#### 3. Test Results

#### 3.1 RF Power Output

**Standard** FCC Part 24, 10-01-98 Subpart E

The test was performed according to: FCC §2.1046 10-01-1998

#### 3.1.1 Test Description

- 1) The mobile station was coupled to the R&S Spectrum Analyser and a Digital Communication Tester through a Power Divider. Refer to chapter "Setup Drawings".
- 2) The total insertion losses for RF Path 1 and RF Path 2 were measured. The values were used to correct the readings from the R&S Spectrum Analyser and a Digital Communication Tester.
- 3) A speech call was established on a Traffic Channel (TCH) between the mobile station and the base station simulator. Important Settings:
- Discontinuous Transmission: OFF
- Modulation Signal: PSR16-1 (Pseudo Random Sequenz)
- Output Power: Varied during measurements
- Channel (Frequency): Varied during measurements
- 4) The transmitted power of the mobile station was recorded for all possible power control level by using an internal measurement function of a Digital Communication Tester.
- 5) During this test the Spectrum Analyser was only used to check if the results are comprehensible.

#### 3.1.2 Test Requirements / Limits

- §2.1046 Measurements Required: RF Power Output
- (a) For transmitters other than single sideband, independent sideband and controlled carrier radiotelephone, power output shall be measured at the RF output terminals when the transmitter is adjusted in accordance with the tune-up procedure to give the values of current and voltage on the circuit elements specified in § 2.1033(c)(8). The electrical characteristics of the output terminals when this test is made shall be stated.
- §24.232 Power and antenna height limits
- (b) Mobile/portable stations are limited to 2 watts e.i.r.p peak power and the equipment must employ means to limit the power to the minimum necessary for successful communications.
- (c) Peak transmit power must be measured over any interval of continuous transmission using instrumentation calibrated in terms of an rms-equivalent voltage. The measurement results shall be properly adjusted for any instrument limitations, such as detector response times, limited resolution



bandwidth capability when compared to the emission bandwidth, sensitivity, etc., so as to obtain a true peak measurement for the emission in question over the full bandwidth of the channel.






Drawing 1 : Setup for conducted measurements under nominal conditions (in principle)



Annex I: Emissions and Occupied bandwidth - Measurement plots











1) The EUT was placed inside the climatic chamber.

- 2) The EUT was coupled to the R&S CMD55 / CMU200 Digital Communication Tester. Refer to chapter "Setup Drawings".
- 3) The climatic chamber was cycled down/up to a certain temperature, starting with  $-30^{\circ}$ C.




Photo 2: Setup for radiated tests






Photo 3: Setup for conducted tests (setup 01s140a02)






**Photo 4:** Setup for conducted tests (setup 01s140a03, GSM module mounted to development board)







**Drawing 2:** Principle setup for conducted measurements under nominal conditions




**Drawing 3:** Principle setup for tests under extreme test conditions





Test: Occupied bandwidth, Channel 128 (824.2 MHz)



Test: Emissions bandwidth (26 dB bandwidth), Channel 190 (836.6 MHz)



Test: Occupied bandwidth, Channel 190 (836.6 MHz)


