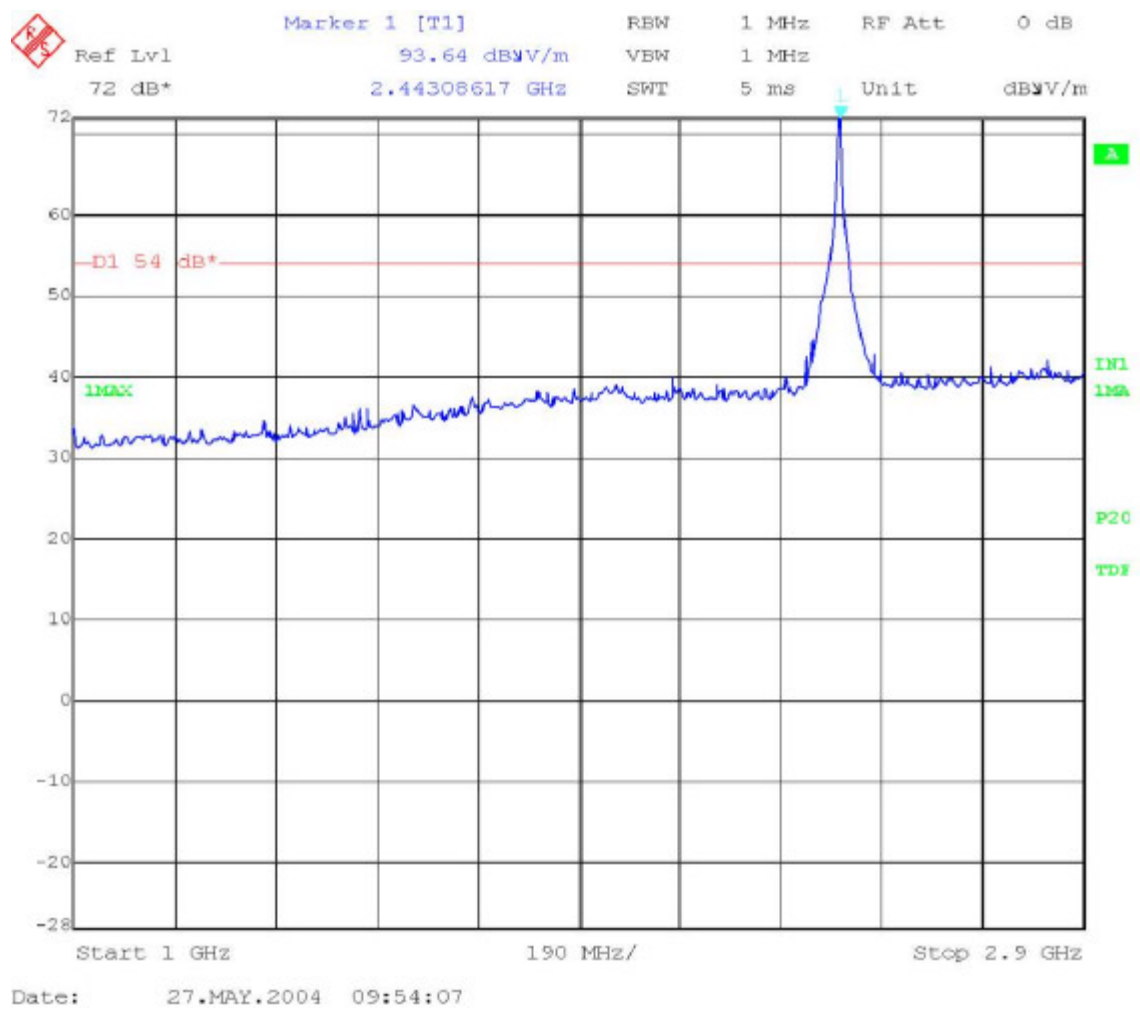


CHANNEL: Middle (2441 MHz).



Note: The peak above the limit is the carrier frequency.

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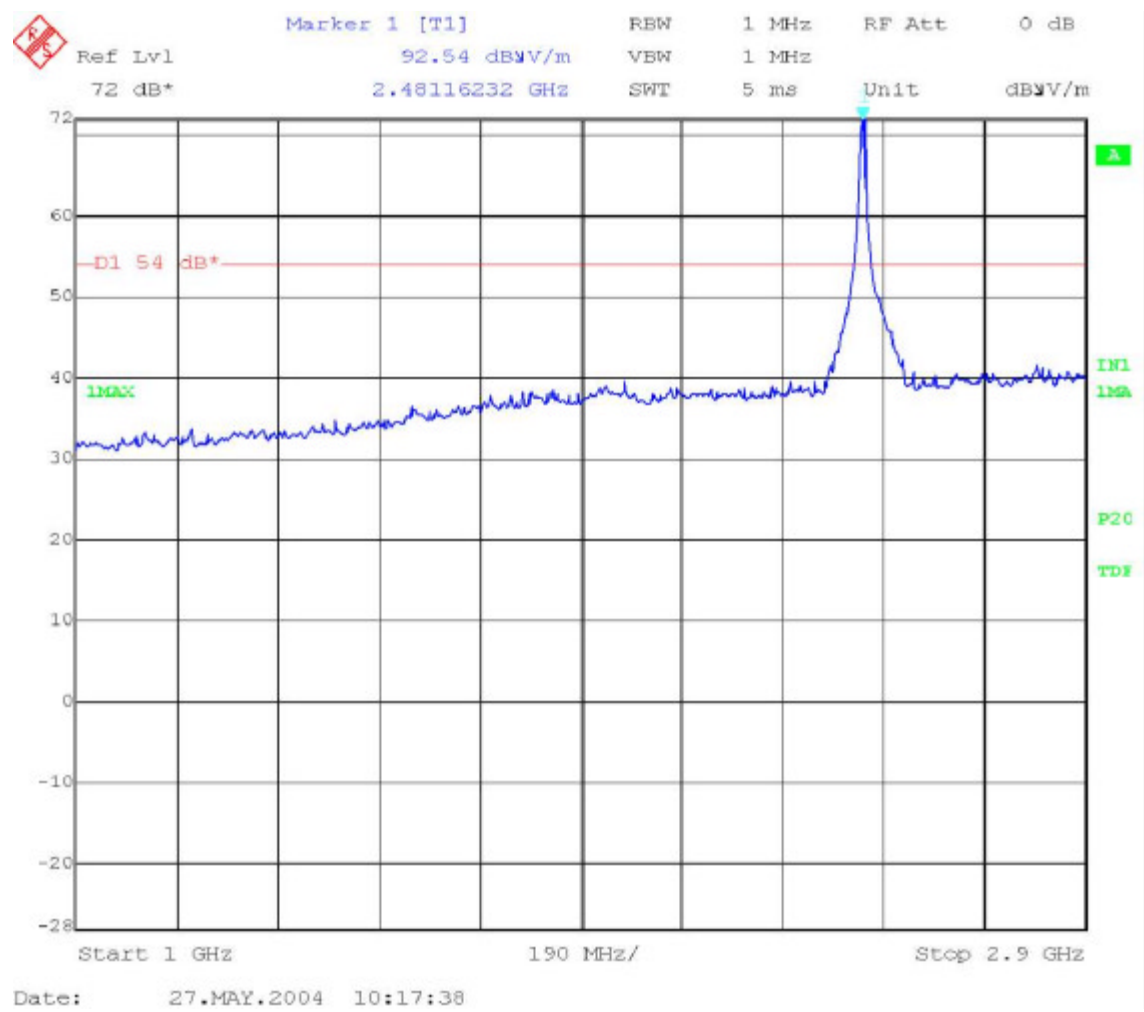
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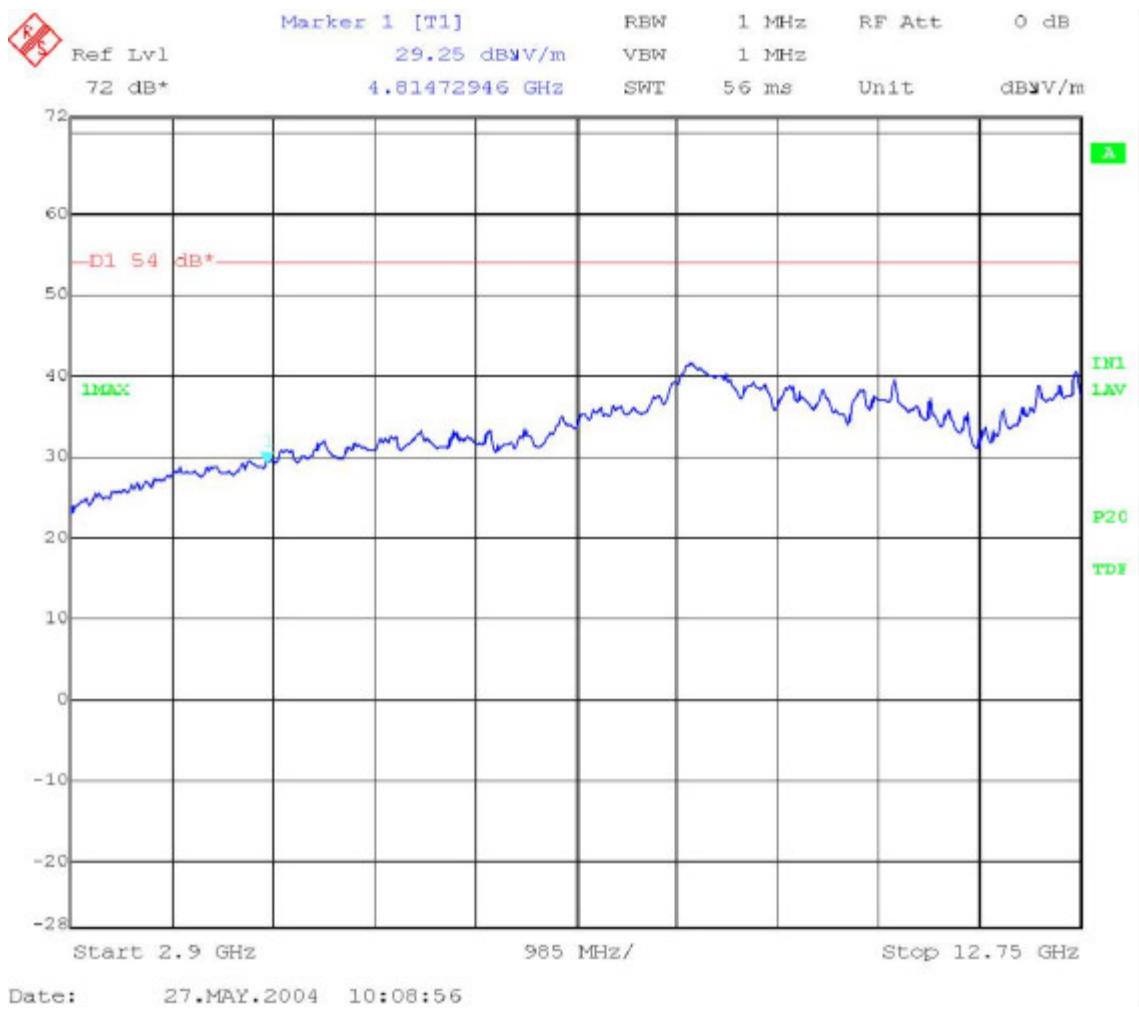
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CHANNEL: Highest (2480 MHz).

CHANNEL: Lowest (2402 MHz).



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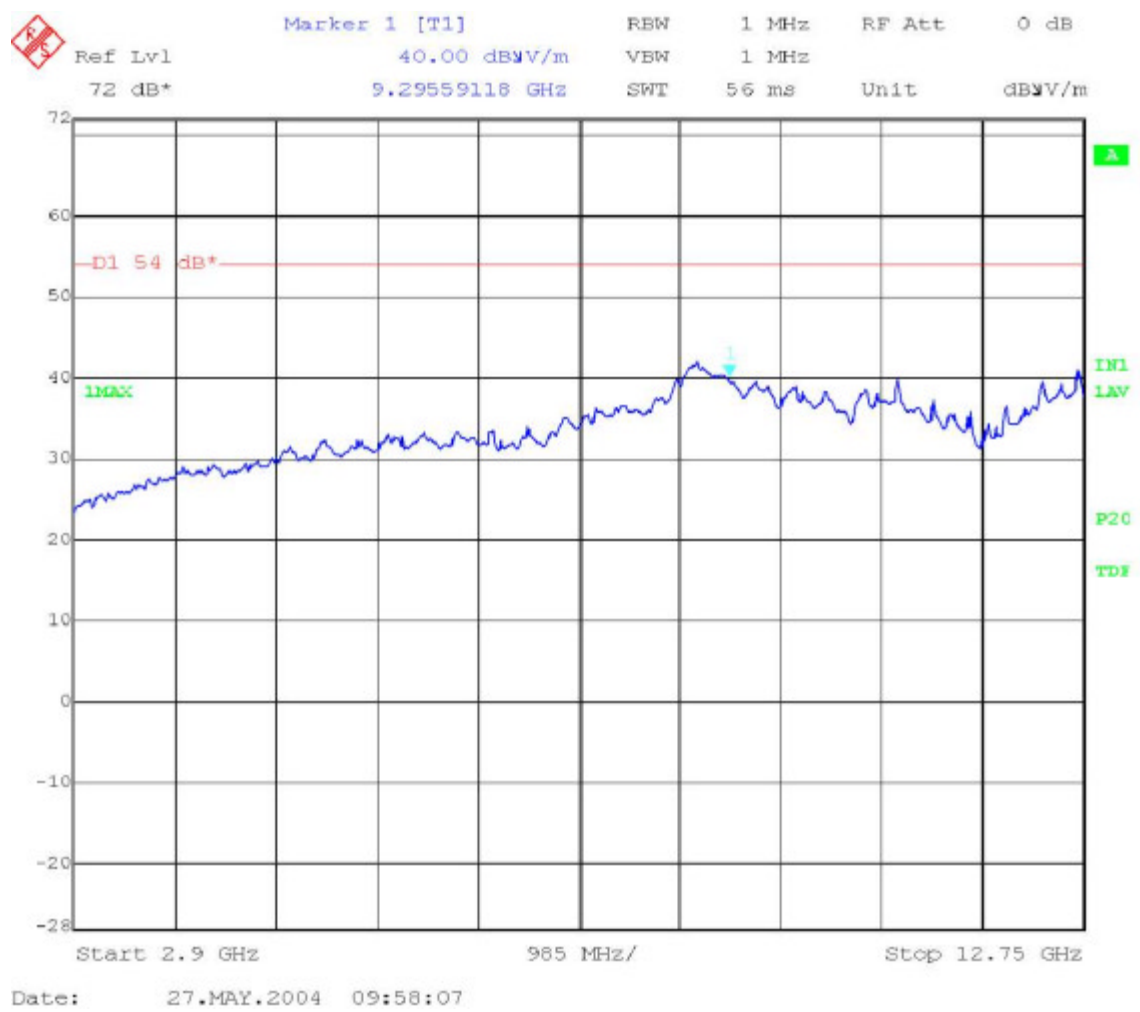
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CHANNEL: Middle (2441 MHz).



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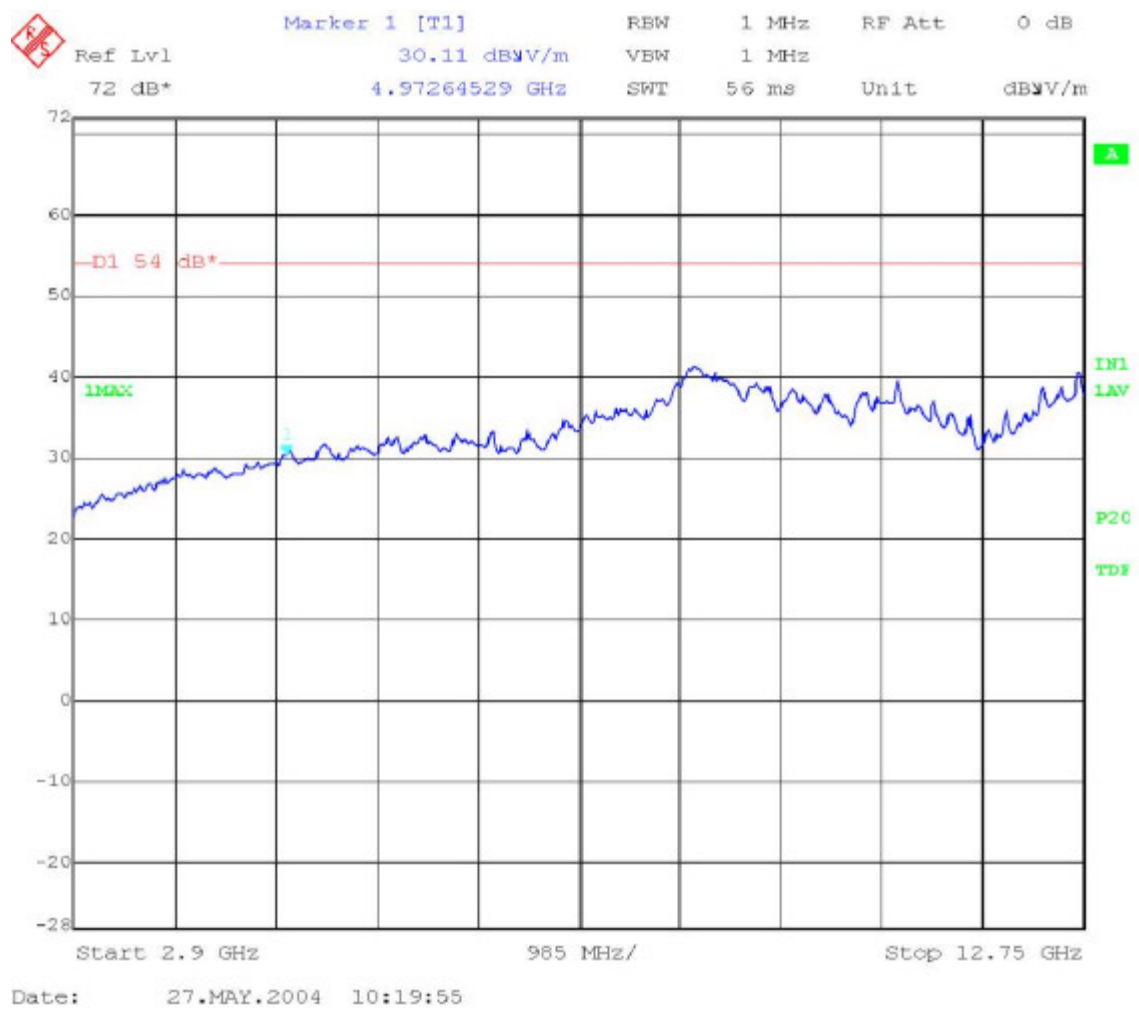
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CHANNEL: Highest (2480 MHz).



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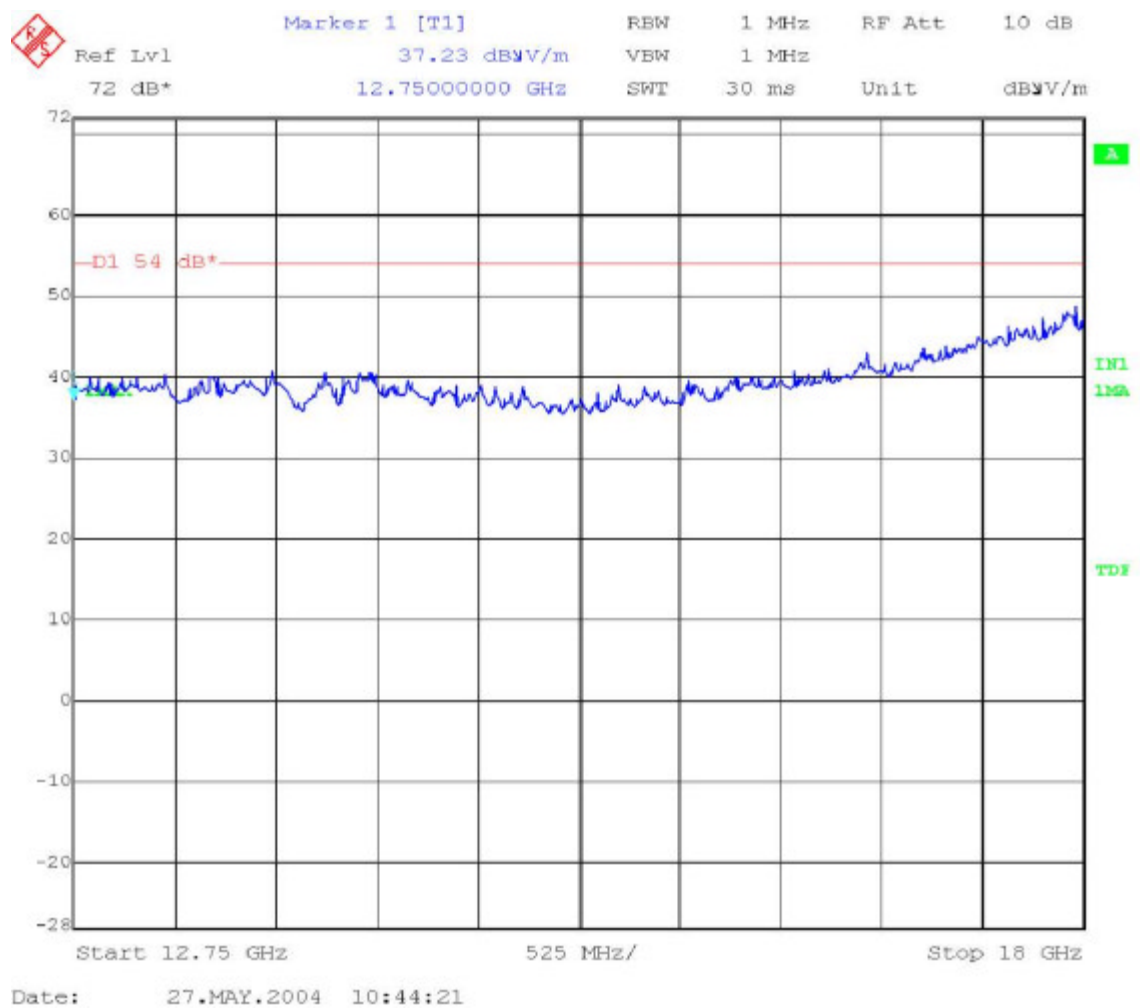
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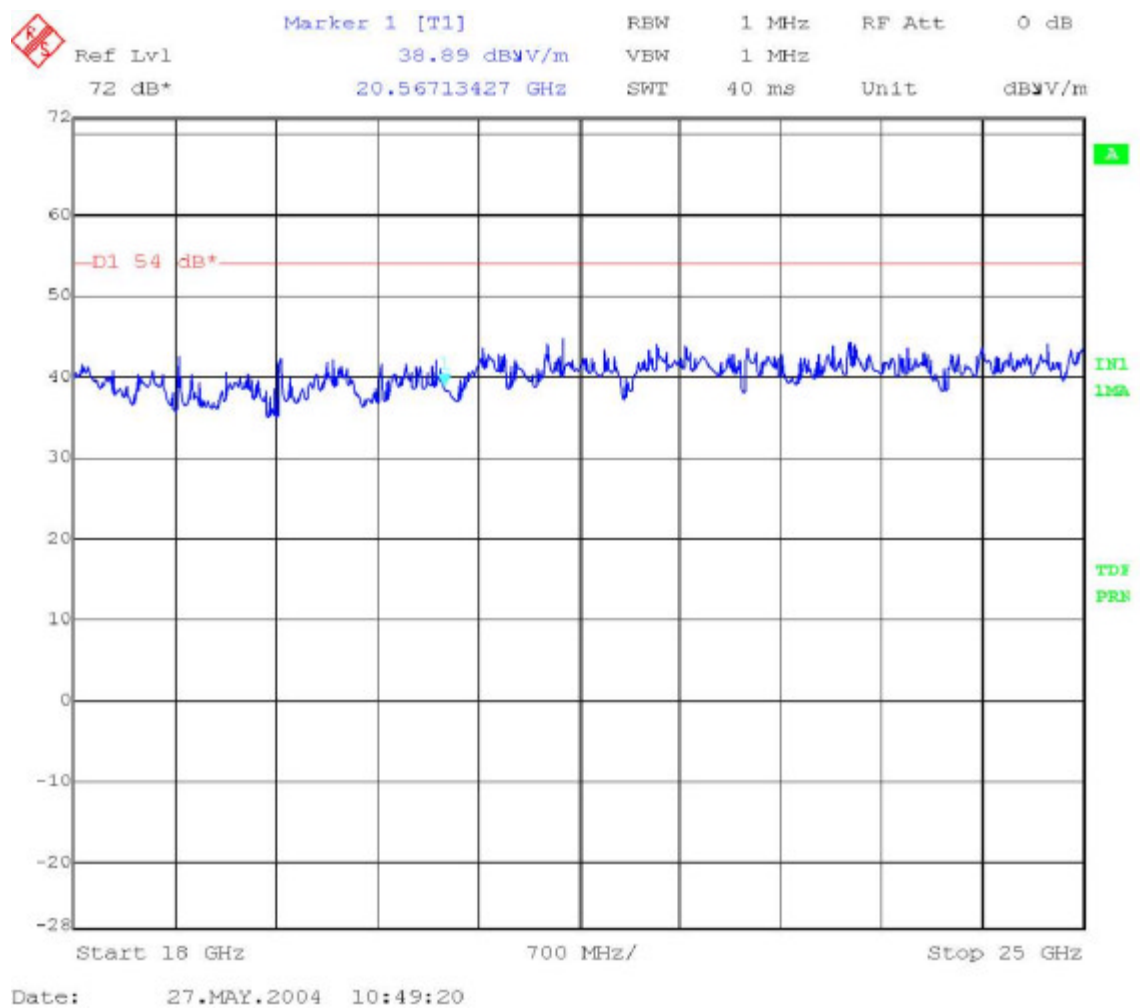
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FREQUENCY RANGE 12.75 GHz to 18 GHz.

SPECIFICATION

The field strength shall not exceed the following values:

The emission limits shown in the above table are based on measurements employing CISPR quasi-peak detector except for the frequency bands 9-90 kHz, 110-490 kHz and above 1000 MHz. Radiated emission limits in these three bands are based on measurements employing an average detector.

For average radiated emission measurements above 1000 MHz, there is also a limit corresponding to 20 dB above the indicated values in the table is specified when measuring with peak detector function.

RESULTS:

The situation and orientation was varied to find the maximum radiated emission. It was also rotated 360° and the antenna height was varied from 1 to 4 meters to find the maximum radiated emission.

Measurements were made in both horizontal and vertical planes of polarization.

All tests were performed in a semi-anechoic chamber at a distance of 3 m for the frequency range 30 MHz-1000 MHz and at distance of 1m for the frequency range 1 GHz-25 GHz.

The field strength is calculated by adding correction factor to the measured level from the spectrum analyzer. This correction factor includes antenna factor, cable loss and pre-amplifiers gain.

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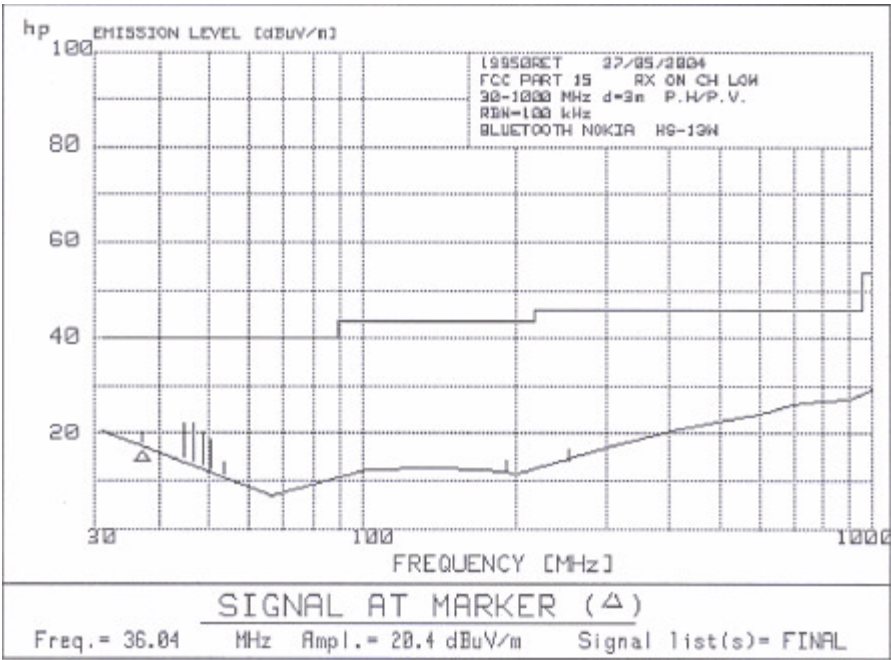
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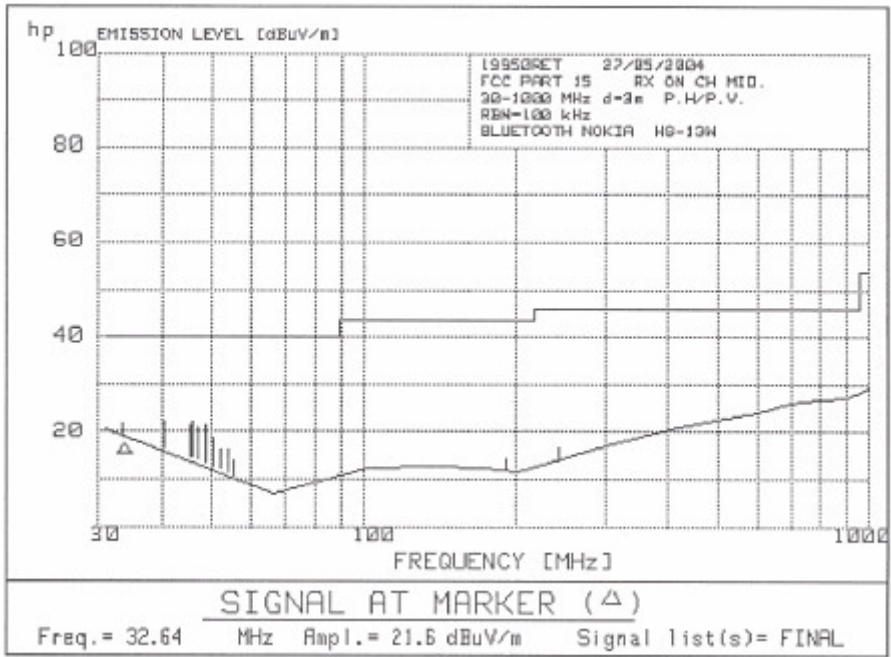

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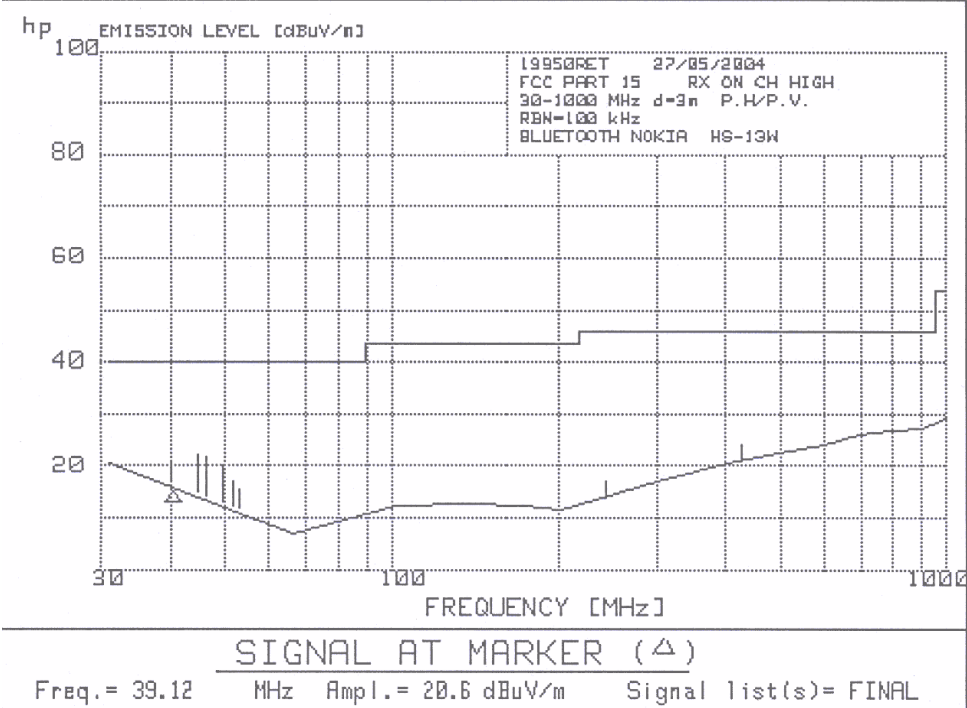

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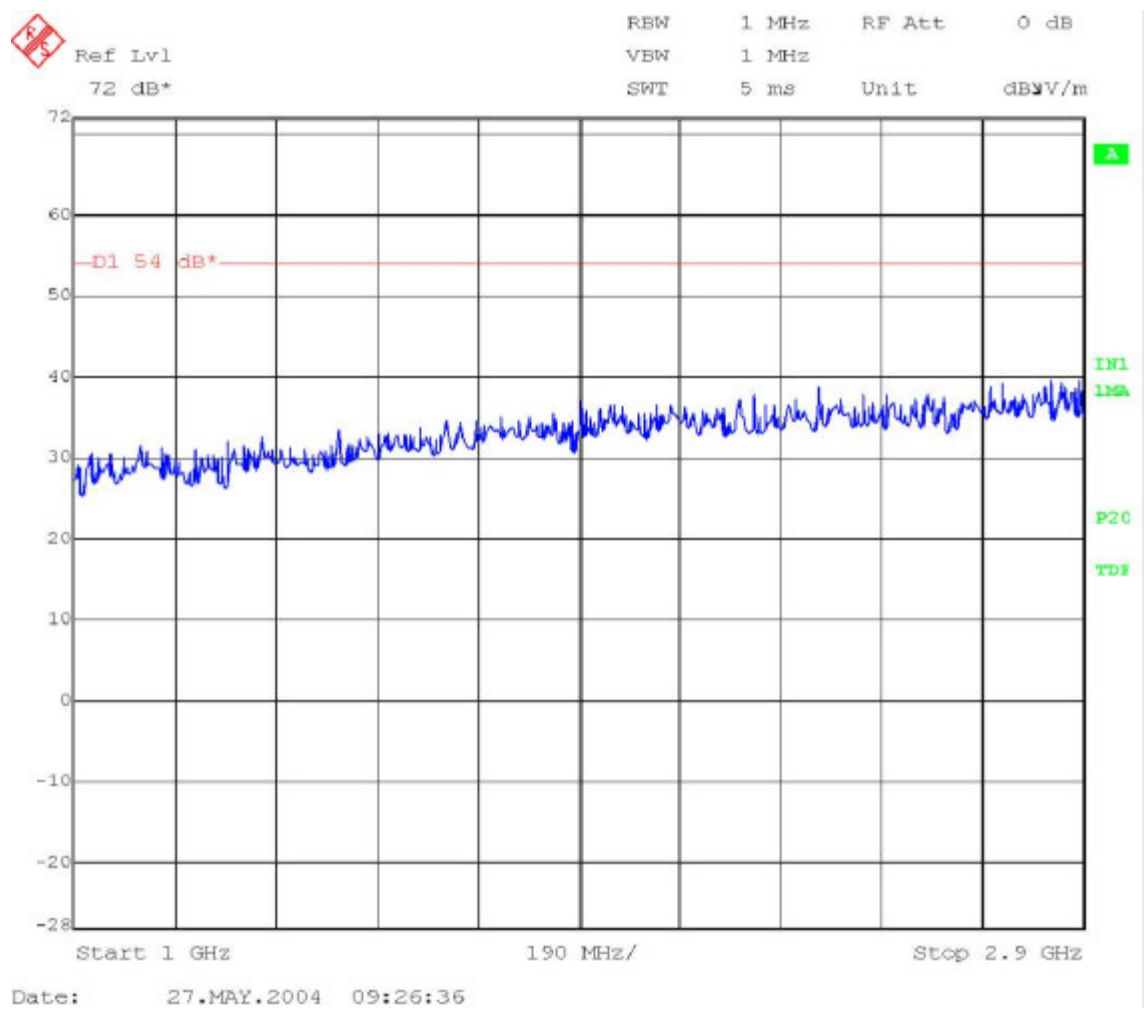
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FREQUENCY RANGE 1 GHz-2.9 GHz.

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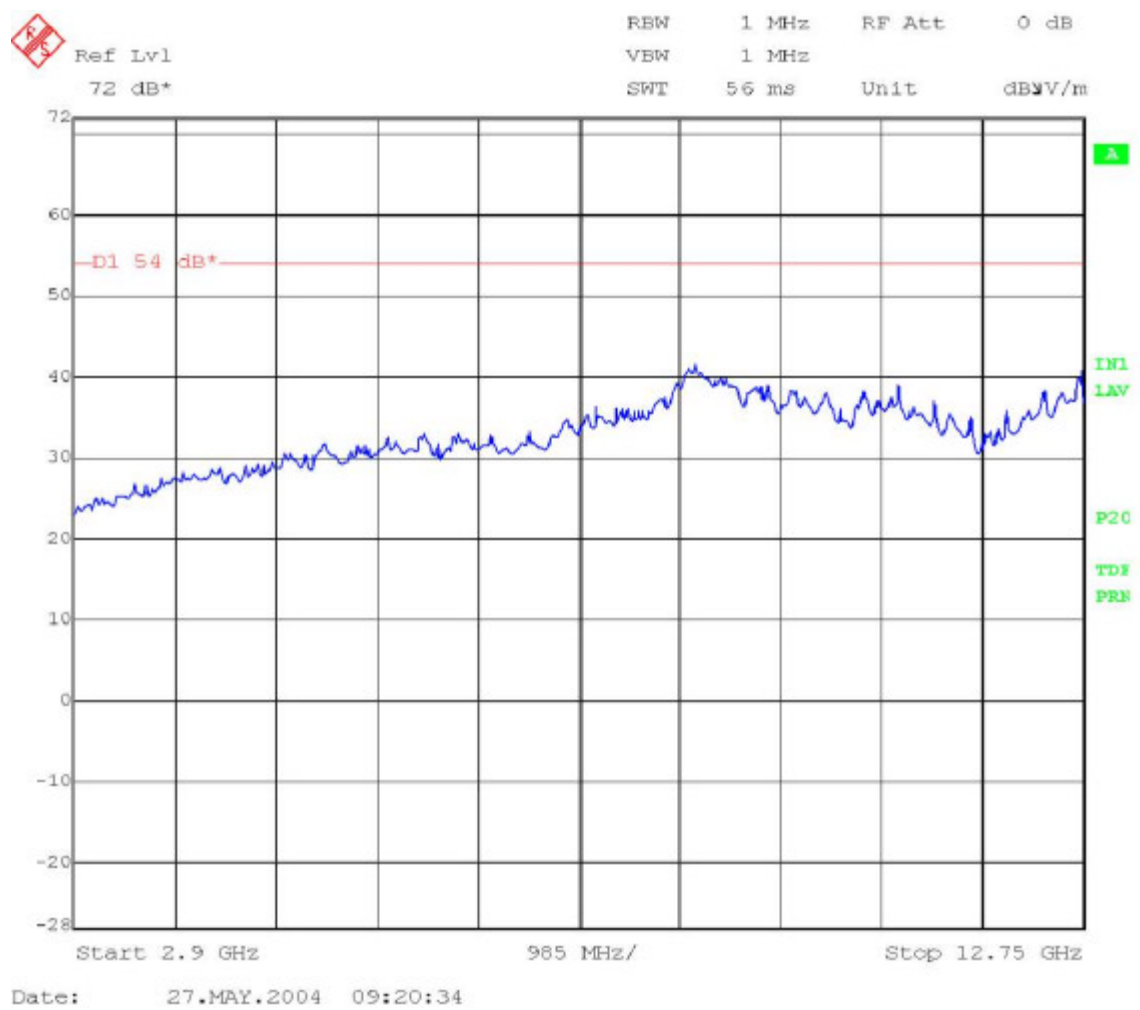
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FREQUENCY RANGE 2.9 GHz-12.75 GHz.

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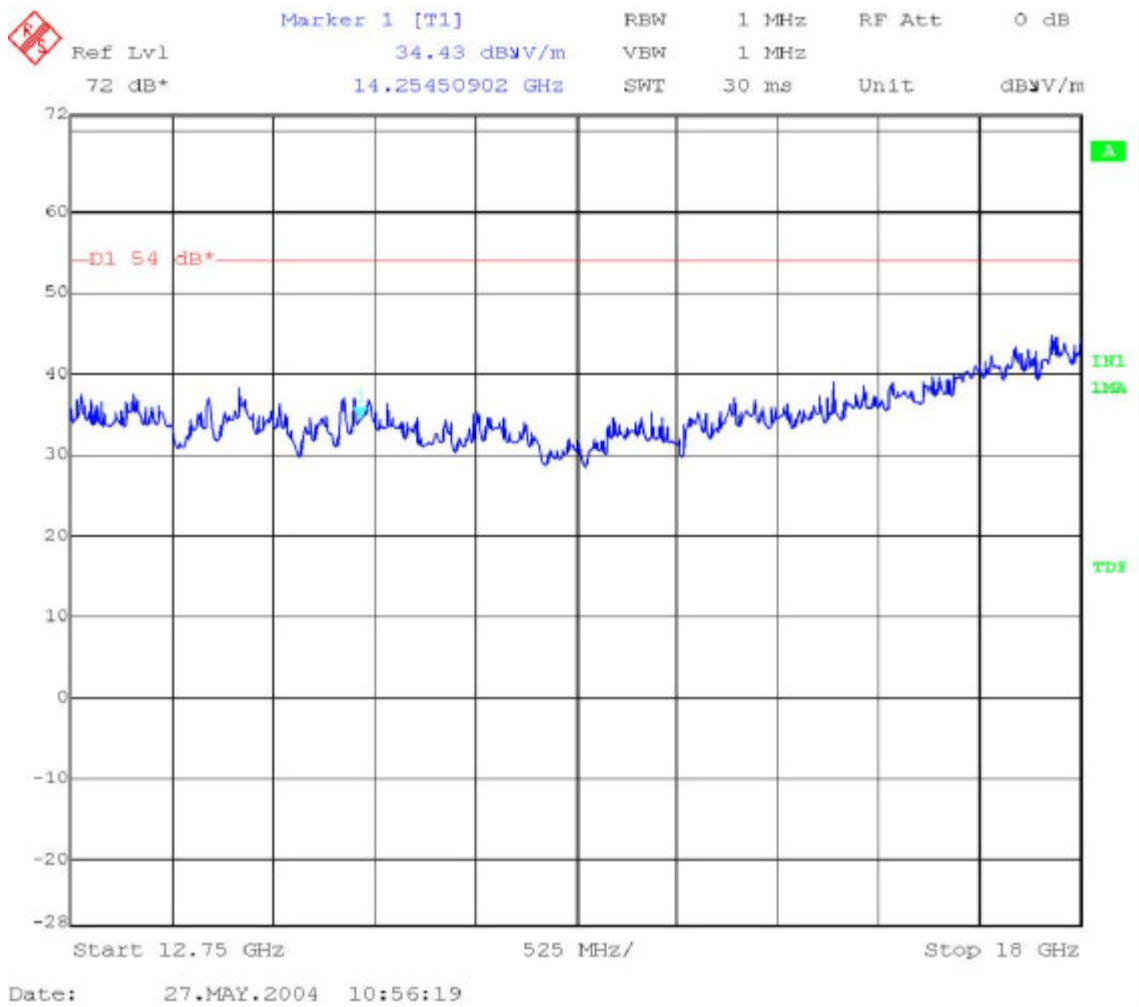
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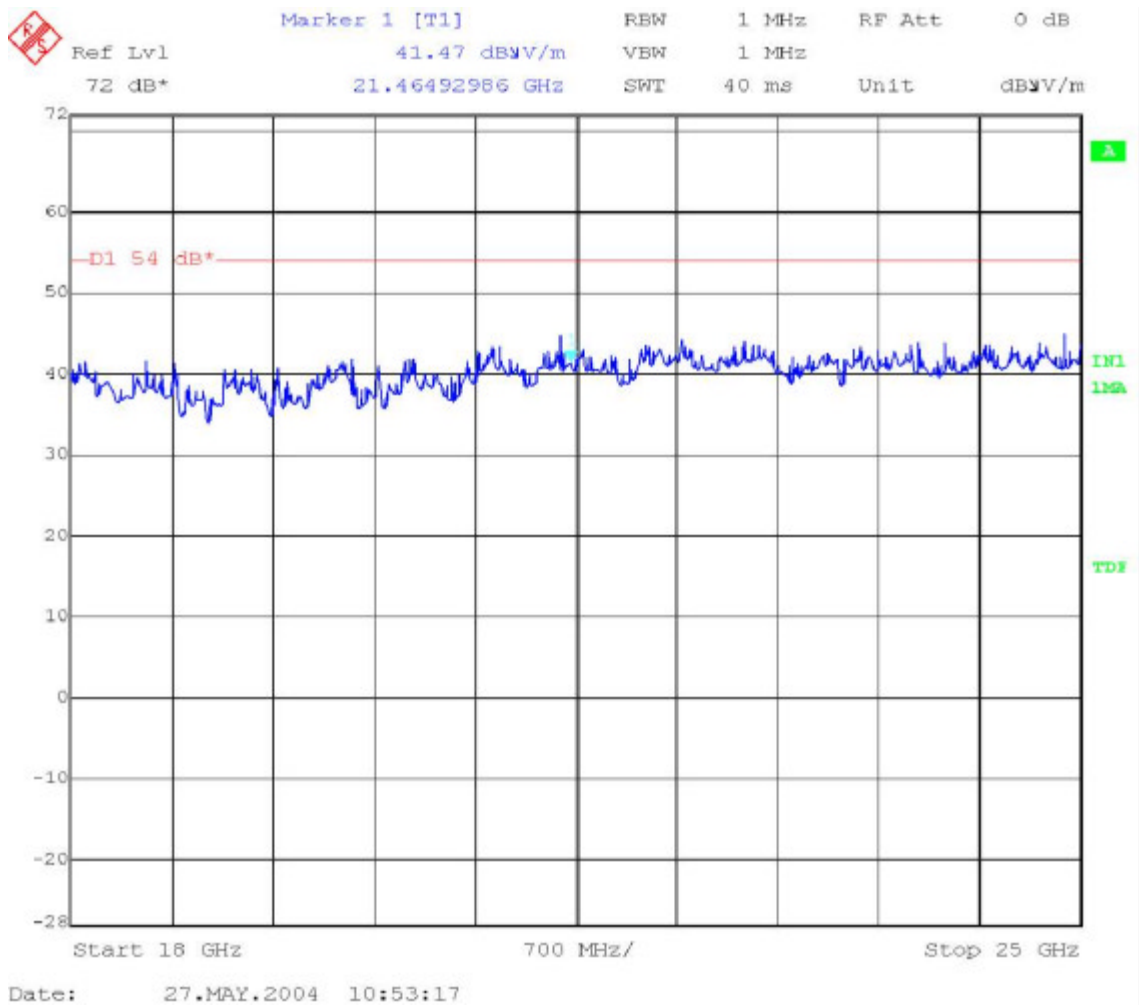
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FREQUENCY RANGE 12.75 GHz-18 GHz.
