

Operations

(a) Using the Audio Streaming Function(A2DP Mode)

BD23 can transmit and stream an audio signal to a compatible Bluetooth headset, but it first needs to search for a headset to pair up with. To pair this device to a headset which PIN code is "0000". You need to do the following:

1. Check the BD23 is turned OFF, then press and hold down the "ON/OFF" button until LED light flash rapidly. Then release the button. This means the BD23 is searching for a headset to pair up with.
2. Once the BD23 searches and pairs a compatible headset the LED will flash more slowly - only once per second.
3. If you turn off BD23, when you turn BD23 ON again by pressing the ON/OFF button for no longer than 1 second. It will now connect automatically to the headset it was just paired with.

(b) Using the USB Port (HCI Mode)

As soon as the USB plug is connected to a USB port of your PC or notebook, BD23 will automatically turn on and the LED light will remain on constantly. Then simply activate the Bluetooth software "BlueSoleil".

Note: BD23 has a fixed PIN code number of "0000".

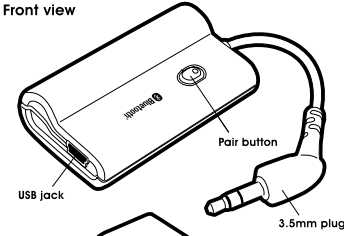

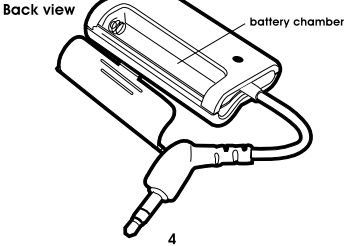
