

















<div><h1>User Manual</h1><p>You need to have an iPhone or iPad with iOS 14.5 or iPadOS 14.5 or later installed and Apple-ID two-factor authentication enabled</p></div>	<div><h3>Quick Instructions</h3><p>1. Turn on the device Quickly press and release the Find My button to turn on you JDA Card.</p><p>2. Pair the device Please make sure to pair the device within 3 minutes, otherwise you will need to press the button once to enter the pairing state again, Turn on bluetooth on you iPhone or other Apple device, Open the Find My app</p></div>	<div><ul style="list-style-type: none">· Hold the device close to your iPhone· Tap "Add Item"· Tap "Other Supported Item"· Goes to Searching Items Interface<p>· When found the Finder item, Tap "Connect"</p><p>· Name the item and Choose an emoji.</p></div>	<div><ul style="list-style-type: none">· Tap Agree to acknowledge that this item will be linked to your Apple ID.· Tap Finish.<p>3. Enable Lost Mode</p><ul style="list-style-type: none">· Open the Find My app, tap the Items tab, then tap your item.<p>· Under Lost Mode, tap Enable.</p><p>· Read the instructions, tap Continue and enter a phone number or email address.</p></div>	<div><ul style="list-style-type: none">· Confirm the information, customize the lost message, and tap Activate to complete the setup.<p>5. Remove the device</p><ul style="list-style-type: none">· Open the Find My app, tap the Items tab, then tap your item.</div>	<div><ul style="list-style-type: none">· Tap Remove Item and then tap Remove to complete the operation.<p>Note: After removing the device in the app, the device will beep and still in the pairing mode. If it's not re-pairing within 3 minutes, It's will emit 2 beeps and leave the pairing mode, and the device can't be paired at this time. If you need to pair the device again, you need to click the device button once, the device will ring and enters the pairing mode and can be re-paired again.</p></div>
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	<div><h3>Main Functions</h3><p>1. Locate your item If your missing item isn't nearby, the Find My app can still help you track it down using the Find My network — hundreds of millions of iPhone, iPad, and Mac devices around the world. Nearby devices securely send the location of your missing device to iCloud, then you can see where it is in the Find My app. It's all anonymous and encrypted to protect everyone's privacy.</p><p>2. Play Sound</p><ul style="list-style-type: none">· Open the Find My app, tap the Items tab, then tap your item.· Click Play Sound, and the device will beep, so you can find the item easily.</div>	<div><h3>Instructions for device button</h3><p>1. Power on the device Press the button once, the device will make a sound, and the device will turn on.</p><p>2. Device status confirmation If you double-click the device button, the device makes a beep sound, indicating that the device is working. If the device does not ring, the device is not powered on. Press the button once to turn it on.</p><p>3. The device enters the pairing state again After removing the device from the app, the device will beep, will not shut down, and will be in pairing mode. If it is not paired within 3 minutes, the device will leave the pairing state. If you need to pair devices at this point, click the device button once and the device beeps. At this point, the device enters the pairing state and can be paired with the app again.</p><p>4. Factory reset First, remove the item from Find My Apps, then after the device is powered on, Click button five times in a row, and hold it for the fifth time until the device make a sound. Release the button to complete the factory reset. The device can now be paired.</p></div>	<div><p>5. Power off When the device is powered on, long press the device button, the device will beep twice, and the device will power off.</p><p>FAQ:</p><p>1. When can the device be located? When an item is separated from its owner for a period of time, it can be found by other Apple devices that are part of the Find My network, and the owner can start to get the location of the device.</p><p>2. How is the device designed to discourage unwanted tracking? If any Find My network accessory separated from its owner is seen moving with you over time, you'll be notified in one of two ways:</p><ol style="list-style-type: none">1. If you have an iPhone, iPad, Find My will send a notification to your Apple device. This feature is available on iOS or iPadOS 14.5 or later.2. If you don't have an iOS device or a smartphone, a Find My network accessory that isn't with its owner for a period of time will emit a sound when it's moved. These features were created specifically to discourage people from trying to track you without your knowledge.</div>	<div><p>3. How is my privacy protected? Only you can see where your item is. Your location data and history are never stored on the item itself. Devices that relay the location of your item also stay anonymous, and that location data is encrypted every step of the way.</p><p>4. What is the Find My network? And how does it work? The Apple Find My network provides an easy, secure way to locate compatible personal items on a map using the Find My app on your iPhone, iPad, Mac, or the Find Items app on Apple Watch. Simply pair your compatible product with the Apple Find My app to view it right alongside your Apple devices. If your item ever goes missing, you can put it in Lost Mode to display a message and contact information to anyone who might find it. The Find My network is encrypted and anonymous, so no one else, not even Apple or JDA Card, can view its location.</p></div>	<div><h3>JDA Card</h3><p>Important tips: When pairing a device with Findmy app, the phone will link to the Apple server. Pairing may fail because of network problems. The following actions are recommended:</p><ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Change the phone's network, such as switching between WiFi and mobile network;2. Restore the device to factory Settings: After the device is powered on, press the key five times and hold it for the fifth time. Then the device emits a prompt sound. Release the button to complete the reset.3.
