1.1 Accessories

1.2 Battery Charge

The device is equipped with built-in lithium battery. You must charge the battery before using the device for the first time.



You must use a charger specifically designed for the device to charge the battery. Unapproved chargers may cause batteries to explode or damage your device.

- Users can not replace the original equipped battery with an unapproved one. Please contact your service provider for battery replacement information.
- Only use the charger to charge the battery.



- When the battery is low, the device will emit a warning tone and display a low battery message. The battery icon will appear blank. If the battery is close to exhausted, the device will automatically shut down. Users are required to charge the battery for continual use of the device.
- If the battery is completely discharged, the device cannot be turned on even if connected to the DC power adapter. Charge the depleted battery for a few minutes before turning it on.
- 1. Plug the charging cable into the charging socket.



Improper connection may cause serious damages to the equipment or power adapter. For any damage caused by misuse will cause warranty to be invalid.

2. Plug the power adapter into a standard power outlet.



You can use the device while charging it, but this will extend the time to fully charge the battery.

When the device is being charged, the touch screen may fail due to unstable power. If this happens, unplug the power adapter from the electrical outlet, or disconnect the charging cable from the device.

The device will become hot during charging. This is normal and will not affect the life or performance of the device.

3. When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon no longer changes), disconnect the power adapter and charging cable, and then disconnect the power adapter from the power outlet.

It takes about 7 hours to fully charge the equipment. The capacity of battery is 4500 m/Ah.



Please unplug the power adapter to save energy when it is not in use. When using, the power adapter should be pushed tightly to the outlet.

1.2.1 Reduce Battery Consumption

If automatic synchronization or WLAN function are running in the background, the battery will be consumed faster. Turn off unnecessary applications to save battery power. You can also reduce the backlight time and the brightness of the display, or press [①] to switch to sleep mode when not using the device.

1.2.2 SIM Card



For more comprehensive protection of SIM card, you should always turn off the power or detach the battery before inserting or removing SIM card.

Insert & remove the SIM card.

- 1. Turn off the power;
- 2. Remove the battery,
- 3. Follow the direction sign, insert or remove the SIM card.

1.2.3 Memory Card

- 1. Securely unload (eject) the memory card or;
- 2. Turn off the power and remove the battery,

3. Follow the direction sign, insert or remove the TF card.



Please remove the memory card after safely unload it or after power-off, otherwise it may cause system problems. Put insert the memory card into the card slot with contact points area facing down. You will hear a click once it locks.

2 Getting Started

2.1 Turn it On/ Off

For turning on , pressing[①]power button for 5 seconds.

For turning off , pressing $[\color{D}]$ power button for 5 seconds , and then choose **Power Off** \rightarrow **Confirm**.

2.3 Touch screen

Using the device's touch screen could let you can easily select items or perform functions. Learn the basic operations of the touch screen.



- To avoid scratching the touch screen, do not use sharp tools.
- Prevent the touch screen from contact with other electronic devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen malfunction.
- Protect the touch screen against splashing water. The touch screen may malfunction in high humidity.



- Touch screen has a detect layer to detect weak electric charge emitted by the body. Kindly use a fingertip to tap the touch screen for best performance.
- Perform the following actions to control the touch screen:
- Click: Tap once to select or launch a menu, option, or application.
- Tap and hold: Tap on an item for 2 seconds or more.
- Dragging: Tap on an item and move to the desired location without lifting the finger.
- Double-click: Tap on an item twice quickly.
- Slide: Scroll up, down, left, or right to browse the list or screen.




If you do not use the device for a specified period of time, the device will turn off the touch screen. To turn on the screen, press $[\mathbb{O}]$.

You can also adjust the backlight time to sleep. From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings \rightarrow Display \rightarrow Sleep.

2.3.1 Rotating Touch Screen

There is a built-in motion sensor in the equipment to detect its orientation. If you rotate the device, it will automatically rotate display on the touch screen according to the device orientation.



- To set the screen orientation remains unchanged, click Settings→Display→Auto-rotate screen.
- Or, turn off auto-rotate screen through quick set up by sliding down the Status Bar on top of the screen—Auto-rotate screen


2.3.2 Lock & Unlock the Touch Screen



- If the equipment is not used for a specified period of time, the device will automatically turn off and lock the touch screen to prevent accidental operation of the device. To manually lock the touch screen, press [①]
- To unlock, press [①], and then drag in any direction until it reaches the edge of the ring. If you set up a screen lock, you need to enter a password or draw a pattern to unlock it.

2.4 Understanding the home screen

After unlocking the home screen to enter the desktop, all your installed programs will be displayed on the desktop. You can click the icon to open the corresponding program; you can also press and drag the icon to change order. If you want to uninstall an application, drag the icon on to the trash icon at the top. When the device is in standby mode, you can see the home screen, in which you can view the device's status and access applications. Scroll left or right to switch home screen panels.



- 1: Status Bar
- 2: Open the Applications panel
- 3: Desktop controls and shortcuts

2.4.1 Adding items to the home screen

You can customize the home screen by adding applications or application items, widgets, or shortcuts of folders to it.

To add items to the home screen:



- 1. Tap and hold on the main screen, widgets options appears;
- 2. Select the item category;
- Application: On the home screen, add a shortcut to the application;
- Widgets: Widgets is an application that provides convenient functions and information on the main screen;
- 3. Select the item you want to add to the home screen, long press, move to desired position according to prompt.

2.4.2 Move items on the home screen

1 Press the item icon, until the main screen grid appears;

2Drag the item to the desired location.

2.4.3 Remove items from the Home screen

- 1 Press the item you want to remove; Recycle Bin "X deleted" icon appears on the main screen edge;
 - 2 Drag the item on to the "X deleted" icon;
 - 3 When the items and "X deleted" icon change colors, release the item.

2.4.4 Add shortcuts for applications

1From the application list, tap and hold an application icon; Shortcut icon for the application will be added to the main screen;

2Move the icon to the desired location or move it to another panel of the main screen.

2.5 Access Applications

- 1. From the main screen, click [iii] to display the **application** list, click to open the desired application;
- 2. To view the downloaded application, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Applications**.

2.6 Customize the Device

According to personal preferences, customizing the device can realize more functions.

2.6.1 Change the Display Language

- 1. From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings** \rightarrow **Language and input** \rightarrow **language**;
- 2. Select the desired language.

2.6.2 Set the current date and time

- 1. From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings** \rightarrow **Date and Time**;
- 2. Select your time zone, set the date and time, and change other options.

2.6.3 Turn on or off touch tone

• From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings** → **Profiles** → **Standard** → **touch tone**;

2.6.4 Adjust the volume on the device

- 1. Open the Settings \rightarrow Profiles \rightarrow Standard \rightarrow Volume;
- 2. Drag the slider to adjust the volume of the media and notification volume

2.6.5 Select the wallpaper of the Home screen.



- 1. Press on blank area of the Home screen, select the type of wallpaper you need from the pop-up menu
- 2. Wallpaper: wallpaper is the built-in system wallpaper.
 - Live Wallpaper: live wallpaper built in with the system or user installed

we will not be responsible for the preset image or wallpaper in devices.

2.6.6 Adjust the display brightness

- 1 From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings** \rightarrow **Display** \rightarrow **Brightness**;
 - 2 Drag the slider to adjust the brightness level;
 - 3 Select OK.

Display brightness level will affect the battery power consumption speed.

2.6.7 Set up screen lock

You can lock the touch screen to prevent unauthorized use of the device by using the unlock pattern or password.

• If you have set up the screen lock, you will be asked to enter the unlock code whenever you power on the device or unlock the touch screen.

- If you forget your password, the device needs to be sent back to us, we'll reset it for you.
- We are not responsible for the security code or private data loss or other damages caused by the use of illegal software.

Setting unlock password

- 1. From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings** \rightarrow **Security** \rightarrow **Screen** lock \rightarrow **Password**;
- 2. Enter a new password (alphanumeric) and select **Continue**;
- 3. Enter the new password again and select **OK**;

2.7 Input text

You can select a character on the virtual keyboard to enter text.

Some languages are no supported. When inputting text, you need to change the writing language to a supported language.

2.7.1 Use Google Input method

- 1. From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Language and input → default →Google Input method;
- 2. Use the virtual keyboard to enter text.


- 1: Change Case

- 4: Clear input
- 5: Complete

2.7.2 Copy and paste text

When entering text, you can use the copy and paste function to use text in other applications.

- 1. Tap and hold the word;
- 2. Drag or to select the desired text;
- 3. Select **Copy** to copy the text, or select **Cut** to cut the text, to the clipboard;
- 4. In another application, tap and hold the text input field;
 - 5. Select **Paste** to paste texts from the clipboard into the text input field.

2.8 Multi-task switching



The device supports running multiple tasks simultaneously. To switch in between multiple tasks, you only need to press "main screen key" in the unlocked status and select the program you want to switch to.

3 Camera and pictures viewing

3.1 Camera

Learn how to capture and view photos and videos. Launch the camera program to take high-quality photos. Fast focusing, continuous shooting, timing, effects, and more professional camera modes are supported. To shoot video, you need only to switch to shooting mode from the menu. 720P high-quality video recording is supported.



Depending on the scene or shooting conditions, the storage size may be different.

- 1. From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Camera** to turn on the camera;
- 2. Make any necessary adjustments;
- 3. Select to take pictures;

Photos are automatically saved;

After taking pictures, select the image viewer icon to view the photographs.

- To view more photos, scroll left or right. You can also click the bottom of the screen to view photo thumbnails.
- To zoom in or out, place two fingers on the screen, open wide or close up, and then release your fingers (Folding two fingers will zoom out), or double-click on the screen.
- To start a slide show of images, select **Menu** → **slideshow**. Tap the screen to stop the slideshow.
- To send a photo to others, select.
- To delete a photo, select.
- To view photo details, select **Menu** → **Details**.
- To rotate the picture counterclockwise, select the menu →Rotate Left.
- To rotate the photo clockwise, select Menu →Rotate right.
- To set the photo as wallpaper, select the **menu** \rightarrow **The picture settings.**
- To crop an image from a photo, select **Menu** \rightarrow **crop**.

• For simple photo processing, select $Menu \rightarrow Edit$.

3.2 Gallery

Learn how to view and play photos and videos stored in the device memory. Gallery allows to view pictures by path folder. You can double-click or toggle two fingers to zoom a single picture. You can slide left or right to switch to the previous or next image. Tapping the image can display or hide the control menu.

3.2.1 Supported file formats

3.2.2 View photos



- 1 From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Gallery**;
- 2 Select the folder;
- 3 Select the photos you want to view;

When viewing a photo, use the following options:

- Scroll left or right to view more photos. You can also click the bottom of the screen to view photo thumbnails.
- To zoom in or out, place two fingers on the screen, , place two fingers on the screen, open wide or close up, and then release your fingers (Folding two fingers to zoom out), or double-click on the screen.
- To start a slide show of images, select **Menu** → **slideshow**. Tap the screen to stop the slideshow.
- To send a photo to others, select
- To delete a photo, select 🗓 .
- To view photo details, select **Menu** → **Details.**
- To rotate the picture counterclockwise, select the Menu →Rotate Left.
- To rotate the photo clockwise, select
 Menu →Rotate right.
- To set the photo as wallpaper, select the
 Menu → The picture settings.
- To crop an image from a photo, select
 Menu → crop.
- For simple photo processing, select
 Menu → Edit.


4 Connections

Before connecting the computer, make sure Settings \rightarrow Developer Options \rightarrow USB debugging has been turned off.


4.1 Connection with computer

- 1. Connect the equipment and computer with the data cable;
- 2. Pull down the status bar at the top of the screen \rightarrow USB is connected \rightarrow Turn on USB storage devices;



4.2 3G Connection

Learn how to use the device's 3G wireless network capabilities. You can access the Internet via the 3G.



- 1. From the Home screen, open the application list and select Setting → Wireless and Networks → Other → Mobile networks.
- 2. Select **mobile networks settings** from the Menu if necessary.
- 3. Once set up, you can access the Internet via the 3G.

4.3 VPN Connection

You can create a virtual private network (VPN) connect to your private network through a public network such as the Internet.



Device has been configured with an Internet connection. If you fails to access internet, you need to edit the connection. If you are not sure of the connection information to enter, please consult your service provider.

4.3.1 Setting up a VPN connection

- 1. From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings** \rightarrow **Wireless &** Networks \rightarrow More \rightarrow VPN \rightarrow Add VPN.
- 2. Select a VPN type

- 3. Customize the connection information Available selection depends on the VPN type.
- 4. Select Save when finished.

5. NFC and fingerprint sensor modules

5.1 Antenna sensing zone of NFC module is on the back of the device. When you open the Hisign application and put the NFC tags on the NFC antenna sensing zone when prompted, its information will be read in to the device.

NFC module will normally work in a condition of opening UART1. Select **settings-developer options-select UART1.**

5.2 fingerprint sensor module

Fingerprint collection module is in the top front of the device. When you open the Hisign application and and press your finger on it when prompted, the fingerprint image will be collected.

6 Tools

6.1 Calculator

Learn how to perform mathematical calculations on the device.

- 1. Open the application list and select the **calculator** from the Home screen.
- 2. Use the keys that correspond to the displayed calculator to perform basic or scientific computing.

6.2 File Browser

Learn how to quickly and easily access all images, video, music, sound clips, and other types of files stored on the device.

6.2.1 File Formats Supported

6.2.2 Open the files

- 1. Open the application list and select **File Management** from the Home screen.
- 2. Select the folder.
- To move up a level in the file directory, select .
- 3. Select a file to open.

6.2.3 Copy or move files

- 1. Open the application list and select **File Management** from the Home screen.
- 2. Press the folder or file to copy or move until the pop-up edit menu.
- 3. Select **Copy** or **Cut**.
- 4. Locate the destination folder and choose Edit \rightarrow Paste.

6.2.4 Delete Files

- 1. Open the application list and select **File Management** from the Home screen.
- 2. Press the folder or file to delete until the pop-up edit menu.
- 3. Select **Delete** \rightarrow **Yes**.

7 Settings

Access Settings

- 1. Open the application list and select **Settings** from the Home screen.
- 2. Select Settings category, then select Options.

7.1 Sound

Change different sound settings.

- Volume: Adjust the volume of media, alarm, and notification.
- **Ringtone:** Select a ringtone to alert events.
- **Touch Sounds:** Set the device to sound when you select an application or an option on the touch screen.
- **Screen Lock Sound**: Set the device to sound when you lock or unlock the touch screen.

7.2 Display

Change the display settings.

- **Brightness:** Set the brightness of the display.
- Wallpaper: Set wallpaper.
- **Auto-rotate screen:** Set whether to automatically rotate display contents when you rotate the device.
- Sleep: Set the length of idle time before closing the display backlight.
- Font Size: Set the system font size.

7.3 Storage

Check the usage of memory and SD card.

7.4 Battery

Check the battery usage.

7.5 Applications

Change the management settings of the applications installed into the device.

- **Downloaded:** access the list of applications that has been installed in the device and view application information.
- Wallpaper: View service being used and access the service for management.
- All: View all applications, including the built-ins

7.6Accounts and synchronization

Change the automatic synchronization function settings or manage the account you want to synchronize.

7.7 Location Based Services

- **Google's Location Service:** Set to use the wireless network to view the location in your application.
- Location and Google Search: Allows Google to use your location information to improve search results.

7.8 Security

Change the setting to protect the equipment.

- Screen lock: Set the unlock security code.
 - No: Disable the screen lock.
 - Slide: Drag the circle to the specified location to unlock.
 - Pattern: Set unlock pattern for unlocking the screen.
 - PIN: Set a password (numeric) to unlock the screen.
 - Password: Set a password (numbers + letters) to unlock the screen.
- Encrypt the device: Set password to power on the device.
- Select the Device Manager: View Managers installed on the device. Bootable Device Manager to apply the new rules.
- **Unknown Sources**: Select to download applications from any source. If you do not select this option, the device can only downloaded from the **Android Market**.
- **Trusted Credentials:** Use certificates and credentials to ensure the safe use of various applications.
- **Installation From the SD Card:** install the encryption certificate stored in a USB storage device.
- Clear Credentials: delete the contents of the device credentials and reset the password.

7.9 Language & input

Change the text input settings.

- Select Language: Select the display language for all menus and applications.
- Keyboard Settings:
 - IFlyTek Input: Input Chinese & English.
 - Android Keyboard: Input English.

7.10 Voice

- Text-to-Speech (TTS) output:
 - **Preferred engine**: change the speech synthesis engine for voiced text.
 - **Install voice data:** Download and install voice data required for speech synthesis.
 - Language: set the language to use for text-to-speech function.
 - **Speed:** The play speed after convert text into speech.
 - **Listening Example:** Listen to the spoken word as an example. Install voice data for using text to speech conversion.

7.11 Pointer speed

Moving speed of the pointer when a mouse is connected.

7.12 Backup and Reset

• **Restore factory setting:** The device is reset to the default settings and all data is deleted.

7.13 Date and Time

Access and alter the following settings to control the display of date and time:



If the battery is exhausted, the date and time will be reset.

- **Auto:** When crossing time zones, the date and time will update automatically (Need network support).
- **Set date:** manually set the current date.
- **Set time:** manually set the current time.
- **Select time zone:** set the local time zone.
- Use the 24-hour clock: Set to display time in 24-hour mode.
- **Select Date Format:** To select the date format.

7.14 Auxiliaries

System auxiliary settings.

7.15 Developer Options

- Options used when the developer debug the system.
- When using third-party PC management software, you may need to turn USB debugging option on.

7.16 About the Device

• Display related information and inspect equipment status, etc.

8.0 Troubleshooting

8.1 Touch screen responds slowly or improperly

If the device touch screen is not responding properly, try the following:

• Make sure your fingers are clean and dry when tapping the touch screen.

- Restart the device to clear any temporary bugs.
- Ensure that the device applications are upgraded to the latest version.

8.2 The device freezes or has fatal errors

If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If the device is frozen or responds slowly, press the power on/off button and hold on, the device will automatically restart. If the problem persists, you can also perform a factory data reset. On the Applications screen, tap Settings \rightarrow Privacy \rightarrow Factory data reset \rightarrow Reset device \rightarrow Erase everything.

8.3 The device beeps and the battery icon is flashing

Your battery is low. Recharge the battery to continue using the device.

8.4 The battery does not charge properly or the device turns off

If the battery no longer charging properly, please send it back to us.

8.5 The device displays error messages of network or services

When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose connection.

Move to other area and try again.

You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

8.6 The device is hot to touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your device for an extended period of time, your device may feel hot to touch. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.

8.7 Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your device must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a computer or deleting files from your device.
- Restart the device. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact our service center.

8.8 Error messages appear when opening music files

Some music files may not play on your device for a variety of reasons. If you receive error messages when opening music files on your device, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a computer or deleting files from your device.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRM-protected, ensure that you have the appropriate license or key to play the file.
- Ensure that your device supports the file type.

8.9 A connection is not established when you connect the device to a computer

- Ensure that the USB cable you are using is compatible with your device.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your computer.

Do not drop or cause an impact to the charger or the battery
