




Removing the Back Cover and the Battery Cover




Charging the Battery

Before charging the battery ensure that it is installed in your

phone. Do not use a damaged battery or charger.

- 1. Connect the charger to a power outlet.
- 2. Connect the charger to the phone's charger connector.
- Wait until the battery is fully charged When the battery is charging, the charging icon scrolls. When the charging icon stops blinking, the battery is fully charged.
- 4. Unplug the charger from the power outlet.
- 5. Disconnect the charger from the phone.

2 Text Input

Entering English

Predictive English Input Mode (En)

- Press each number key once according to the spelling of the desired word. The phone displays possible words based on the keystroke sequence.
- Select the desired word, and press Confirm key or 0 key to enter the word.
- Press 1 key to enter a full stop or another commonly used symbol. Press * key to display the symbol list. Then select and enter a symbol.



- The current input mode indicator is displayed in the upper left corner
 of the screen. Press * key to change the input mode.
- On the main menu screen, select Settings > Phone > Text input
 settings > Predictive input to enable or disable predictive input mode.

When this mode is disabled, you can only enter English words in multitap English mode.

Multi-Tap English Input Mode (Abc)

Each number key displays letters. Press the number key once to enter the first letter displayed on the key, twice to enter the second letter, and so on.

Entering Numbers

- In 123 input mode, press the number key labeled with your desired number.
- In Abc input mode, repeatedly press the desired number key until the number appears on the screen.
- In En input mode, press the desired number key. Then use Navigation keys to scroll to the number and press Confirm key to enter it.
- In any text input mode, except the 123 input mode, press and hold a number key to enter the number.

Entering a Symbol

- 1. In any text input mode, press * key to display the symbol list.
- Use Navigation keys to scroll to the desired symbol, and press Confirm key to enter the symbol.



- In En and Abc mode, press the 0 key once to enter a space, twice to start a new line, and three times to enter 0.
- In Abc mode, repeatedly press the 1 key to enter the commonly used

symbols. In **En** mode, press the **1 key** to display the commonly used symbols list.

3 Emergency Settings

Setting an Emergency Number

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Emergency** for the following options.

- Contact 1: Set the number of emergency contact 1.
- Contact 2: Set the number of emergency contact 2.
- Number: Set an emergency number.
- **SMS**: Set the content of the emergency message.

Making an Emergency Call

You can set two emergency contacts and one emergency number on the phone. After an emergency contact or number is set, press and hold **0 key** to make an emergency call.

If the emergency contacts and number are set, when you press and hold **0 key**:

- The phone calls Contact 1 and sends the emergency message to Contact 1.
- If the call to Contact 1 cannot be connected, the phone automatically calls and sends an emergency message to Contact 2.
- If the call to Contact 2 cannot be connected, the phone automatically dials Number.

4 Voice Services

Making a Call

Dialing a Number Using the Keypad

- In standby mode, press the number keys to enter a phone number.
 - To make an international call, press * key twice to enter the international long-distance code (+). Then enter the country or region code, area code, and phone number.
 - To call an extension number, enter the switchboard number, press * key three times to insert P or four times to insert W, and then enter the extension number.
- 2. Press Call key to dial the number.
- 3. Press End key or select End to end the call.

Dialing from Contacts

Select **Menu** > **Contacts**, select a contact, and press **Call key** to make a call.

Dialing from Call Logs

Select **Menu** > **Call log** or press **Call key** to select the required number from call logs. Then press **Call key** to dial the number.

Answering a Call

When there is an incoming call, press **Call key** to answer or press **End key** to reject it.

· If the any-key answer function is enabled, you can press any

- key except **End key** and **Right soft key** to answer an incoming call.
- If the headset auto-answer function is enabled and the headset is connected to the phone, incoming calls will be answered automatically.

5 Contacts

Adding a Contact

- Select Menu > Contacts > Create contact.
- Enter the contact information (at least one number for each contact).
- 3. Select Save to save the contact.

Searching for a Contact

- 1. Select Menu > Contacts.
- Enter the contact's name in the text box. The phone automatically lists the contacts that match the search information you enter.

6 Messaging

Creating and Sending a Message

- Select Menu > Messages > Create message.
- Enter one or more recipient's numbers directly, or press Confirm key to access the contact list and then select one or multiple recipients.
- 3. Enter the message text in the text box. Press Confirm key to

add a picture, video, audio, or slide to the message. Doing so automatically enters MMS mode.

Select Options > Send to send the message.



Your phone supports a maximum multimedia message size of 290 KB.

Fmail

Creating an Email Account

Before sending or receiving an email, you must create an email account. You are prompted to do so the first time you open the Email application.

- Select Menu > Email, and then select Yes to create an email account.
- 2 Select the desired server from the email server list.
- 3. On the setup wizard screens, enter email account information.
- 4. Select **Done**. The email account is now created and the account name is displayed in the email menu.
- 5. When you want to create another email account, select Email > Settings > Account management > Create account.



The server parameters are automatically set on the preset server. You only need to enter the correct email address, user name, and password.

Creating and Sending an Email

Select Email, and select the account you created.

- 2. Select Create to create an email.
- Enter the recipient's email address, subject, and contents in the corresponding text box.
- On the email editing screen, select **Options** > **Send** to send the email.

Receiving an Email

- 1. Select Menu > Email > Get new emails.
- By default, only the email heading (sender, theme, and send time) is received. To download the email content, select Options > Download.



To change the download mode, select an email account, and then select Account settings > Download settings.

7 Media Applications

Taking a Photo

- 1. Select Menu > Multimedia > Camera.
- On the viewfinder screen, select **Options** to access the camera settings.
- Frame the picture you want to take on the viewfinder screen.Press Confirm key to take a photo.
- Your photo is automatically saved to the photo folder of the default storage that you have selected.

Recording a Video

- Select Menu > Multimedia > Camera > Options > Shooting mode to switch the camera to the video camera.
- On the viewfinder screen, select Options for the video camera settings.
- Press Confirm key to start recording. Select Pause/Continue to pause or continue. Select **Stop** to stop recording.
- 4. Your video is automatically saved to the video folder of the storage that you have selected.

Music Player

Adding a Playlist

- Select Menu > Multimedia > Music player.
- Select Options > Media library > Playlist.
- 3. Select Options > Create to create a new playlist. Open the playlist and select Add to add songs to the playlist.



You can also select Menu > File mgmt to select a track to play.

Plaving Music

When a track is playing:

- Press Confirm key to pause the track. Press it again to resume playing.
- Press Right navigation key to play the next track. Press and hold **Right navigation key** to fast-forward the track.

- Press Left navigation key to play the previous track. Press and hold Left navigation key to rewind the track.
- Select Options > Exit to exit the media player.



Note

When a track is playing, select Minimize or press End key to minimize the media player screen. The media player will run in the background and the track will continue to play.

Plaving a Video

- In standby mode, select Menu > Multimedia > Video player.
- Select Options, then All videos or Playlist to access a video list
- 3. Use Navigation keys to scroll to the video you want to play. Then press Confirm key to play the video.



After you select All videos, to display all videos saved on the phone, select Options > Refresh to refresh the video library.

FM Radio

The channel list is empty when you first use the FM radio. Select Options and then select Automatic tuning, Manual tuning, Precise tuning, or Set frequency to search for channels.

- 1. Select Menu > Multimedia > FM radio to switch on the FM radio
- 2 On the FM screen:
 - Press Confirm key to switch between the headset and the

loudspeaker.

- Press Left navigation key to adjust the frequency.
- Press Right navigation key to switch between the channels saved in the channel list
- Select Minimize to minimize the radio screen. The radio program will continue to play in the background.

To switch off the FM radio, select **Options** > **Exit**, or press and hold the button on the headset cable

Recorder

- In standby mode, select Menu > Multimedia > Recorder.
- Press Confirm key to start recording. Select Pause/Continue to pause or continue.
- Select Stop to stop recording. The sound clip is automatically saved to the recording folder of the default storage that you have selected
- Press Confirm key to play the sound clip.



When recording a sound clip, keep your phone's microphone close to the sound source for better recording quality.

GPS Location

Select Menu > Organizer > Location.

The phone starts Global Positioning System (GPS) location. Once your phone has determined its location, it displays its position with latitude, longitude, and altitude information.



GPS was developed and is maintained by the United States (U.S.)

Government. Any adjustment to the GPS system performed by the U.S.

Government may affect the accuracy of the location determined by your

GPS receiver.

Generally, acquiring GPS signals outdoors takes some time, depending on the physical environment in which you are using your phone. Signal acquisition will take longer if you are in a car or an area with complicated geographical conditions, or experiencing adverse weather conditions. Buildings also affect satellite signal acquisition. Therefore, GPS location may fail if you attempt to use it indoors, in built-up areas, or in areas such as tunnels or underground garages.

GPS location is network-dependent. Before using the function, ensure that you have subscribed to your service provider's Internet access service, your USIM/SIM card supports that function, and you are in a service area. GPS location may incur data traffic charges. For details, contact your service provider.

8 Organizer Applications

Compass

- In standby mode, select Menu > Organizer > Compass to access the compass.
- Calibrate the compass when you use it for the first time, by waving the phone in the figure 8 motion until the calibration message is no longer displayed.



- To ensure the direction accuracy, avoid using the compass near metal objects or magnetic fields.
- The compass provides general measurements for personal use. Avoid using the compass for any purpose that is prohibited. Inappropriate use may cause damage or danger.

Alarms

You can set a maximum of five alarms. To set an alarm, select

Menu > Organizer > Alarm.

- On the Alarm screen, select an alarm. Then set the alarm time. repeat days, and alarm tone.
- Save the settings to enable the alarm.

On the Alarm screen, select an alarm and then select Off to disable the alarm, or select Cancel all to disable all alarms.



- When the alarm sounds, select Stop to stop it. If you select Snooze, the alarm will stop temporarily, and then sound again after five minutes
- · You can customize the repeat days by selecting the days that you want the alarm to sound

Weather Forecast

Adding a City

In standby mode, select Menu > Weather.

- Select **Options** > **Add** (or select **Add** when the city list is empty).
- Select the desired city, update the city's weather information, and add the city to your city list.

Updating Weather Information

- 1. In standby mode, select Menu > Weather.
- Press Left navigation key or Right navigation key to select the desired city and select Options > Update to update the city's weather information.

Connecting via USB

Installing PC Suite

The PC Suite software supplied with your phone runs automatically after you connect your phone to a PC with the USB cable. To install PC Suite:

- 1. Connect your phone to a PC with the USB cable.
- Double-click My Computer. Find and double-click the disk named HUAWEI ASSITANT. Wait for the dialog box to appear on your PC. If the dialog box does not appear automatically, choose My Computer > HUAWEI ASSITANT > Setup.exe to run the installation program and display the dialog box.




- 3. Click Start PC Suite to install PC Suite.
- 4. Follow the wizard to complete installation.
- PC Suite starts automatically after installation is complete. After your phone is detected, you can manage your contacts, files, and calendar, synchronize emails, and send messages on PC Suite

- To find out how to transfer files using PC Suite, see the help document embedded in the software.

Using the microSD Card as the USB Mass Storage

- Connect your phone to a PC using the USB cable.
- Double-click My Computer. Find and double-click the disk named HUAWEI ASSITANT. Wait for the dialog box to appear on your PC.



- Click Flie Transfer. Your PC will identify the microSD card as a removable device. You can then transfer files between your PC and the microSD card.
- After you have finished transferring files, safely remove your phone from the PC as prompted.





Using the Phone as a Modem

When you connect your phone to a PC with the USB cable, you can use the phone as a modem for Internet access.

You can use this function on a PC that runs Windows 2000, Windows XP, Windows Vista, or Windows 7.

- Connect your phone to a PC with the USB cable.
- Double-click My Computer. Find and double-click the disk named HUAWEI ASSITANT. Wait for the dialog box to appear on your PC.



Click Start Mobile Modem and follow the wizard to complete installation. Click Connect on the displayed dialog box to set up a connection and access the Internet.

Rluetooth

Transferring Data via Bluetooth

You can transfer data between your phone and other Bluetooth devices. To do so, ensure that the target device supports

Bluetooth and its Bluetooth function is enabled.

- Select Menu > Settings > Bluetooth to enable the Bluetooth function.
- Select Search for devices to search for available Bluetooth devices
- Scroll to the desired Bluetooth device and select Pair. When you pair your phone with the device for the first time, a password is required.
- 4. Transfer data between your phone and the Bluetooth device.

Using a Bluetooth Headset

You can talk using a Bluetooth headset or a Bluetooth loudspeaker. For more information, see the user manual for the relevant device.

- Switch on the Bluetooth headset and keep it in the discoverable state.
- Select Menu > Settings > Bluetooth to enable the phone's Bluetooth function.
- Select Search for devices to search for available Bluetooth devices.
- Scroll to the desired Bluetooth headset and select Pair. When you pair your phone with the headset for the first time, a password is required.
- 5. Use the Bluetooth headset.

10 Security

Phone Lock

The phone lock protects your phone from unauthorized use. By default, the phone lock is disabled. You can change the preset phone password **000000** to a numeric string of 4 to 8 digits.

- Select Menu > Settings > Security > Phone lock.
- Use Navigation keys to select:
 - On: Enable the phone lock when the phone is next powered on.
 - Off: Disable the phone lock.

PIN and PUK

The personal identification number (PIN) protects your USIM/SIM card from unauthorized use. The PIN unblocking key (PUK) can unlock a blocked PIN. Both the PIN and the PUK are delivered with the USIM/SIM card. For details, contact your service provider. If you incorrectly enter the PIN three times, the PIN is blocked and the phone prompts you to enter the PUK.

If you incorrectly enter the PUK 10 times, the USIM/SIM card become permanently invalid, and you must contact your service provider for a new card.

Keypad Lock

When the keypad is locked, you can still answer incoming calls or make emergency calls by pressing **Call key**.

- 1. Press and hold # key to lock the key pad.
- 2. Press Left soft key, then Right soft key to unlock the keypad.

11 Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

Medical Device

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device when using the device is prohibited.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent potential interference with the pacemaker. If you are using a pacemaker, use the device on the opposite side of the pacemaker and do not carry the device in your front pocket.

Potentially Explosive Atmosphere

Power off your device in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and comply with all signs and instructions. Areas that may have potentially explosive atmospheres include the areas where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine. Triggering of sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or a fire, resulting in bodily injuries or even deaths. Do not power on your device at refueling points such as service stations. Comply with restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots, storage, and distribution areas, and chemical plants. In addition, adhere to restrictions in areas where blasting operations are in progress. Before using the device, watch out for areas that have potentially explosive atmospheres that are often, but not always, clearly marked. Such locations include areas below the deck on boats, chemical transfer or storage facilities, and areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust.

or metal powders. Ask the manufacturers of vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane) whether this device can be safely used in their vicinity.

Traffic Security

Observe local laws and regulations while using the device. In addition, if using the device while driving a vehicle, comply with the following quidelines:

Operating Environment

 Do not use or charge the device in dusty, damp, and dirty places or places with magnetic fields. Otherwise, it may result in a malfunction of the circuit.

- The device complies with the RF specifications when the device is used near your ear or at a distance of 1.5 cm from your body.
 Ensure that the device accessories such as a device case and a device holster are not composed of metal components. Keep your device 1.5 cm away from your body to meet the requirement earlier mentioned.
- On a stormy day with thunder, do not use your device when it is being charged, to prevent any danger caused by lightning.
- When you are on a call, do not touch the antenna. Touching
 the antenna affects the call quality and results in increase in
 power consumption. As a result, the talk time and the standby
 time are reduced.
- While using the device, observe the local laws and regulations, and respect others' privacy and legal rights.
- Keep the ambient temperature between 0°C and 40°C while the device is being charged. Keep the ambient temperature between 0°C to 40°C for using the device powered by a battery.

Prevention of Hearing Damage

Using a headset at high volume can damage your hearing. To reduce the risk of damage to hearing, lower the headset volume to a safe and comfortable level.

Safety of Children

Comply with all precautions with regard to children's safety. Letting the child play with your device or its accessories, which may include parts that can be detached from the device, may be dangerous, as it may present a choking hazard. Ensure that small children are kept away from the device and accessories.

Accessories

Use the accessories delivered only by the manufacturer. Using accessories of other manufacturers or vendors with this device model may invalidate any approval or warranty applicable to the device, result in the non-operation of the device, and cause danger.

Battery and Charger

- Unplug the charger from the electrical plug and the device when not in use.
- The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times before it eventually wears out. When the standby time and the talk time are shorter than the normal time, replace the battery.
- Use the AC power supply defined in the specifications of the charger. An improper power voltage may cause a fire or a malfunction of the charger.
- Do not connect two poles of the battery with conductors, such as metal materials, keys, or jewelries. Otherwise, the battery may be short-circuited and may cause injuries and burns on your body.
- Do not disassemble the battery or solder the battery poles.
 Otherwise, it may lead to electrolyte leakage, overheating, fire, or explosion.
- If battery electrolyte leaks out, ensure that the electrolyte does

- not touch your skin and eyes. When the electrolyte touches your skin or splashes into your eyes, wash your eyes with clean water immediately and consult a doctor.
- If there is a case of battery deformation, color change, or abnormal heating while you charge or store the battery, remove the battery immediately and stop using it. Otherwise, it may lead to battery leakage, overheating, explosion, or fire.
