair with.

NOTE: The Bluetooth passkey, if required, may be fixed for some devices. Try 0000 or 1234, or refer to the instructions with the device.

Forgetting a Bluetooth Device

1. Touch the **Home** key  > swipe up for **apps** > **Settings**  > **Connected devices Bluetooth**.
2. Tap the **Setting** icon next to the paired device and tap **FORGET**.

USB Cable

Your device is bundled with a USB cable that is used to connect your device to a computer and share files such as music, photos, and other data.

1. Connect your device and computer via a USB cable.
2. Tap **Home** key  > swipe up for **apps** > **Settings**  > **Connected devices** > **USB**.
3. Select one of the following options:
 - Transfer files
 - USB Tethering
 - MIDI
 - PTP
 - No data transfer

Chrome

Search for information or browse web pages using the Chrome web browser. You must have an active data or Wi-Fi connection to access the internet.

Opening Chrome

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your  **Apps** > then find and tap on  **Chrome**.
 - When you open the Browser, the default homepage is displayed. If you have used the browser recently, your most recently viewed webpage is displayed.
 - The browser also opens when you select a web link in other applications like email or text messaging.

Accessing or Searching the Webpage

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your  **Apps** > then find and tap on  **Chrome**.
2. Tap the URL field on the top of the screen.
3. Enter the URL of a webpage or search term and tap .
- As you type, suggestions of web pages and keywords will appear on the screen. Tap a request directly to that web page or view search results.

Using Browser Options

1. Stopping page loading
 - While webpage is loading, tap  **Option** >  **Stop** or tap on the left of the URL field.
2. Reload the current page

- Tap  **Option** >  **Reload**.

3. Finding the text on the current page
 - While viewing any web pages, tap  **Option** >  **Find in page**.
 - Enter the search term.
4. Sharing a webpage
 - While viewing any web pages, tap  **Option** > **Share page**.
 - Tap an application to send the URL. The application opens with the URL you've entered.

Downloading Files

You can download images, files, and applications from web pages. All downloaded files are saved to the local storage or the microSD card.

1. Tap and hold an image, a link, or a file you want to download.
2. Tap the desired action (**Save image**, **View image**, or **Set as wallpaper**).
 - Navigating between web pages.
 - Press **Back** to return to the previous web pages. Or tap  **Option** >  **Forward** if you pressed **Back** by accident.
 - Switching between Browser windows.
 - From any web page, tap  **Option** > **Bookmarks** > tap **HISTORY**.

NOTE: You can open as many windows as you want at any given time.

Using Bookmarks

Browser bookmarks are stored shortcuts that allow you to access web pages without typing in their full address quickly.

1. Bookmarking a webpage

- While viewing web pages, tap  **Option** > tap  **Save to bookmarks**.
- Edit the name or location if needed > tap **OK**.

2. Opening a bookmark

- When viewing any webpages, tap  **Option** > **Bookmarks**.
- Tap a bookmark to open it.
- If you prefer to open the web pages in a new window, tap and hold the bookmark and tap **Open in new tab**.

3. Editing a bookmark

- From any web page, tap  **Option** > **Bookmarks**.
- Tap on the bookmark that you want to edit.
- Tap  **Option** and then **Edit**.
- Edit the name and/or location, tap  when done.

4. Deleting a bookmark

- From any web page, tap  **Option** > **Bookmarks**.
- Tap  on the right of the bookmark to delete > **Delete**.

Settings

The instructions below guide you through configuring your device's connections, settings, and features.

To access settings,

- Tap the **Home** key  > swipe up for **apps** > **Settings** .

Network & internet

Setup and manage connections to a variety of networks and devices.

Wi-Fi

You can connect your device to a Wi-Fi network to access the Internet without using your mobile data.

To enable Wi-Fi,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Network & internet** > **Wi-Fi**.
2. Tap  to turn ON Wi-Fi and scan for available networks.

Mobile network

You can configure your device's ability to connect to mobile networks and use mobile data.

To enable mobile network,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Network & internet** > **Mobile network**.
 - **Mobile data** - Activate the mobile network.
 - **Roaming** - Choose whether to allow your device to connect to mobile data while traveling outside the network.
 - **App data usage** - Check your current mobile and Wi-Fi data usage.

- **Data warning & limit** - You can customize data warnings and limitations from the mobile network.
- **Preferred network type** - Choose the desired network.
- **Wi-Fi calling** - Activate the call over the mobile network.
- **Access Point Names** - Choose or add APNs, which have the network settings your device needs to connect to.

Airplane mode

The Airplane mode turns off Wi-Fi and Bluetooth and disconnects your device from all networks.

When you are in Airplane mode, you can use other features such as playing music, watching videos, and using offline applications.

To enable Airplane mode,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Network & internet** > **Airplane mode**.
2. Tap  to turn the Airplane mode ON/OFF.

Hotspot & tethering

A mobile hotspot uses your data plan to create a Wi-Fi network that multiple devices can use. You can use tethering to share your device's Internet connection with another device.

To enable the hotspot & tethering option,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Network & internet** > **Hotspot & tethering**.
2. You can choose any of the following based on the required settings.
 - Wi-Fi Hotspot
 - USB tethering

- Bluetooth tethering

Data Saver

Use a Data saver to reduce your data consumption by preventing selected apps from sending or receiving data in the background.

To activate data saver,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Network & internet** > **Data Saver**.
2. Tap  **Use Data Saver** to turn ON the data saver.
 - To allow some apps to have unrestricted data usage, select **Unrestricted data** and tap  next to each app to specify restrictions.

Connected devices

You can view the list of devices connected through USB and Bluetooth.

Pair New Device

You can pair your device to other Bluetooth-enabled devices. Once a pairing is created, the devices can remember each other and exchange information without entering the passkey again.

To pair a new Bluetooth device,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Connected devices**.
2. Tap  **Pair new device**. Make sure the device's bluetooth is turned ON.
3. Tap a device listed under **Available devices** and follow the prompts to connect.

Apps

You can manage the device's apps and change their settings. You can view the app's usage information, change its notification or

permission settings, or uninstall or disable unnecessary apps.

- Tap **All apps** to view the list of applications installed on your phone.
- Tap **Default apps** to select one app among multiple apps of the same type as default.
- Tap **Screen time** to set timers for your apps.

Notifications

You can prioritize and streamline app alerts by changing which apps send notifications.

App Settings

You can configure notifications for every apps.

To enable app notifications,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Notifications** > **App settings** under **Manage**.
2. Tap  beside each application to receive notifications.
3. To view recent and snoozed notifications, tap **Notification history**.

Notification history

You can view recent and snooze notifications of all the apps listed.

To view notifications,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Notifications** > **Notification history** under **Manage**.
2. Tap  beside each application to view recent notifications.

Conversations

The conversations of the notifications set to "Priority" can be seen.

To view the priority conversations,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Notifications** > **Conversations** under **Conversation**.

Bubbles

You can configure the chat bubbles notification for apps.

To enable chat bubbles,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Notifications** > **Bubbles** under **Conversation**.
2. Tap  **Allow apps to show bubbles** to view conversations as floating icons on top of other apps.

Device & app notifications

You can view and set device and app notifications.

To set the notifications,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Notifications** > **Device & app notifications** under **Privacy**.
2. Tap the required apps listed and tap  **Allow notification access** to set the **Real-time**, **Conversations**, **Notifications**, or **Silent** options for the selected app.

Notifications on the lock screen

You can choose to view notifications on the screen.

To set the notification option,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Notifications** > **Notifications on lock screen** under **Privacy**.
2. Choose from the following options -

- Show conversations, default, and silent.
- Hide silent conversations and notifications.
- Don't show any notifications.

Do Not Disturb

You can Block sounds and notifications while this mode is turned ON. You can also specify exceptions for People, Apps, and Alarms.

To activate this mode,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Notifications** > **Do Not Disturb** under **General**.
2. Tap **TURN ON NOW**.
3. Tap Wireless emergency alerts to set the threat alerts.
4. Tap  **Hide silent notification** in the status bar to hide the notification alerts displayed in the status bar.
5. Tap  **Allow notification snoozing** to snooze the notification alerts.
6. Tap  **Notification dot on app icon** to view the dot alert on the app icon when there is a notification.
7. Tap  **Enhanced notifications** to get app's suggested actions, replies, and more.

Battery

You can view how the Battery power is used for Device activities.

To view the battery usage details,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Battery**.
 - **Battery usage** - Displays the usage details.
 - **Battery Saver** - Activate to conserve battery power.
 - **Battery Manager** - Detects when apps drain the

battery.

- **Battery percentage** - Displays the battery charge percentage on the status bar.

Storage

You can check the status of the used and available memory details.

To check the status,

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Storage**.
2. Tap  **Storage manager** to allow the storage to be managed by the store manager.
3. Tap **Free up space** to manage and free up space by deleting the unused apps.

Sound

You can configure the sounds and vibrations that are used to indicate notifications, screen taps, and other activities.

Adjust the volume

You can set the system volume level and default volume for notifications and other media.

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Sound**.
2. Drag the sliders to set the volume for -
 - Media
 - Call
 - Ring and notification
 - Alarm

Set Vibration

You can control how and when your device vibrates.

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Sound** > **Vibrate for calls**.
2. Choose the Options to customize -
 - Never vibrate
 - Always vibrate
 - Vibrate first then ring gradually

Set Silent Mode

To turn silent mode off, press the volume key on the side of your device and then tap the silent mode until the bell icon is displayed.

Display

You can configure your display's brightness and screen timeout delay.

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Display**.
 - **Brightness level** - Drag the brightness slider to adjust the brightness.
 - **Adaptive brightness** - Tap  to enable this option.
 - **Lock screen** - Display sensitive content only when the device is unlocked.
 - **Screen timeout** - Choose how long the display screen remains lit after you tap the screen or press any key.
 - **Dark theme** - This allows you to switch to a darker theme to keep your eyes more comfortable at night.
 - **Font size** - This allows you to change the size of the font.
 - **Auto-rotate screen** - This allows you to rotate the screen based on the orientation.
 - **Screen saver** - Controls what the screen displays when the screen turns off or while charging.

Wallpaper

You can change the look of your Home and Lock screens with wallpaper. You can display your favorite picture or choose a preloaded wallpaper.

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Wallpaper**.
2. Choose wallpaper from Live Wallpapers or Photos

Accessibility

There are accessibility settings for people who need help seeing, hearing, or operating their devices. Accessibility services are special features that make using the device more accessible.

Screen reader

You can use unique controls and settings that let you navigate without the need to view the screen.

1. Tap **Settings**  > **Accessibility**.
2. Tap **Select to Speak** to read the text or characters aloud.
3. Tap **TalkBack** to speak feedback aloud. This helps blind and low-vision users.

Display

1. Tap **Text and display** to convert speech to text.
 - Font size - Configure screen fonts.
 - Display size - Magnify the content shown on the screen.
 - Bold text - Display the content in bold.
 - Color correction - Adjust the screen color if you have color-blindness or difficulty in reading the screen display.

- Color inversion - Revere the display of colors.
- Remove animations - Remove specific screen effects if you are sensitive to motion.
- Large mouse pointer - Use large pointer for a connected mouse.
- High contrast text - Adjust the color and outline of the text to increase the contrast with the background.

Security

Using a screen lock, you can secure your device and protect your data. With this option enabled, you can use your finger to draw a pattern or enter a PIN to unlock your device's screen.

To access security,

- Tap the **Home** key  > swipe up for **apps** > **Settings**  > **Security**.

Google Play protect

Google Play protects and monitors your apps and devices for harmful behavior. It also warns you from potentially dangerous apps.

To run the scan,

1. Tap **Security** > **Security status** > **Google Play protect**.
2. Tap **scan** to check the apps.

Find My Device

Find my device helps you locate this device remotely. It also lets you to keep your data secure if you lose this device.

To use Find My Device,

1. Tap **Security** > **Security status** > **Find My Device**.

2. Tap  **Use Find My Device** to activate.

NOTE: To use this option, you will need to sign in with Google.

Screen lock

To set a screen lock,

1. Tap **Security > Screen lock** under **Device security** to select a screen lock and level of security.
 - **None:** Never use a screen lock.
 - **Swipe:** Swipe the screen to unlock.
 - **Pattern:** Create a pattern you draw on the screen to unlock your device.
 - **PIN:** Select a PIN to use for unlocking the screen.
 - **Password:** Create a password for unlocking the screen.

NOTE: If you forget your pattern, PIN, or password, you will have to reset your device to factory settings, which will remove all data from your device.

Fingerprint

Use fingerprint recognition as an alternative to unlock the device or enter certain apps.

You can register up to 3 fingerprints. A pattern, password, or PIN will also be set as an alternative to your fingerprint.

To register a fingerprint,

1. Tap **Security > Fingerprint** under **Device security**.
2. Choose the required backup screen method.
 - Fingerprint + Pattern
 - Fingerprint + PIN

- Fingerprint + Password

Smart Lock

Smart Lock keeps your device unlocked when connected to a trusted device or in a familiar location.

Security update

You can quickly check the date of the last installed security software update and find out if newer updates are available.

App Pinning

You can use app pinning to keep one app in view, preventing users from switching to other apps and accessing your personal information.

To pin an app,

1. Tap **Security > App pinning.**
2. Tap the ON/OFF Switch.

Privacy

You can use these options to configure advanced security settings to protect your device better.

To access privacy,

- Tap the **Home** key  > swipe up for **apps > Settings  > Privacy.**

Permission Manager

Apps might access features of your device that you permit them to when running in the background, not just when you are using the app.

1. Tap **Privacy > Permission Manager.**

2. Tap a category > tap an app to select which permissions you want to be notified about.

Show passwords

You can have characters displayed briefly in password fields as you type them.

1. Tap **Privacy** and tap  **Show passwords** to turn on the feature.

Location

Location services use a combination of GPS, mobile network, and Wi-Fi to determine the location of your device.

To access the location,

1. Tap the **Home** key  > swipe up for **apps** > **Settings**  > **Location**.
2. Tap  **Use location** to turn on the spot.

App location permissions

You can configure permissions for apps that want to access your location information.

1. Tap **Location** > **App location permissions**.
2. Tap an app and choose which location permissions to grant it.

Location services

Location services store and use your device's most recent location data. Certain apps can use this data to improve your search results based on your visited places.

1. Tap **Location** > **Location services**.
2. Tap an entry under Location services to see how your loca-

tion information is used.

Safety & emergency

You can set up emergency SOS information.

To access Safety & emergency,

1. Tap the **Home** key  > swipe up for **apps** > **Settings**  > **Safety & emergency**.
2. Tap **Emergency information** to enter your medical information and the phone number to contact during any emergency.
3. Tap **Emergency SOS** to set up the SOS feature.
 - Tap  Use Emergency SOS to enable the feature. Once the SOS feature is enabled, tapping the **Power** button five times in a row will call the emergency services or your chosen contact.
 - Tap  **Play countdown alarm**, If you wish your phone to play an alarm when your Emergency SOS is activated.
 - By default, your device will select your local emergency number. You can change this to one of your contacts. Tap **Call for help** under **Notify for help** to set up emergency calls.
 - Tap **Save**.
4. Tap **Emergency Location Service** to send your service during an emergency.
5. Tap **Wireless emergency alerts** to set the threat alerts.

Passwords & accounts

You can connect to and manage your accounts, including your Google, email, and social networking accounts.

To access passwords & accounts,

1. Tap the **Home** key  > swipe up for **apps** > **Settings**  > **Passwords & accounts**.

Add an Account

You can add and sync your email, picture, and video sharing accounts.

To add an account,

1. Tap **Passwords & accounts** >  **Add account**.
2. Tap one of the account types.
3. Follow the prompts to enter your credentials and set up the account.
4. Tap  **Automatically sync app data** to enable automatic updates to your accounts.

Digital Wellbeing & Parental Controls

Monitor and manage your digital habits by getting a daily view of how often you use apps, how many notifications you receive, and how often you check your device. You can also set your device so that it helps you relax before you sleep.

Check on your kids

- **Parental Controls** - You can monitor your children's digital life with Google's Family Link app. The app that can be downloaded from the Play Store lets you set

content filters, watch screen time, and set screen time limits.

Google

You can configure your device's Google settings.

To access goolge seetings,

Troubleshooting
