



### Prediction of MPE limit at a given distance

Equation from page 18 of OET Bulletin 65, Edition 97-01

$$S = \frac{PG}{4\pi R^2}$$

where: S = power density

P = power input to the antenna

G = power gain of the antenna in the direction of interest relative to an isotropic radiator

R = distance to the center of radiation of the antenna

Maximum peak output power at antenna input terminal: 36.0 (dBm) \*

Maximum peak output power at antenna input terminal: 3981 (mW)

Antenna gain(maximum): 10.2 (dBi) \*

Maximum antenna gain: 10.47 (numeric)

Time Averaging: 100 (%) \*

Prediction distance: 200 (cm) \*

Prediction frequency: 150 (MHz) \*

MPE limit for uncontrolled exposure at prediction frequency: 0.200 (mW/cm<sup>2</sup>)

Power density at prediction frequency: 0.083 (mW/cm<sup>2</sup>)

This equates to: 0.83 W/m<sup>2</sup>
