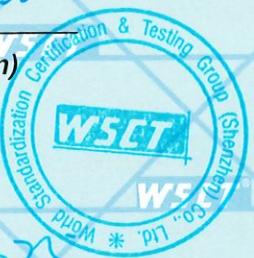

## 4. General Information

### 4.1. Test environment and mode

Engineering mode:	Keep the EUT in continuous transmitting by select channel and modulations(The value of duty cycle is 98.46%) with Fully-charged battery.
The sample was placed (0.1m below 1GHz, 1.5m above 1GHz) above the ground plane of 3m chamber. Measurements in both horizontal and vertical polarities were performed. During the test, each emission was maximized by: having the EUT continuously working, investigated all operating modes, rotated about all 3 axis (X, Y & Z) and considered typical configuration to obtain worst position, manipulating interconnecting cables, rotating the turntable, varying antenna height from 1m to 4m in both horizontal and vertical polarizations. The emissions worst-case are shown in Test Results of the following pages.	

### 4.2. Description of Support Units

The EUT has been tested as an independent unit together with other necessary accessories or support units. The following support units or accessories were used to form a representative test configuration during the tests.

2. Grounding was established in accordance with the manufacturer's requirements and conditions for the intended use.
3. For conducted measurements (Output Power, 6dB Emission Bandwidth, Power Spectral Density, Spurious Emissions), the antenna of EUT is connected to the test equipment via temporary antenna connector, the antenna connector is soldered on the antenna port of EUT, and the temporary antenna connector is listed in the Test Instruments.

### 5.3. Measurement Uncertainty

1. The following measurement uncertainty levels have been estimated for tests performed on the EUT as specified in CISPR 16-4-2. This uncertainty represents an expanded uncertainty expressed at approximately the 95% confidence level using a coverage factor of  $k=2$ .
2. The  $U_{lab}$  is less than  $U_{cispr}$ , compliance is deemed to occur if no measured disturbance level exceeds the disturbance limit; non-compliance is deemed to occur if any measured disturbance level exceeds the disturbance limit.
3. For conducted emission test of laboratory have a measurement uncertainty greater than that specified in harmonized standard, this equipment can still be used provided that an adjustment is made follows : any additional uncertainty in the test system over and above that specified in harmonized standard should be used to tighten the test requirements-making the test harder to pass. This procedure will ensure that a test system not compliant with harmonized standard does not increase the probability of passing a EUT that would otherwise have failed a test if a test system compliant with harmonized standard had been used.

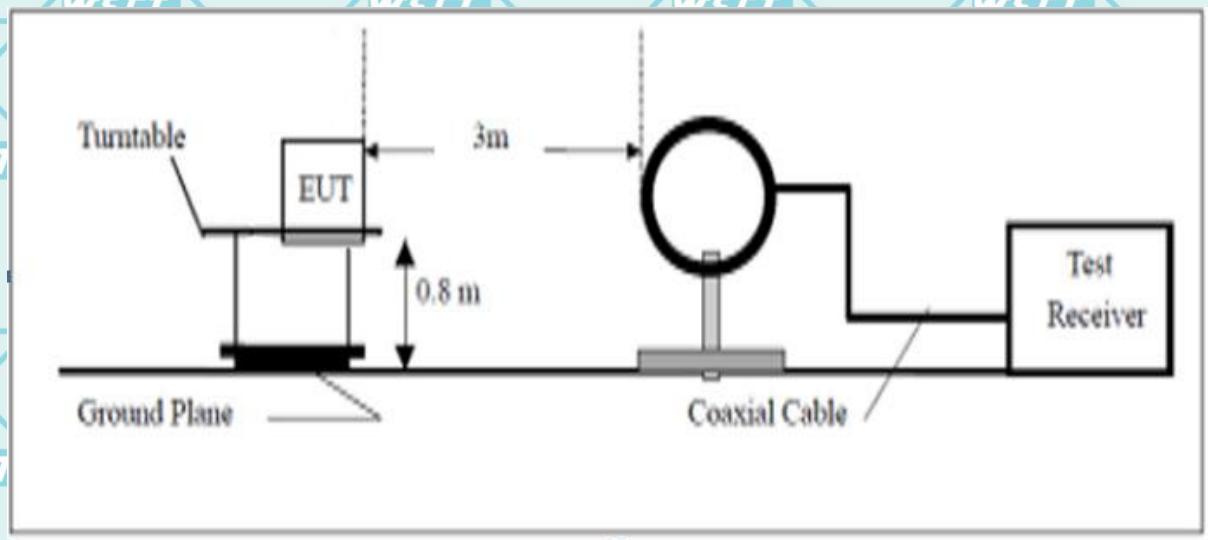

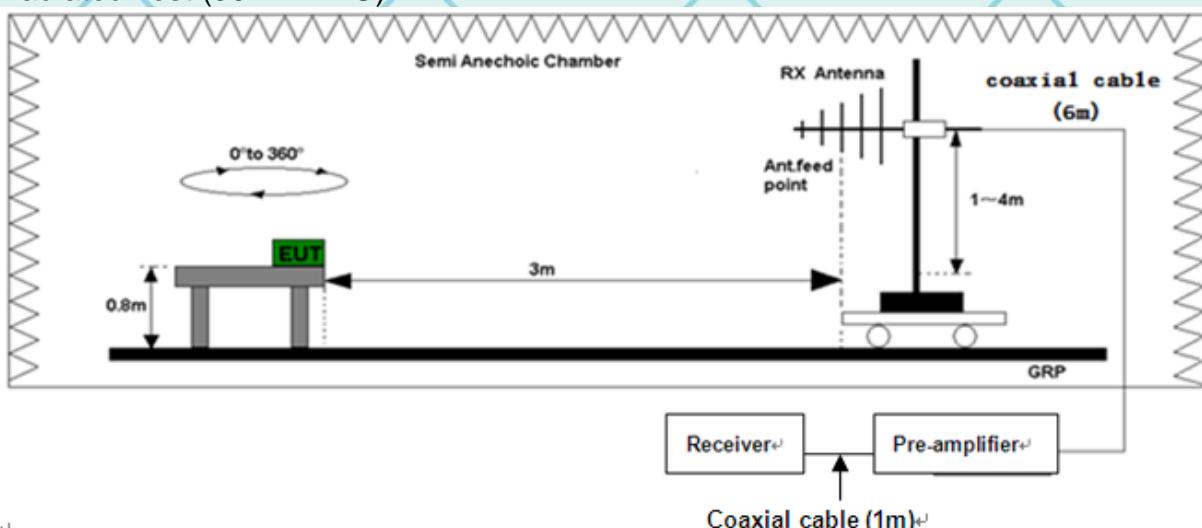
Radiated Test (Below 30 MHz)



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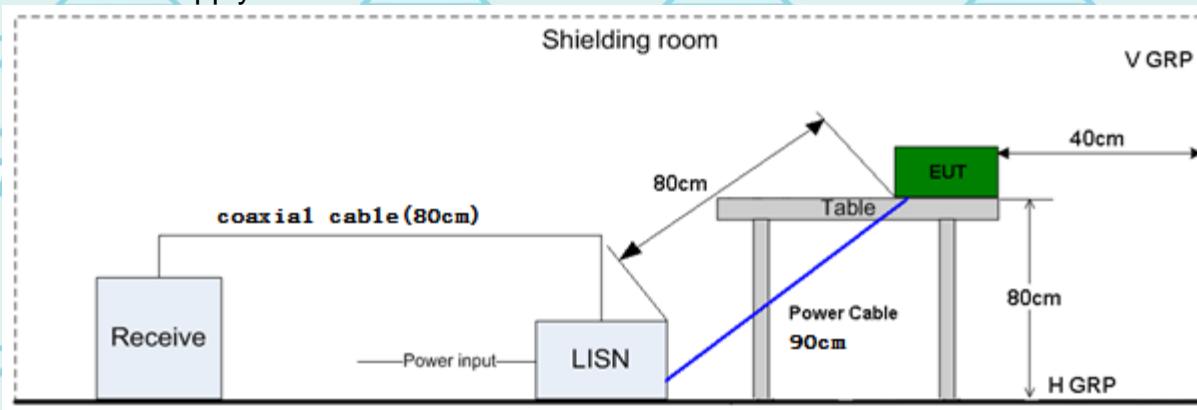
Test Setup 2

## 8. TEST ITEMS

### 8.1. Antenna Requirements

#### 8.1.1. Relevant Standards

FCC §15.203

An intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device. The use of a permanently attached antenna or of an antenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator shall be considered sufficient to comply with the provisions of this section. The manufacturer may design the unit so that a broken antenna can be replaced by the user, but the use of a standard antenna jack or electrical connector is prohibited. This requirement does not apply to carrier current devices or to devices operated under the provisions of § 15.211, § 15.213, § 15.217, § 15.219, or § 15.221. Further, this requirement does not apply to intentional radiators that must be professionally installed, such as perimeter protection systems and some field disturbance sensors, or to other intentional radiators which, in accordance with § 15.31(d), must be measured at the installation site. However, the installer shall be responsible for ensuring that the proper antenna is employed so that the limits in this part are not exceeded.

## 8.2. Emission Bandwidth

### 8.2.1. Definition

15.215(c);

Intentional radiators operating under the alternative provisions to the general emission limits must be designed to ensure that the 20 dB bandwidth of the emission, or whatever bandwidth may otherwise be specified in the specific rule section under which the equipment operates, is contained within the frequency band designated in the rule section under which the equipment is operated.

The following conditions shall be observed for measuring the occupied bandwidth and x dB bandwidth:

- The transmitter shall be operated at its maximum carrier power measured under normal test conditions.
- The span of the spectrum analyzer shall be set large enough to capture all products of the modulation process, including the emission skirts, around the carrier frequency, but small enough to avoid having other emissions (e.g. on adjacent channels) within the span.
- The detector of the spectrum analyzer shall be set to "Sample". However, a peak, or peak hold, may be used in place of the sampling detector since this usually produces a wider bandwidth than the actual bandwidth (worst-case measurement). Use of a peak hold (or "Max Hold") may be necessary to determine the occupied / x dB bandwidth if the device is not transmitting continuously.
- The resolution bandwidth (RBW) shall be in the range of 1% to 5% of the actual occupied / x dB bandwidth and the video bandwidth (VBW) shall not be smaller than three times the RBW value. Video averaging is not permitted.

Note: It may be necessary to repeat the measurement a few times until the RBW and VBW are in compliance with the above requirement.

For the 99% emission bandwidth, the trace data points are recovered and directly summed in linear power level terms. The recovered amplitude data points, beginning at the lowest frequency, are placed in a running sum until 0.5% of the total is reached, and that frequency recorded. The process is repeated for the highest frequency data points (starting at the highest frequency, at the right side of the span, and going down in frequency). This frequency is then recorded. The difference between the two recorded frequencies is the occupied bandwidth (or the 99% emission bandwidth).

### 8.2.3. Test Procedure

The 20dB bandwidth is measured with a spectrum analyzer connected via a receiver antenna placed near the EUT while the EUT is operating in transmission mode.

Use the following spectrum analyzer settings:

Span = between 2 to 5 times the OBW

RBW = 1% to 5% the OBW

VBW  $\geq$  3RBW

Sweep = auto

Detector function = peak

Trace = max hold

The 99% emission bandwidth is measured with a spectrum analyzer connected via a receiver antenna placed near the EUT while the EUT is operating in transmission mode.

Use the following spectrum analyzer settings:

Span = between 1.5 to 5 times the OBW

RBW = 1% to 5% OBW

VBW  $\geq$  3RBW

Sweep = auto

Detector function = peak

Trace = max hold

### 8.2.4. Test Result

Note: Because the measured signal is CW adjusting the RBW per C63.10 would not be practical since measured bandwidth will always follow the RBW and the result will be approximately twice the RBW.

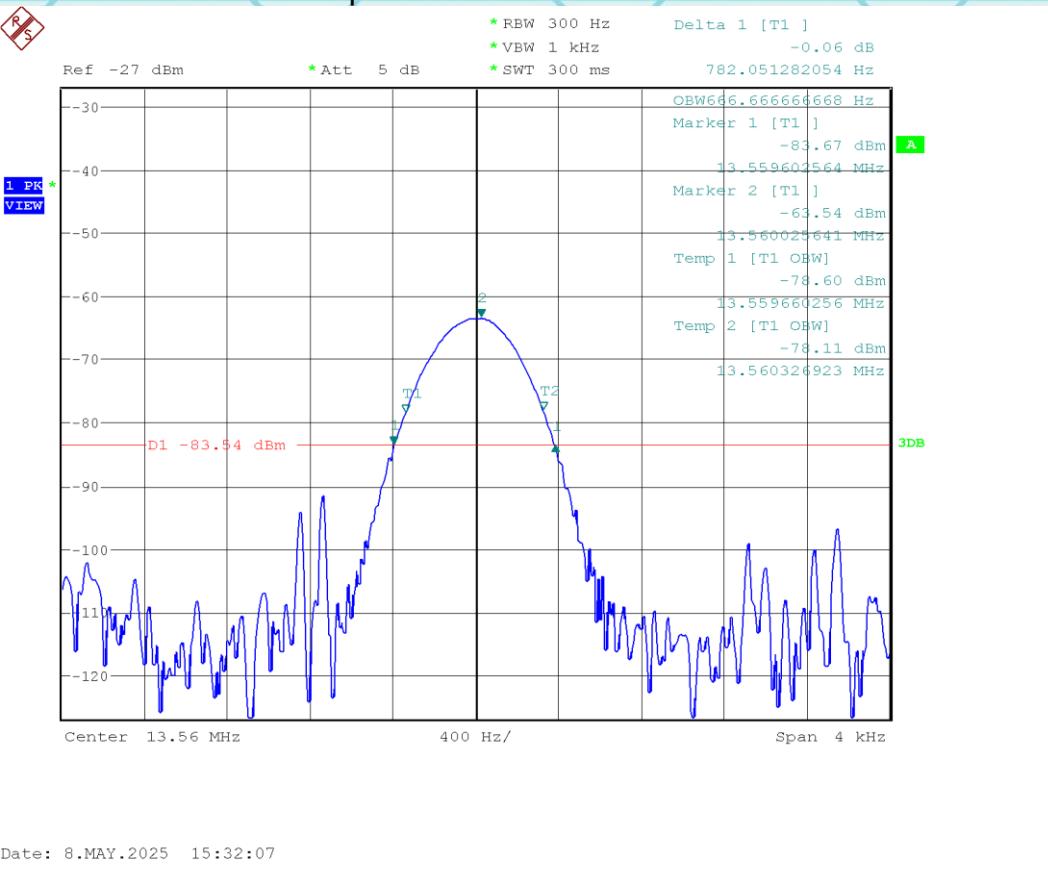

### 8.3. Field Strength of Fundamental Emissions and Radiated Emissions

#### 8.3.1. Limit

FCC §15.225(a), (b), (c)

According to FCC section 15.225, for <30 MHz, Radiated emissions were measured according to ANSI C63.4.

The EUT was set to transmit at the highest output power. The EUT was set 3 meter away from the measuring antenna. The loop antenna was positioned 1 meter above the ground from the center of the loop. The measuring bandwidth was set to 10 kHz. (Note: During testing the receive antenna was rotated about its axis to maximize the emission from the EUT)

There was no detected Restricted bands and Radiated spurious emission below 30MHz. The 30m limit was converted to 3m Limit using square factor(x) as it was found by measurements as follows; 3 m Limit(dB $\mu$ V/m) = 20log(X)+40log(30/3)= 20log(15848)+40log(30/3) = 124dB $\mu$ V

### 8.3.3. Test Procedure

The measurement frequency range is from 9 kHz to the 10th harmonic of the fundamental frequency. The

Turn Table is actuated to turn from 0° to 360°, and both horizontal and vertical polarizations of the Test Antenna are used to find the maximum radiated power. Mid channels on all channel bandwidth verified.

Only the worst RB size/offset presented. The power of the EUT transmitting frequency should be ignored.

All Spurious Emission tests were performed in X, Y, Z axis direction. And only the worst axis test condition was recorded in this test report.

Use the following spectrum analyzer settings:

Span = wide enough to fully capture the emission being measured

RBW = 1 MHz for  $f \geq 1$  GHz, 100 kHz for 30 MHz  $< f < 1$  GHz, 10 kHz for 150 kHz  $< f < 30$  MHz,

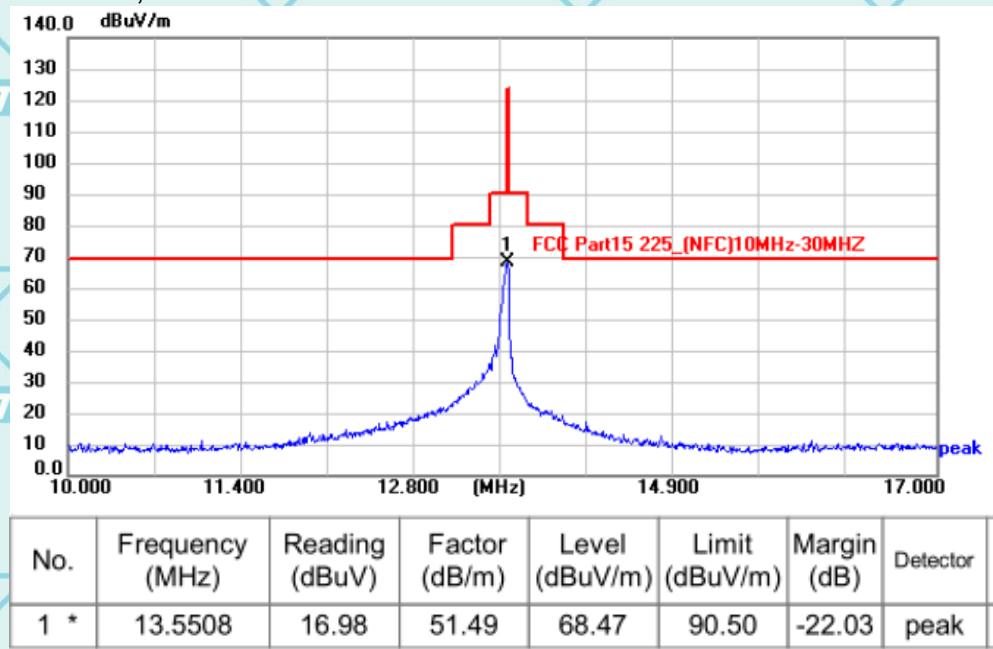

Test Antenna-LOOP, EUT X axis



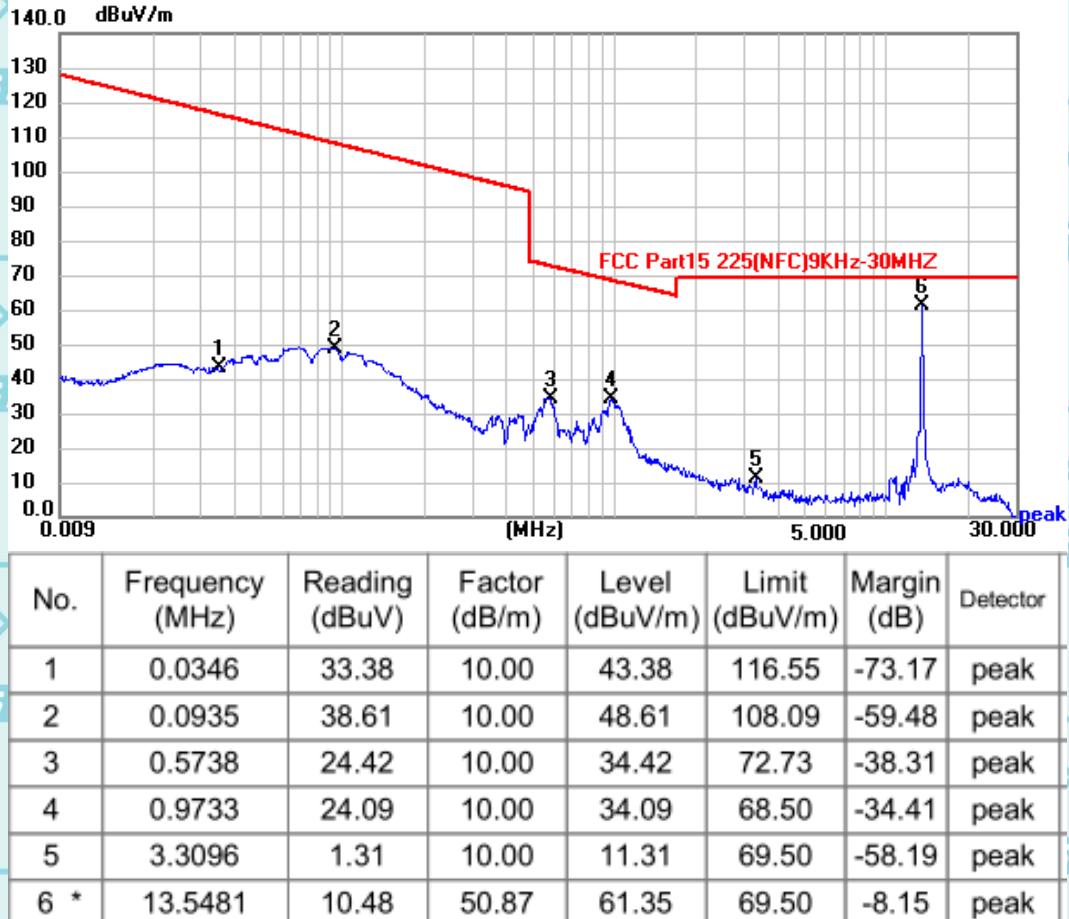

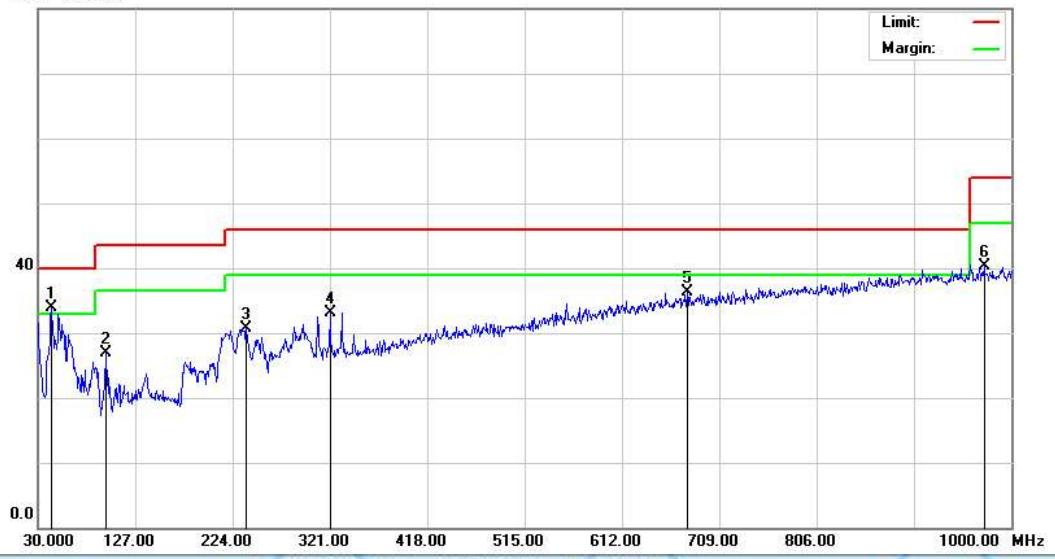
Below 30 MHz, Test Antenna LOOP, EUT X axis

## 8.4. Frequency Tolerance

### 8.4.1. Limit

FCC §15.225(e)

The frequency tolerance of the carrier signal shall be maintained within  $\pm 0.01\%$  of the operating frequency over a temperature variation of -20 degrees to +50 degrees C at normal supply voltage, and for a variation in the primary supply voltage from 85% to 115% of the rated supply voltage at a temperature of 20 degrees

C. For battery operated equipment, the equipment tests shall be performed using a new battery.

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## 8.5. Conducted Emission

### 8.5.1. Limit

FCC §15.207

For an intentional radiator that is designed to be connected to the public utility (AC) power line, the radio frequency voltage that is conducted back onto the AC power line on any frequency within the band 150 kHz to 30 MHz shall not exceed the limits in the following table, as measured using a 50 $\mu$ H/50 $\Omega$  line impedance stabilization network (LISN).

### 8.5.3. Test Procedure

The maximum conducted interference is searched using Peak (PK), if the emission levels more than the AV and QP limits, and that have narrow margins from the AV and QP limits will be re-measured with AV and QP detectors. Tests for both L phase and N phase lines of the power mains connected to the EUT are performed. Refer to recorded points and plots below.

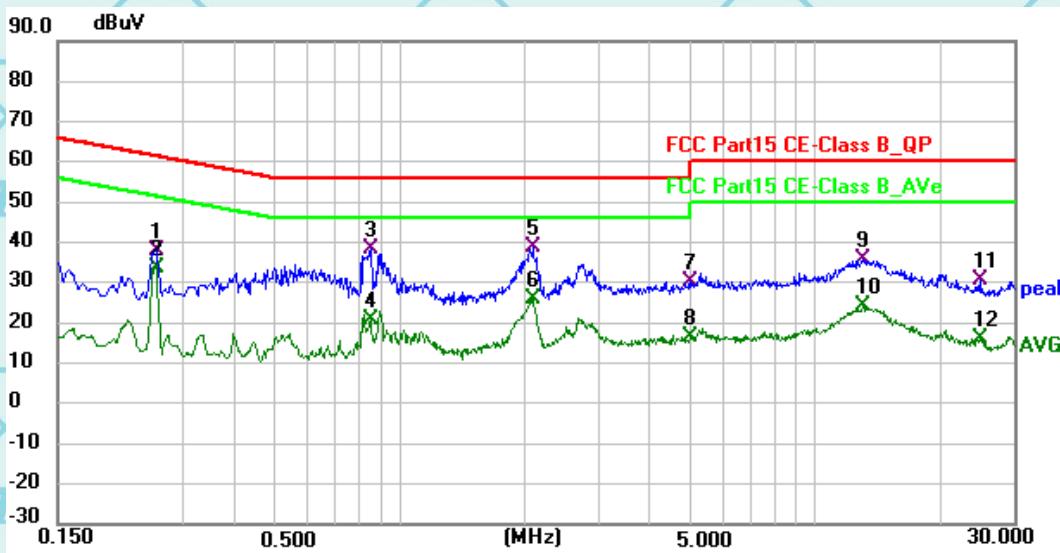

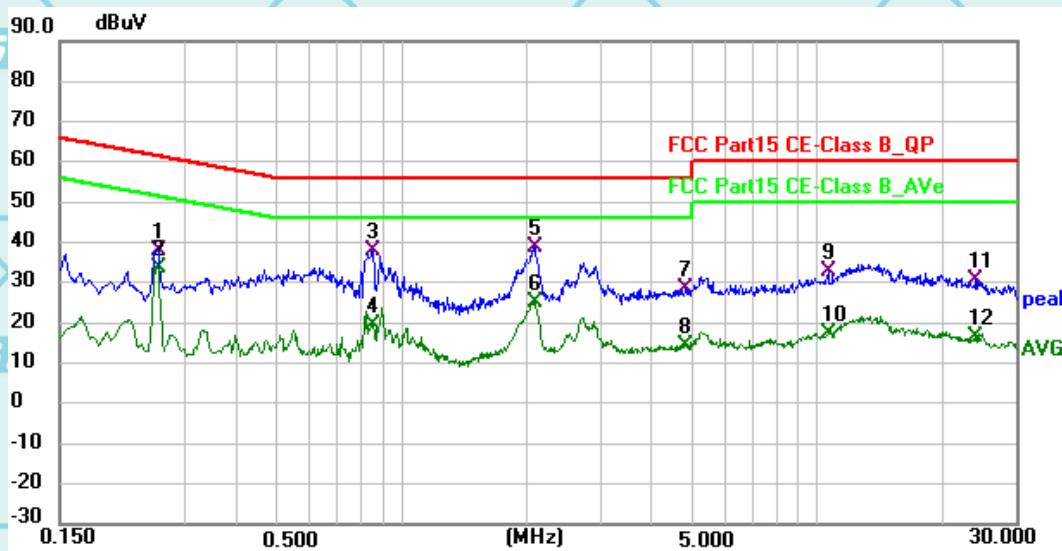
