Getting Started

The topics in this section will introduce you to your phone, help you get set up with service, provide an overview of the phone screen, and get you started with basic phone operations.

Introduction

Thank you for purchasing your **new phone**. The following topics describe the basics of using this guide and your new phone.

Before Using Your Phone

Read the QuickStart Guide that waspackaged with your phone thoroughly for proper usage. Accessible services may be limited by subscription contract conditions.

Descriptions in the User Guide

Note that most descriptions in this guide are based on your phone's setup at the time of purchase. Unless otherwise noted, instructions begin from the phone's home screen, which is displayed by pressing the **End/power key**. Some operation descriptions may be simplified.

Screenshots and Key Labels

Screenshots and other illustrations in this user guide may appear differently on your phone. Key labels in the user guide are simplified for description purposes and differ from your phone's display.

Other Notations

In the user guide, the phone may be referred to either as "phone," "device," or "handset." A microSDTM or microSDHCTM card is referred to as an "SD card" or a "memory card."

Set Up Your Phone

The following topics give you all the information you need to set up your phone and wireless service the first time.


Parts and Functions

These topics illustrate your phone's primary parts and key functions.

Note: Your phone's screens and apps layouts are subject to change. This user guide uses sample images.

Phone Layout

The following illustration outlines your phone's primary external features and keys.



Part	Description	
Camera	Takes pictures and records videos.	
Receiver Lets you hear the caller and automated prompts.		

Main Screen	Displays all the information needed to operate your phone, such as the call status,
Main Screen	the Contacts list, and the date and time.

Part	Description	
External Screen	Display the date, time and the notification of incoming calls or messages.	
Center Soft Key	Selects or confirms an option (press the middle of the key).	
Navigation Key	Navigate Up, Down, Left, or Right through menus.	
Call Key	Launches call log from idle screen.	
End/Power Key	Returns you to the apps list or turns the phone on or off. Returns you to the previous screen, or closes a dialog box, options menu.	
Charging Port	Allows you to connect the phone charger.	
Volume Keys	Allows you to adjust the ringtone or media volume or adjust the voice volume during a call.	
F -	llows you to plug in either a stereo headset or an optional headset for convenient, ands-free conversations.	

CAUTION! Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack may damage the phone.

Battery Use

The following topics explain how to insert and remove your phone's battery.

Battery Cautions

Storage: Avoid storing or leaving battery with no charge remaining. Saved information and settings may become lost or changed, or battery may become unusable. Charge once every six months before storing or leaving unused for a long period.

Bulges: Depending on use, bulges may appear near end of battery life. This does not affect safety.


Replacing Battery: The battery is a consumable item. It needs to be replaced if operating time shortens noticeably. Purchase a new battery.

Cleaning: Clean soiled terminals between battery and phone with a clean, dry cotton swab. Soiled terminals can result in a poor connection and prevent charging, etc.


Insert the Battery

Follow these instructions to insert your phone's battery safely and properly.


 ${\tt 1.}\ Remove the battery cover by gently lifting in the directions hown below.$




Remove the Battery

Follow these instructions to remove your phone's battery. Always power the phone off before removing the battery.

1. Removethebatterycoverbygentlyliftinginthedirectionshownbelow.



2. Removethebatterybygentlyliftingupwardasshown.



Charge the Battery

Follow these instructions to charge your phone's battery using either the included AC adapter or via a USB connection on your computer.

Charge Using the AC Adapter

- 1. Plugthechargerintothechargingportofyourphone.
- 2. PlugtheACadapterintoanelectricaloutlet.

3.

Aftercharging, unplug the AC adapter from the outlet and remove the charger from the phone.



Charge Using a PC Connection

Before using a PC connection to charge your phone, ensure that the computer is turned on. Depending on the type of connection, your phone's battery may not charge.

- ${\tt 2.}\ Insert the large end of the USB coordinato an external USB porton your computer.$
- 3. Aftercharging, remove the USB cable from both the phone and the computer.

SIM Card

The SIM card is an IC card containing phone number and other customer information. Your phone's SIM card is preinstalled and should only be accessed if directed by a customer service representative.



Insert SIM Card

Follow these instructions to insert a SIM card. Remember to power off your phone before inserting a SIM card.

Note: <u>If</u> Your phone's SIM card is preinstalled. These instructions are for reference only.

- 1. Removethebatterycoverandbattery.(SeeRemovetheBattery.)
- 2. GentlyinserttheSIMcardwiththegoldICchipfacingdownward. (See the Quick Start Guide for additional instructions).



- 3. Insertthebatteryandreplacethebatterycover.(SeeInserttheBattery.)
- 4. Makesureallthetabsaresecureandtherearenogapsaroundthecover.

SD Card

Your phone supports the use of an optional SD card (not included) to expand its storage capacity. Some cards may not operate properly with your phone.

SD Card Cautions

Data: Information stored on an SD card can become lost or changed accidently or as a result of damage. It is recommended that you keep a separate copy of important data. Asiatelco is not responsible for damages from data that is lost or changed.

Reading/Writing Data: Never power off or remove the battery while reading or writing data.

Battery Level: A low battery may prevent reading/writing to an SD card.


Handling SD Card: Use/store SD cards away from the reach of infants and small children, it may cause choking if swallowed.

Insert an SD Card

Follow these steps to insert an optional SD card (not included).

Important: Make sure to power your phone off before inserting or removing an SD card.

- 1. Removethebatterycoverandbattery.(SeeRemovetheBattery.)
- ${\tt 2.} \ Gently insert the SD card with terminals facing down all the way without bending the card.\\$



Important: Insert only SD cards needs either SD or image on card.



Remove an SD Card

Follow these instructions to remove an SD card.

Important: Always power off before inserting or removing an SD card.

- 1. Remove the battery cover and battery. (See Remove the Battery.)
- 2 PushdownontheplasticspringandremoveSDcard.



- 4. Insertthebattery. Align the battery with the battery outline in the phone.
- 5. Attachthebatterycover. Makesureall components are secureand there are no gaps around the cover.

Turn Your Phone On and Off

The instructions below explain how to turn your phone on and off.

Turn Your Phone On

Press and hold the **End/power key** — 0.



Your phone will power on. Depending on the settings, you may see the lock screen.

- 1. SeeLockandUnlockYourScreenandScreenLockSettingsforinformationaboutusingthe screen lock.
- 2. Thefirsttimeyouturnthephoneon, youwill see the startup screens. See Complete the Setup Screens for details.
- 3. Ifyourphoneisnotyetactivated, see Activate Your Phone formore information. Turn Your Phone Off
- 4. Press and hold the **End/power key** Your phone will power off.

Note: Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

Complete the Setup Screens

The setup screens help you set up certain features and preferences on your phone. Once your phone has been turned on, you will see a Welcome message. You can then complete the setup process.

Note: You may be able to complete the setup screens before your phone has been activated on your account.

SetupKaiOSAccount–Usethe**Navigation**keytoselect**CreateAccount**and setupa new KaiOS Account or **Login Account**.Complete the steps to sign in to your current KaiOS Account. Press the **Right soft key** to skip. The following options may apply depending on your selection:

- Create Account Follow the instructions to sign up for a new KaiOS Account.
- **Login Account** Enter your KaiOS Account login address and password and sign in to your current KaiOS Account.

AboutKaiOS–ReadanyapplicableTermsandConditionsofthe KaiOSsystemforusingyourphone, press the **Right soft key** to agree to the terms of service and privacy policy. Your setup is now complete.

Your phone is now set up for use. If you skipped any part of the setup, you can access additional options from the Apps screen or through Settings.

Basics

Home Screen and Applications (Apps) List

Most of your phone's operations originate from the home screen or the apps list.

- 2. Fromanyappscreenpressthe**End/powerkey** todisplaytheappslist.

Phone Settings Menu

You can customize your phone's settings and options through the Settings menu.

Fromtheappslistscreen, select **Settings 2**.

Capture Screenshots

You can take screenshots with your phone's shortcut key combination

- Press and hold the Camera key and Volume down key at the same time to capture a screenshot of the current screen.
- The current screenshot will be captured and stored in the Screenshots album in the phone's Gallery application. From the apps list screen, select **Gallery** .

Applications

The following topics describe how to access the applications (apps) list and launch apps on your phone.

Launch Applications

All installed apps can be accessed and launched from the apps list.

1. From home, press the **Center soft key**.



The apps list opens.

2. Usethe **Navigation** keytoselectan application and then press to launch the corresponding application. The application opens.

Phone Number

Follow the instructions below to display your phone's wireless phone number.

- 1. Fromtheappslist, select **Settings** > **Device** > **Device** | **Dev**
- 2. Select**PhoneNumber**.

You will see the number listed under **Phone Number**.




Airplane Mode

Airplane mode turns off all functions that emit or receive signals, while leaving your phone on so you can use apps that don't require a signal or data.

To turn on airplane mode:

- 1. Fromtheappslist, select Settings >Network&Connectivity.
- 2. Select**AirplaneMode**.
- 3. Select**On**toenableairplanemode.



Your phone is now in airplane mode. You will see the airplane mode icon $\frac{1}{2}$ in the status bar. To turn off airplane mode:

- 1. Fromtheappslist, select Settings >Network&Connectivity.
- 2. Select**Airplanemode**.
- 3. SelectOfftodisableairplanemode.

Your phone's wireless connection features are now restored.

Enter Text

You can enter text using your phone's Nuance T9 keyboard.

Text Input

There are different ways to enter text to create contacts, write emails or send messages. You may choose from the different methods by pressing the key and alternate between:

1. Abc (sentence case), abc (lower case), or ABC (caps lock case): with this mode you must press each key multipletimes to create each letter. For example, an 'S' is created by pressing the '7' key four times. An 'e' is created bypressing '3' twice, and so on.

- 2. 123: this mode generates only numbers. You may type '1' by pressing the '1' key just once, '2' by pressing '2' and so on. Switch back to ABC, Abc or abc mode to continue writing words.
- 3. Symbols: This function provides punctuation and special characters. Symbols may be accessed by pressing the key *+ as well. Find the right symbol by pressing right/left of the Navigation Key.

 When the cursor highlights asymbol you want to add, press the **Center Soft Key** to select it.
- 4. Ifyouwanttodeletethe already typedlettersorsymbolspressthe **End/power key** todeletethemoneby oneor long press to delete all at once.

Lock and Unlock Your Screen

Your phone allows you to quickly turn the screen on/off when you unfold/fold the phone, or you can set up screen lock to prevent others from using your phone without your permission.


Turn the Screen Off When Not in Use

- 1. Toquicklyturnthescreenoff, simplyfold (close) the phone.
- 2. To save battery power, the phone automatically turns off the screen after a certain period of time when you leave it idle. You will still be able to receive messages and calls while the phone's screen is off.

Note: For information on how to adjust the time before the screen turns off, see Display Settings.

Turn the Screen Lock On or Off

- 1. Fromtheappslist, select Settings >Privacy&Security>ScreenLock.
- 2. Select**On**toenable screen lock
- 3. Youwillbepromptedtoenterthepasscode.SeeScreenLockSettings.



Update Your Phone

From time to time, updates may become available for your phone. You can apply updates through the **Settings** >**Device** >**Device** Information>**Softwareupdate**menu.

Software Update CautionsDuring update: The phone cannot be used until the software update is complete. It may take time to update your phone's software.

Signal during update: Update your phone where signal reception is good, and do not change location during the update process. Make sure the battery is adequately charged before beginning an update. A weak signal or low battery during an update may cause the update to fail. An update failure may disable the phone. Should the phone be plugged into power source and charging while an update is being performed?

Other functions during update: Other phone functions cannot be used during a software update.

Update Your Phone Software

You can update your phone's software using the System Updates option.

1. Fromtheappslist, select Settings >Device > Device Information > Software update.



2. Select**Softwareupdate**.

You may be required to power your phone off and back on to complete the software upgrade.

Confirm Your Current Phone Software

- 1. Fromtheappslist, select Settings > Device > Device | D
- 2. LocatetheSoftwareversionread-onlyfield.

Your Phone's Home Screen

The following topics describe how to use your phone's home screen and understand the status bar.

Home Screen Basics

The home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus.



Item	Description
Status Bar/Status Area	The status bar displays icons to notify you of your phone's status (on the right side) and notifications (on the left side). The status area of the status bar (on the right) displays phone and service status information such as signal strength, battery status, Wi-Fi and data connectivity, ringer status, and time.

Notices	Press the Left soft key to view numerical notifications (missed call, new mail, new message,etc.	
Apps list	Press the Center soft key to enter the apps list.	
shortcuts	Press the Right soft key to enter shortcuts.	

Tip: Press the End/power key to return to the main home screen.

Status Bar

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides phone and service status information on the right side and notification alerts on the left.

Change the Home Screen Wallpaper

Select and assign your phone's background wallpaper.

1. Fromtheappslist, select Settings >Personalization > Display > Wallpaper.

- 2. Select Wallpaper and use the Navigation key to select from Gallery, Wallpaper, or Camera.
- 3. Selectawallpaperandthenpressthe **Rightsoftkey** to set the wallpaper.



Making Connections

The topics in this section will cover your phone's ability to help you make connections, from phone calls and maintaining contacts, to text messages, email, Internet, and international services.

Phone Calls and Voicemail

The following topics outline the use of your device's phone app to place and receive calls, use voicemail, and more.

Place and Answer Calls

The following topics describe how to directly dial calls, how to answer incoming calls, and how to use the in-call screen options.

Adjust In-Call Volume

Adjusting Call Volume: Press the **Volume** key up or down during the call.

Troubleshooting

Problem: Difficulty during call.

Answer 1: It may not be possible to make a call properly in a noisy location.

Answer 2: When calling using Speaker, check the call volume. Raising the call volume may

make calling difficult.

Problem: Sound pops momentarily during a call.

Answer: Are you changing location while calling? Sound pops when signal is weak and the phone switches to a different area.


Emergency Call Cautions

Emergency calls are restricted in Airplane mode. Press a small round button on the back of the phone and the phone vibrates to automatically dial 911 for an emergency call.

Call Using the Phone Dialer

Calling is by using the phone's dialer screen.

1. Pressthenumberkeysonthekeypadtoenterthephonenumber.



Asyouenterdigits, Smart Dialsearches for contacts that match. If you see the number you want to dial, use the **Navigation** key to select the number and place the call immediately without entering the rest of the phone number.


- 2. Select key or select tocallthenumber. The phone dials the number. The call begins when the other party answers.
- 3. Toendthecall,pressthe**End/powerkey** • The call ends.
- 4. From the apps list, select **Call Log** to View yourcall log.

Troubleshooting

Problem: Call does not connect.

Answer 1: Was the number dialed using the area code? If not, try dialing using the full 10-digit number including the area code.

Answer 2: Are you in an area with poor wireless coverage? Try calling again from another area.



International call

To dial an international call, press twice *+ to enter "+" in dial screen, enter the international country prefix followedby the full phone number, then press the **Call Key**

Call Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 9-1-1 even if the phone's screen is locked or your account is restricted. There are three ways to place an emergency numbers.

- 1. To call the 9-1-1 emergency number when the phone's screen is locked with a screen lock:
 - 1. On the lock screen, select **Emergency**into dial pad.



2. Dial9-1-1on the key pad



- 3. As long as you are in an area covered by wireless service, the emergency call is placed.
- 2. To call the 9-1-1 emergency number normally or when your account is restricted:
 - 1. Unlock the screen. For more information, see Lock and Unlock Your Screen.
 - 2. Press the number keys on the keypad, Press 9-1-1.
 - 3. As long as you are in an area covered by wireless service, the emergency call is placed.
- 3. Call the 9-1-1 emergency number viathe **SOS key**. Whenever your phone is locked or unlocked, closed or opened. You are able to press and hold the **SOS key** for a few seconds, 9-1-1 is dialed automatically.
 - i. Press and hold the **SOS key** until the vibration stops, meanwhile the prompt coming outwill say, "Please open the flip phone". You have to flip the phone if the phone prompts you to do so.
 - ii. 9-1-1 is dialedautomatically without any other action.
 - iii. As long as you are in an area covered by wireless service, the emergency call is placed.

Enhanced 9-1-1 (E 9-1-1) Information

This phone features an embedded Global Positioning System (GPS) chip necessary for utilizing E9-1-1 emergency location services where available.

When you place an emergency 9-1-1 call, the GPS feature of your phone seeks information to calculate your approximate location. Depending on several variables, including availability and access to satellite signals, it may take 30 seconds or more to determine and report your approximate location.

Important: Always report your location to the 9-1-1 operator when placing an emergency call. Some designated emergency call takers, known as Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs), may not be equipped to receive GPS location information from your phone.

Answer Phone Calls

The following information lets you know how to answer incoming calls, mute the ringer on incoming calls, reject incoming calls, and more.

When you receive a phone call from a contact, the sub screen appears and displays the caller name. When you receive a phone call from someone who is not stored in Contacts, the phone number appears on the Incoming call screen.

Note: If your phone is turned off, all calls automatically go to voicemail.

Answer an Incoming Call




Voicemail



When you're on a call, your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available).


To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

Use the **Navigation key** to select to answer the call or to ignore the incoming call. (Answering the call puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.)

Conference Calling

With conference calling, also known as 3-way calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.


Call Forwarding lets you forward all your incoming calls to another phone number – even when your phone is turned off. You can continue to make calls from your phone when you have activated Call Forwarding.

Note: You are charged a higher rate for calls you have forwarded.

TTY Mode

A TTY (teletypewriter, also known as a TDD or Text Telephone) is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf, hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate by telephone.

Your phone is compatible with select TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device to ensure that it supports digital wireless transmission. Your phone and TTY device will connect using a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack. If this cable was not provided with your TTY device, contact your TTY device manufacturer to purchase the connector cable.

To turn TTY Mode on or off:

- 1. Fromtheappslist, select Settings > Device > Accessibility > TTY.
- 2. Select**Full,HCO**,or**VCO**toturnTTYmodeon. –or– Select **Off** to turn TTY mode off. Your phone's TTY mode is set.



Note: When enabled, TTY mode may impair the audio quality of non-TTY devices connected to the headset jack.

Warning: 9-1-1 Emergency Calling

It is recommended that TTY users make emergency calls by other means, including Telecommunications Relay Services (TRS), analog cellular, and landline communications. Wireless TTY calls to 9-1-1 may be corrupted when received by public safety answering points (PSAPs), rendering some communications unintelligible. The problem encountered appears related to TTY equipment or software used by PSAPs. This matter has been brought to the attention of the FCC, and the wireless industry and the PSAP community are currently working to resolve this.

Contacts

The Contacts application lets you store and manage contacts from a variety of sources, including contacts you enter and save directly in your phone.


Contacts Cautions

Multimedia messages, or MMS, can contain text, pictures, music, audio or video files, and contact cards. See your service plan for applicable charges for messaging.



Manage Message Conversations

Text and multimedia messages that are sent to and received from a contact (or a number) are grouped into conversations or message threads in the Messages screen. Text or MMS conversations let you see exchanged messages (similar to a chat program) with a contact on the screen.

Read a Text Message

On the Messages screen, press the text message or conversation to open and read it.press **End/power key** return to the Messaging screen from a conversation.

Icon Status

Network (full signal): The fullness of the triangle icon indicates the strength of the signal. A

	fuller icon means a better signal.
G	4G LTE data service: Your phone is connected to a 4G LTE network.
3	Wi-Fi connection: Your phone is connected to a Wi-Fi network for data.

Browser

Your phone's Web browser gives you full access to both mobile and traditional websites on the go, using 2G, 3G, 4G, or Wi-Fi data connections.

SSL/TLS

SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) and TLS (Transport Layer Security) are protocols for encrypting sent/received data. While in a screen connected by SSL/TLS, data is encrypted to safely send/receive private information, credit card numbers, corporate secrets, etc., and provide protection against online threats (eavesdropping, falsification, impersonation, etc.).





Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless Internet access over distances of up to 300 feet. To use your phone's Wi-Fi, you need access to a wireless access point or "hotspot." The availability and range of the Wi-Fi signal depends on a number of factors, including infrastructure and other objects through which the signal passes.

Turn Wi-Fi On and Connect to a Wireless Network

It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the phone. Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with national regulations and standards must be shown.

The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested is 0.86W/Kg for use at the ear and 1.39W/Kg for use close to the body.

THIS PHONE HAS A HAC RATING OF M4/T3 WHAT IS HEARING AID COMPATIBILITY?

The Federal Communications Commission has implemented rules and a rating system designed to enable people who wear hearing aids to more effectively use these wireless telecommunications devices. The standard for compatibility of digital wireless phones with hearing aids is set forth in American National Standard Institute (ANSI) standard C63.19. There are two sets of ANSI standards with ratings from one to four (four being the best rating): an "M" rating for reduced interference making it easier to hear conversations on the phone when using the hearing aid microphone, and a

"T" rating that enables the phone to be used with hearing aids operating in the tele-coil mode thus reducing unwanted background noise.

HOW WILL I KNOW WHICH WIRELESS PHONES ARE HEARING AID COMPATIBLE?

The Hearing Aid Compatibility rating is displayed on the wireless phone box. A phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for acoustic coupling (microphone mode) if it has an "M3" or "M4" rating. A digital wireless phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for inductive coupling (tele-coil mode) if it has a "T3" or "T4" rating.

HOW WILL I KNOW IF MY HEARING AID WILL WORK WITH A PARTICULAR DIGITAL WIRELESS PHONE?

You'll want to try a number of wireless phones so that you can decide which works the best with your hearing aids. You may also want to talk with your hearing aid professional about the extent to which your hearing aids are immune to interference, if they have wireless phone shielding, and whether your hearing aid has a HAC ratio

This phone has been tested and rated for use with hearing aids for some of the wireless technologies that it uses. However, there may be some newer wireless technologies used in this phone that have not been tested yet for use with hearing aids. It is important to try the different features of this phone thoroughly and in different locations, using your hearing aid or cochlear implant, to determine if you hear any interfering noise.
