2.3. RECEIVER INPUT BANDWIDTH

The input bandwidth of the receiver is 1.3MHZ, In every connection one Bluetooth device is the master and the other one is slave. The master determines the hopping sequence. The slave follows this sequence. Both devices shift between RX and TX time slot according to the clock of the master. Additionally the type of connection(e.g. single or multislot packet) is set up at the beginning of the connection. The master adapts its hopping frequency and its TX/RX timing according to the packet type of the connection. Also the slave of the connection will use these settings.

Repeating of a packet has no influence on the hopping sequence. The hopping sequence generated by the master of the connection will be followed in any case. That means, a repeated packet will not be send on the same frequency, it is send on the next frequency of the hopping sequence.

2.5. EQUALLY AVERAGE USE OF FREQUENCIES AND BEHAVIOUR

The generation of the hopping sequence in connection mode depends essentially on two input values:

1. LAP/UAP of the master of the connection.
2. Internal master clock

The LAP(lower address part) are the 24 LSB's of the 48 BD_ADDRESS. The BD_ADDRESS is an unambiguous number of every Bluetooth unit. The UAP(upper address part) are the 24MSB's of the 48BD_ADDRESS

The internal clock of a Bluetooth unit is derived from a free running clock which is never adjusted and is never turned off. For synchronization with other units only offset are used. It has no relation to the time of the day. Its resolution is at least half the RX/TX slot length of 312.5us. The clock has a cycle of about one day(23h30). In most case it is implemented as 28 bit counter. For the deriving of the hopping sequence the entire. LAP(24 bits),4LSB's(4bits)(Input 1) and the 27MSB's of the clock(Input 2) are used. With this input values different mathematical procedures(permuations, additions, XOR-operations)are performed to generate the Sequence. This will be done at the beginning of every new transmission.

Regarding short transmissions the Bluetooth system has the following behavior:

The first connection between the two devices is established, a hopping sequence was generated. For Transmitting the wanted data the complete hopping sequence was not used. The connection ended.

The second connection will be established. A new hopping sequence is generated. Due to the fact the Bluetooth clock has a different value, because the period between the two transmission is longer(and it Cannot be shorter) than the minimum resolution of the clock(312.5us). The hopping sequence will always Differ from the first one.



TEST PLOT OF BANDWIDTH FOR MIDDLE CHANNEL




TEST PLOT OF BANDWIDTH FOR HIGH CHANNEL




TEST PLOT OF BANDWIDTH FOR LOW CHANNEL



TEST PLOT OF BANDWIDTH FOR MIDDLE CHANNEL




TEST PLOT OF BANDWIDTH FOR HIGH CHANNEL




TEST PLOT OF BANDWIDTH FOR LOW CHANNEL

TEST PLOT OF BANDWIDTH FOR HIGH CHANNEL





TEST PLOT OF OUT OF BAND EMISSIONS WITH THE WORST CASE

11.2. MEASUREMENT PROCEDURE

1. The measuring distance of 3m shall be used for measurements. The EUT was placed on the top of a rotating table 0.8 meter above the ground at a 3 meter semi-anechoic chamber. The table was rotated 360 degrees to determine the position of the highest radiation(Below 1GHz)
2. The measuring distance of 3m shall be used for measurements. The EUT was placed on the top of a rotating table 1.5 meter above the ground at a 3 meter semi-anechoic chamber. The table was rotated 360 degrees to determine the position of the highest radiation(Above 1GHz)
3. The height of the test antenna shall vary between 1m to 4m. Both horizontal and vertical polarization of the antenna are set to make the measurement.
4. The initial step in collecting radiated emission data is a receive peak detector mode. Pre-scanning the measurement frequency range. Significant peaks are then marked and then Quasi Peak detector mode re-measured.
5. All readings are peak unless otherwise stated QP in column of Note. Peak denotes that the Peak reading compliance with the QP limits and then QP Mode measurement didn't perform(Below 1GHz)
6. All readings are Peak mode value unless otherwise stated AVG in column of Note. If the Peak mode measured value compliance with the Peak limits and lower than AVG Limits, the EUT shall be deemed to meet Peak&AVG limits and then only Peak mode was measured, but AVG mode didn't perform.(Above 1GHz)






RADIATED EMISSION TEST SETUP BELOW 30MHz












TEST PLOT OF BAND EDGE FOR LOW CHANNEL (1Mbps)-Vertical


TEST PLOT OF BAND EDGE FOR HIGH CHANNEL (1Mbps)-Horizontal




TEST PLOT OF LOW CHANNEL

TEST PLOT OF HIGH CHANNEL







16.3. PRELIMINARY PROCEDURE OF LINE CONDUCTED EMISSION TEST

1. The equipment was set up as per the test configuration to simulate typical actual usage per the user's manual. When the EUT is a tabletop system, a wooden table with a height of 0.8 meters is used and is placed on the ground plane as per ANSI C63.10 (see Test Facility for the dimensions of the ground plane used). When the EUT is a floor-standing equipment, it is placed on the ground plane which has a 3-12 mm non-conductive covering to insulate the EUT from the ground plane.
2. Support equipment, if needed, was placed as per ANSI C63.10.
3. All I/O cables were positioned to simulate typical actual usage as per ANSI C63.10.
4. All support equipments received AC120V/60Hz power from a LISN, if any.
5. The EUT received DC charging voltage by adapter which received 120V/60Hzpower by a LISN.
6. The test program was started. Emissions were measured on each current carrying line of the EUT using a spectrum Analyzer / Receiver connected to the LISN powering the EUT. The LISN has two monitoring points: Line 1 (Hot Side) and Line 2 (Neutral Side). Two scans were taken: one with Line 1 connected to Analyzer / Receiver and Line 2 connected to a 50 ohm load; the second scan had Line 1 connected to a 50 ohm load and Line 2 connected to the Analyzer / Receiver.
7. Analyzer / Receiver scanned from 150 kHz to 30MHz for emissions in each of the test modes.
8. During the above scans, the emissions were maximized by cable manipulation.
9. The test mode(s) were scanned during the preliminary test.

Then, the EUT configuration and cable configuration of the above highest emission level were recorded for reference of final testing.

16.4. FINAL PROCEDURE OF LINE CONDUCTED EMISSION TEST



1. EUT and support equipment was set up on the test bench as per step 2 of the preliminary test.
2. A scan was taken on both power lines, Line 1 and Line 2, recording at least the six highest emissions. Emission frequency and amplitude were recorded into a computer in which correction factors were used to calculate the emission level and compare reading to the applicable limit. If EUT emission level was less -2dB to the A.V. limit in Peak mode, then the emission signal was re-checked using Q.P and Average detector.
3. The test data of the worst case condition(s) was reported on the Summary Data page.



