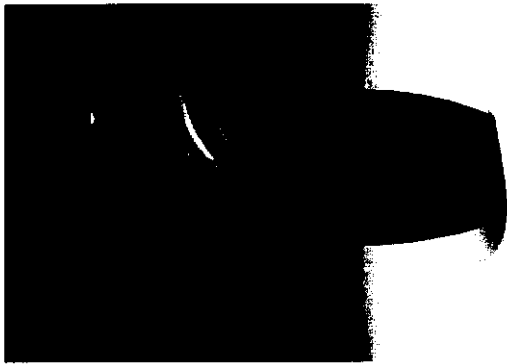

CONGRATULATIONS

You now have at your fingertips the most advanced personal security system on any college campus.

To Transmit an ALARM

1. Hold the *My911*[™] transmitter away from your body.
2. Press both buttons together and hold!
3. The green light located on the top of the *My911*[™] transmitter will blink rapidly while the alarm is being acknowledged by the Campus-911[™] System.

To TEST your *My911*[™] Transmitter

1. Press either button on your *My911*[™] transmitter until the green light located on the top of the transmitter turns on. Then release the button.
2. Next press the other button until the green light goes off.
3. A successful test will be indicated by the green light blinking several times.
4. An unsuccessful test should be retried.
5. If a TEST cannot be successfully completed. Your *My911*[™] transmitter might not be working. Take your transmitter to the campus security office.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL USERS OF THE CAMPUS-911[™] SYSTEM

- The Campus-911[™] System is NOT a substitute for safe behavior. Users of the system should not take personal risks under the misconception that the Campus-911[™] System will provide protection that will compensate for taking such risks.
- Before letting anyone handle your transmitter, be sure to inform them that it is an emergency communications device which, when activated, transmits your identity to the campus police office. An officer will be dispatched to the location of the *My911*[™] transmitter when it is activated.
- As with all radio equipment, the signal strength from your *My911*[™] Personal Transmitter will be reduced by metal and wet surfaces, and to some extent by the human body. To ensure proper operation of the device during an ALARM, hold the device in one hand, away from your body and other objects, press both buttons together and hold. In a vehicle, hold the transmitter close to a window when activating.
- Check with the campus police to verify the exact areas of the campus that are protected by the Campus-911[™] System and the areas that are not.

QUESTIONS FREQUENTLY ASKED BY USERS OF CAMPUS-911™ SYSTEM

1) Under what circumstances should I activate an ALARM?

Use your *My911*™ transmitter to send an ALARM only when you are in danger, seriously injured, or feel threatened. Your *My911*™ transmitter is an emergency communication device and should not be used for routine communications with the campus police department.

2) What happens when I transmit an ALARM?

Transmitting an ALARM alerts a computer located in the campus police department that you require emergency assistance. A display on the computer screen indicates your identity and location, so that an officer can be dispatched to assist you.

3) What happens when I test the *My911*™ transmitter?

During a TEST a radio transmission is sent from your *My911*™ transmitter to the Campus-911™ System. The system records the TEST and confirms a successful TEST by sending a radio transmission back to your *My911*™ transmitter. The flashing green light on top of your *My911*™ transmitter confirms that the system is working properly and has heard the TEST signal. If you do not see the green light flash, the TEST was not successful.

4) What should I do if I do not get a flashing green light when I perform a TEST?

We suggest that you try the TEST again to eliminate the possibility that somehow the buttons did not get pressed properly. In the event that you TEST the *My911*™ transmitter again and you do not see the green light flash, you should promptly take your *My911*™ transmitter to the campus police department where it can be exchanged.

5) How often should I TEST my *My911*™ transmitter?

We suggest testing your device daily.

6) Do I have to be in sight of a Campus-911™ Receiver to TEST my *My911*™ transmitter?

No. Your *My911*™ transmitter can be tested anywhere inside the defined coverage area on the campus.

7) Do I have to be in sight of a Campus-911™ Receiver to activate an ALARM?

No. Your *My911*™ transmitter can send an ALARM anywhere inside the defined coverage area on the campus.

8) What happens if I lose my *My911*™ transmitter?

In the event your *My911*™ transmitter is lost or stolen, report the incident immediately to the campus police department. A replacement *My911*™ transmitter can be issued and the original device deactivated from the system.

9) Can my roommate and I share a personal transmitter?

No, your *My911*™ transmitter is assigned specifically to you and is for your use only. It should not be transferred, loaned, or shared with another individual.

10) What happens if someone else sets off an ALARM with my *My911*™ transmitter?

Assuming you have not reported the transmitter lost or stolen, the Campus-911™ System will function normally and the campus police will respond to the location of the *My911*™ transmitter reported on their computer map. They will of course be looking for you.

11) If I am in danger and have initiated an alarm, should I keep pushing the buttons?

No. Once an ALARM is activated the *My911*™ transmitter location will be continuously updated on the police department's computer map until the police arrive.

12) Are all areas of the campus covered by the Campus-911™ System?

An insert has been placed in this User's Guide showing the coverage of the Campus-911™ System on the campus.

13) Approximately how long will battery in my *My911*™ transmitter last?

Assuming normal usage (such as daily testing), it will last approximately two years. If the battery is weak, a special signal is sent to the police department during a TEST. TESTs will not produce a flashing on the green light if the battery is weak.

14) What if I accidentally get the *My911*™ transmitter wet?

The *My911*™ transmitter is designed to be water resistant, and chances are it will not be affected by moisture. Nevertheless, you should TEST your transmitter a few times (several hours apart) after it has been exposed to moisture to verify it is working properly.

15) What should I do if I accidentally set off an ALARM?

STAY WHERE YOU ARE!

Wait for the campus police to respond to your alarm. Explain that you inadvertently set off your transmitter and make it clear that you are not experiencing an emergency.

16) What are my rights and responsibilities as a system user?

Your rights and responsibilities are set forth in your copy of the User Agreement you signed when you received your *My911*[™] transmitter.
