Subject: Letter of Confidentiality Request for the ODYDOREO9 MOSAIC

Dear Reviewer,

Datamatic, LTD. (Datamatic), requests that the Schematic, Block Diagram and Operational Description (Theory of Operation) exhibits of the application for FCC ID: ODYDOREO9 be withheld permanently from routine availability for public inspection pursuant to Section 0.459 of the Commissions Rules and Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Exemption 4, 5 U.S.C. 552 (b) (4).

These particular exhibits consist of "trade secrets (or) commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential" 5 U.S.C 552 (b) (4), and are therefore entitled to protection from disclosure under the FOIA. The documents in question contain trade secrets: detailed technical descriptions, specifications, and schematics for a product offered for sale. This proprietary information would give Datamatic's competitors an unearned competitive advantage.

The documents contain "commercial information" within the scope of FOIA exemption 4. This information is the product of Datamatic's investment of money, personnel, and other resources. The result of the investment is a fairly earned position in the marketplace. Premature release of the information threatens substantial and unwarranted harm to Datamatic's competitive position.

For these reasons, Datamatic has taken pains to keep this technical information confidential and intends to continue doing so. Datamatic customarily withholds rights to this information, granting access only to those who have a particular approved need for the information. Datamatic grants the Commission their needed access to these documents, but respectfully asks that the information be kept confidential.
