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2.0 General Description

2.1 Product Description

The Equipment Under Test (EUT) is a Security system Fob operating at 433.92MHz. The EUT is powered by DC 3V button battery. For more detailed features description, please refer to the user's manual.

The model: Agent 99 FOB contains two SKUs (AG9943F and AG9943HF). The AG9943HF removes the buttons only based on AG9943F. After evaluation, the AG9943F is used for all test items.

Antenna Type: Integral Antenna

Modulation: FSK

Antenna Gain: -3.32dBi Max.

2.2 Related Submittal(s) Grants

This is an application for certification of the Security system Fob transmitter portion.

2.3 Test Methodology

Radiated emission measurements were performed according to the procedures in ANSI C63.10 (2013). Radiated emission measurement was performed in Semi-anechoic chamber. For radiated emission measurement, preliminary scans were performed in the semi-anechoic chamber only to determine the worst case modes. All radiated tests were performed at an antenna to EUT distance of 3 meters, unless stated otherwise in the "Justification Section" of this Application.

2.4 Test Facility

The Semi-Anechoic chamber used to collect the radiated data is Intertek **Testing Services Shenzhen Ltd. Longhua Branch** and located at 101, 201, Building B, No. 308 Wuhe Avenue, Zhangkengjing Community, GuanHu Subdistrict, LongHua District, ShenZhen. This test facility and site measurement data have been fully placed on file with File Number: CN1188.

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3.0 System Test Configuration

3.1 Justification

The system was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it), and in the confines as outlined in ANSI C63.10 (2013).

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The EUT was powered by a new DC 3V button battery during the test. Only the worst case data was shown in the report.

For maximizing emissions below 30 MHz, the EUT was rotated through 360°, the bottom of the loop antenna was placed 1 meter above the ground, and the antenna polarization was changed. For maximizing emission at and above 30 MHz, the EUT was rotated through 360°, the antenna height was varied from 1 meter to 4 meters above the ground plane, and the antenna polarization was changed. This step by step procedure for maximizing emissions led to the data report in Exhibit 4.0.

The unit was operated standalone and placed in the center of the turntable.

The equipment under test (EUT) was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it). The EUT was mounted to a plastic stand if necessary and placed on the styrene turntable, which enabled the engineer to maximize emissions through its placement in the three orthogonal axes.

There was no special software to exercise the device.

3.3 Special Accessories

3.4 Measurement Uncertainty

When determining of the test conclusion, the Measurement Uncertainty of test has been considered.

Any modifications installed previous to testing by Aritronix Ltd Inc. will be incorporated in each production model sold / leased in the United States.

No modifications were installed by Intertek Testing Services Shenzhen Ltd. Longhua Branch.

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4.0 System Test Configuration

4.1 Field Strength Calculation

The field strength is calculated by adding the reading on the Spectrum Analyzer to the factors associated with preamplifiers (if any), antennas, cables, pulse desensitization and average factors (when specified limit is in average and measurements are made with peak detectors). A sample calculation is included below.

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$$FS = RA + AF + CF - AG + PD + AV$$

where FS = Field Strength in $dB\mu V/m$

RA = Receiver Amplitude (including preamplifier) in dBμV

CF = Cable Attenuation Factor in dB

AF = Antenna Factor in dB AG = Amplifier Gain in dB

PD = Pulse Desensitization in dB

AV = Average Factor in -dB

In the radiated emission table which follows, the reading shown on the data table may reflect the preamplifier gain. An example of the calculations, where the reading does not reflect the preamplifier gain, follows:

$$FS = RA + AF + CF - AG + PD + AV$$

Example

Assume a receiver reading of $62.0dB_{\mu}V$ is obtained. The antenna factor of 7.4dB and cable factor of 1.6dB is added. The amplifier gain of 29dB is subtracted. The pulse desensitization factor of the spectrum analyzer was 0dB, and the resultant average factor was -10dB. The net field strength for comparison to the appropriate emission limit is $32dB_{\mu}V/m$. This value in $dB_{\mu}V/m$ was converted to its corresponding level in $\mu V/m$.

 $RA = 62.0dB\mu V$

AF = 7.4dB

CF = 1.6dB

AG = 29.0dB

PD = 0dB

AV = -10dB

FS = $62 + 7.4 + 1.6 - 29 + 0 + (-10) = 32dB\mu V/m$

Level in $\mu V/m = Common Antilogarithm [(32dB<math>\mu V/m)/20] = 39.8 \mu V/m$

- 2. All measurements were made at 3-meter. Harmonic emissions not detected at the 3-meter distances were measured at 0.3-meter and an inverse proportional extrapolation was performed to compare the signal level to the 3-meter limit. No other harmonic emissions than those reported were detected at a test distance of 0.3-meter.
- 3. All emissions below the Average limit.
- 4. "*" Emission within restricted band fulfils the requirement of section 15.205.
- 5. The preamplifier is used for frequencies above 1 GHz only.
- 6. Averaging factor in dB = 20log(duty cycle) = 20log(0.6196) = -4.1577dB



Note: The emission was found to cease within 5 seconds after button release.



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


9.2 Measured Bandwidth

From the plot, the 20dB bandwidth is 44.28 kHz and less than the limit of 1.08MHz. It fulfils the requirement of 15.231(c).




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




9.3 Discussion of Pulse Desensitization


Pulse desensitivity is not applicable for this device. The effective period (T_{eff}) is approximately 43.914ms for a digital "1" bit which illustrated on technical specification. With a resolution bandwidth (3 dB) of 100 kHz, the pulse desensitivity factor was 0 dB.






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The duty cycle is simply the on-time divided by the period:

The duration of one cycle = 70.87ms

Effective period of the cycle = 43.914ms

DC = 43.914 ms / 70.87 ms = 0.6196 or 61.96%

Therefore, the averaging factor is found by $20 \log_{10}(0.6196) = -4.1577dB$



9.4 Emissions Test Procedures

The following is a description of the test procedure used by Intertek Testing Services in the measurements of transmitters operating under Part 15, Subpart C rules.

The test set-up and procedures described below are designed to meet the requirements of ANSI C63.10 - 2013.

The transmitting equipment under test (EUT) is placed on a styrene turntable which is four feet in diameter, up to 1GHz 0.8m and above 1GHz 1.5m in height above the ground plane. During the radiated emissions test, the turntable is rotated and any cables leaving the EUT are manipulated to find the configuration resulting in maximum emissions. The EUT is adjust through all three orthogonal axes to obtain maximum emission levels. The antenna height and polarization are varied during the testing to search for maximum signal levels.

Detector function for radiated emissions is based on the use of measurement instrumentation with a CISPR quasi-peak detector.

The frequency range scanned is from the lowest radio frequency signal generated in the device which is greater than 9 kHz to the tenth harmonic of the highest fundamental frequency or 40 GHz, whichever is lower.

The EUT is warmed up for 15 minutes prior to the test.

AC power to the unit is varied from 85% to 115% nominal and variation in the fundamental emission field strength is recorded. If battery powered, a new, fully charged battery is used.

The IF bandwidth used for measurement of radiated signal strength was 10 kHz for emission below 30 MHz and 120 kHz for emission from 30 MHz to 1000 MHz. Where pulsed transmissions of short enough pulse duration warrant, a greater bandwidth is selected according to the recommendations of Hewlett Packard Application Note 150-2. Above 1000 MHz, a resolution bandwidth of 1 MHz is used.

Transmitter measurements are normally conducted at a measurement distance of three meters. However, to assure low enough noise floor in the restricted bands and above 1 GHz, signals are acquired at a distance of one meter or less. All measurements are extrapolated to three meters using inverse scaling, but those measurements taken at a closer distance are so marked.
