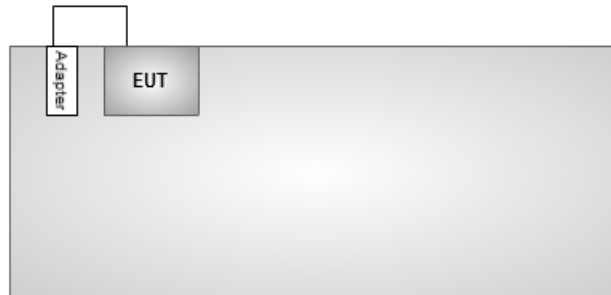

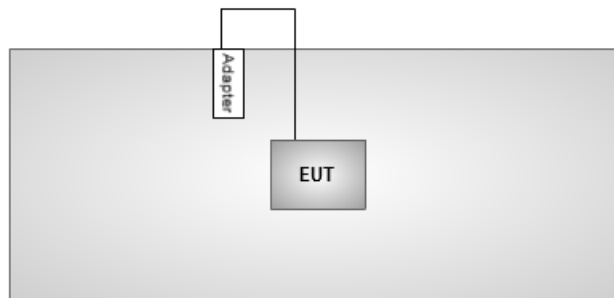

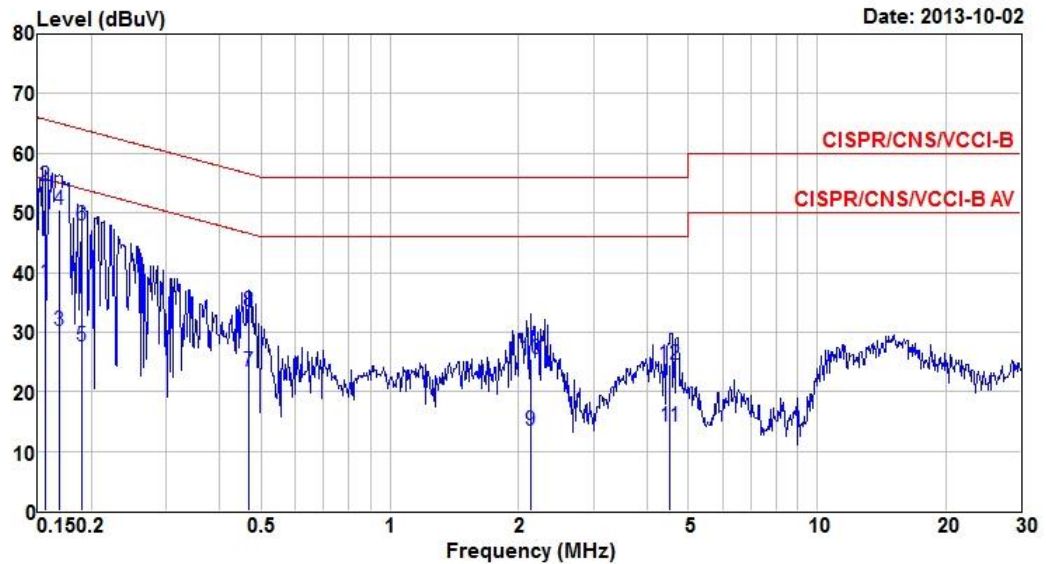

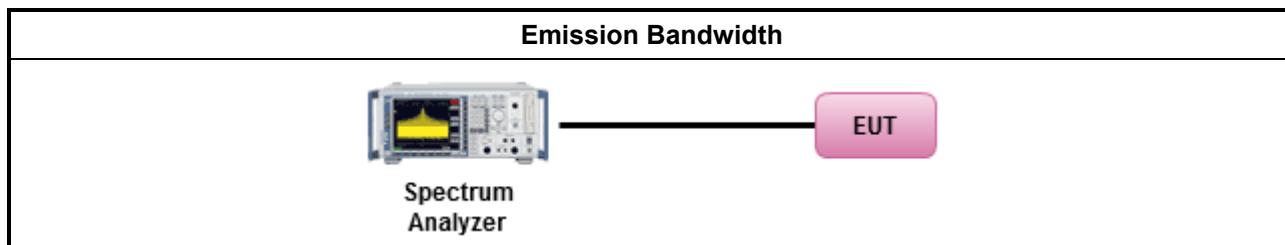

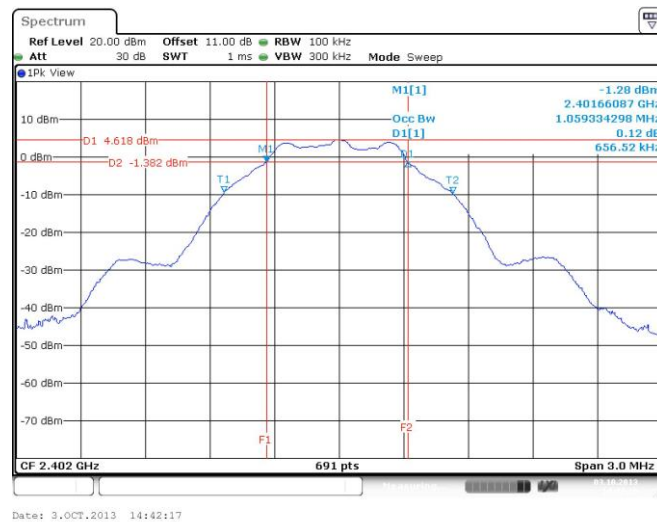

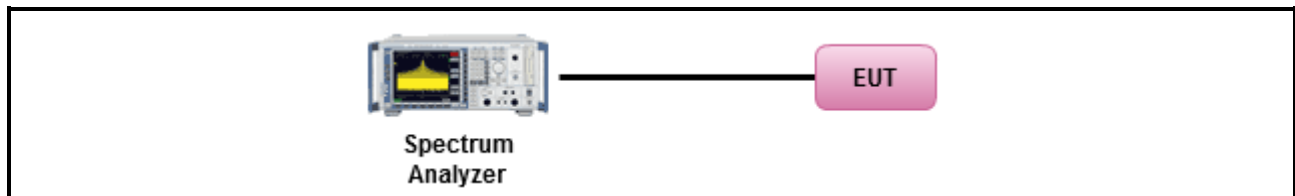

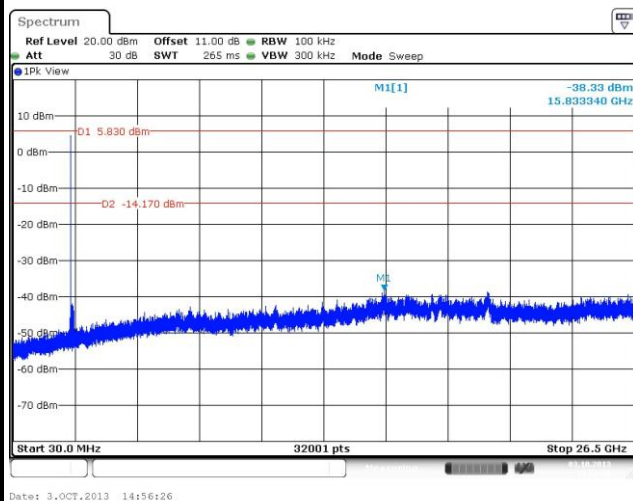
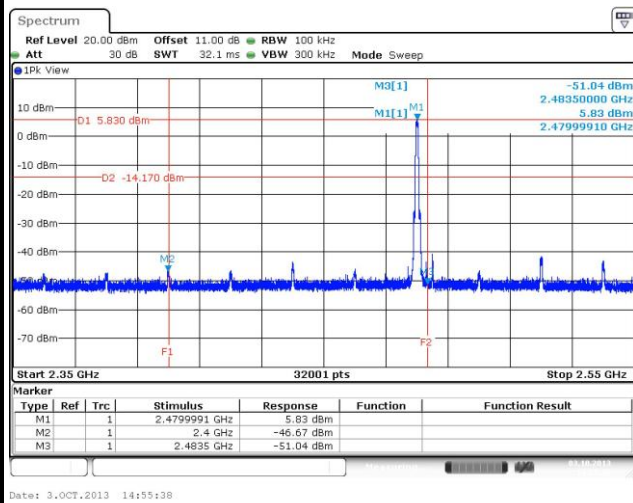


3.5.5 Test Result of Emissions in Non-Restricted Frequency Bands

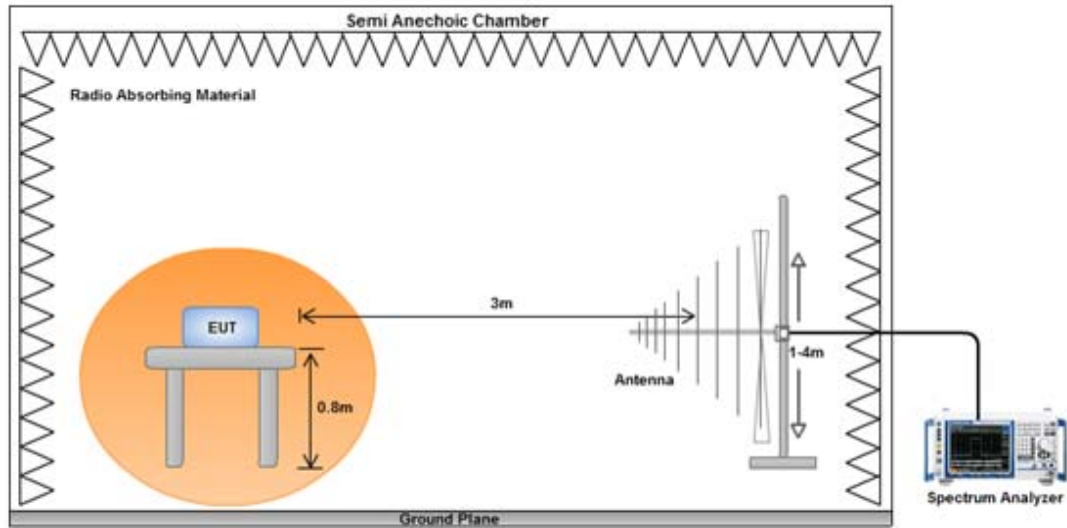

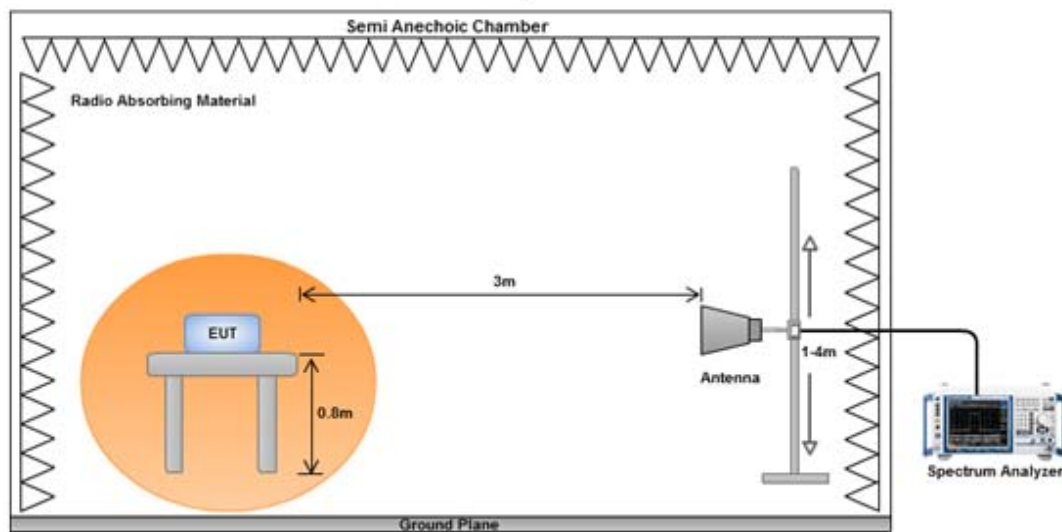

Radiated Emissions below 1 GHz



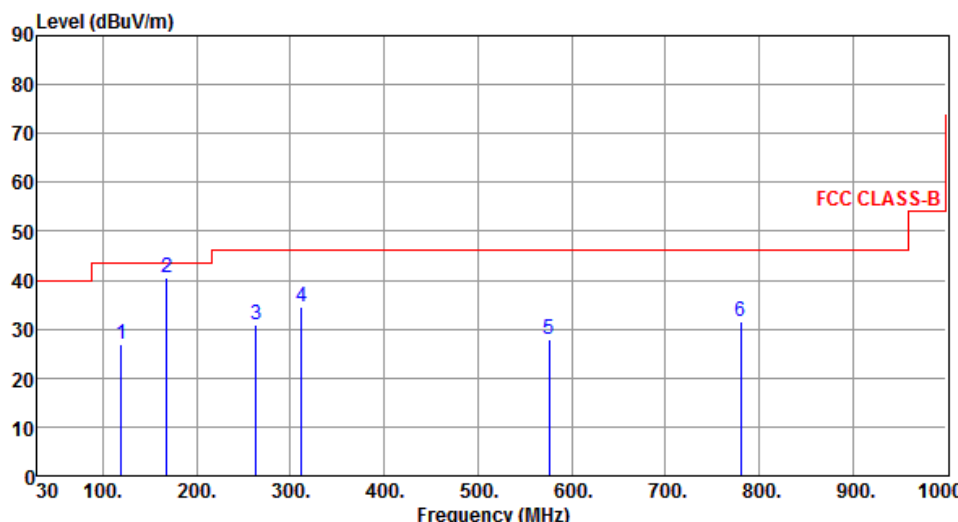
Radiated Emissions above 1 GHz
