



Getting Started

Getting to Know Your Phone





Knowing the Keys

Key	Function		
Power key	Press and hold to turn on or off flight mode, restart, or power off. Press to turn off or on the screen display.		
Home key	Touch to return to the home screen from any application or screen. Touch and hold to use Google Search or Now on Tap.		
Back key	Touch to go to the previous screen.		
Recent apps key	Touch to see recently used apps.		
Volume key	Press or hold either end of the key to turn the volume up or down.		

Installing the micro-SIM Card and the microSDXC™ Card

The micro-SIM card can be installed or removed while the phone is turned on. A microSDXC card (optional, not included) can be installed or removed while the phone is turned on. You need to unmount the microSDXC card before removing it. See Using the microSDXC Card as Portable or Internal Storage.




WARNING!

To avoid damage to the phone, do not use any other kind of SIM cards, or any non-standard micro-SIM card cut from a SIM card. You can get a standard micro-SIM card from your service provider.

 Insert your fingernail into the slot close to the bottom right of the back cover and lift it up gently.



Hold the micro-SIM card and the microSDXC card with the cut corner oriented as shown and slip them into the card holders.



NOTE:

Some applications may require a microSDXC card to work normally or may store certain data on it. Therefore, it is recommended that you keep a microSDXC card installed and not remove or replace it randomly.

Align the back cover with the back of the phone and press the cover back into place. Ensure that all the tabs are secure and there are no gaps around the cover.

Charging the Battery

Your phone's battery should have enough power for the phone to turn on, find a signal, and make a few calls. You should fully charge the battery as soon as possible.

If the battery is low, there will be a pop-up message on the screen. As you charge your phone, the lock screen will show you the exact battery level on the status bar.

₩ARNING!

Use only approved chargers and cables. The use of unapproved accessories could damage your phone or cause the battery to explode.

CAUTION:

Do not change the built-in rechargeable battery in your phone by yourself. If your battery need to be replaced, please contact Vodafone customer support.

 Connect the adapter to the charging jack. Ensure that the adapter is inserted with the correct orientation. Do not force the connector into the charging jack.



- Connect the charger to a standard AC power outlet. If the phone is on, you'll see a charging icon, such as proper on the status bar.
- 3. Disconnect the charger when the battery is fully charged.



If the battery is extremely low, you may be unable to power on the phone even when it is being charged. In this case, try again after charging the phone for at least 20 minutes. Contact the customer service if you still cannot power on the phone after prolonged charging.

Extending the Battery Life

Active applications, screen brightness levels, Bluetooth and Wi-Fi usage and GPS functionality can drain your battery. You can follow the helpful tips below to conserve your battery power:

· Reduce the screen backlight time.

- · Lower the screen brightness.
- Turn Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and auto-sync off when not in use.
- Disable the GPS function when not in use. Most applications using this function will periodically query the GPS satellites for your current location, and each query drains your battery.

Powering On/Off

- Press and hold the Power key to turn on your phone.
- To power off, press and hold the **Power** key to open the options menu and touch Shut down > OK.



If the phone freezes or takes too long to respond, you can press and hold the ${\bf Power}$ key for about 16 seconds to restart the phone.

Setting Up for the First Time

When you first power on your phone after you purchase it or reset it to factory settings (see <u>Backup and Reset</u>), you need to do some settings before using it.

Flick the language field to select the language. Then follow the on-screen prompts to set up your phone.

Locking/Unlocking the Screen and Keys

Your phone allows you to quickly lock the screen and keys (put the phone to sleep mode) when not in use and to turn the screen back on and unlock it when you need it.

To lock the screen and keys:

To quickly turn the screen off and lock the keys, press the **Power** key.

NOTE:

To save battery power, the phone automatically turns off the screen after some time of inactivity. You will still be able to receive messages and calls while the phone screen is off.

To unlock the screen and keys:

- 1. Press the Power key to turn the screen on.
 - or -

Double-tap on the screen to turn it on.



To enable this feature, select Settings > Display > Double tap to wake from the home screen.

- 2. Swipe up on the screen.
 - or -

Swipe from a shortcut icon at the bottom to open the related app or feature.

- or -

Touch a notification twice consecutively to open the related app.

✓ NOTE:

If you have set an unlock pattern, a PIN or a password for your phone (see <u>Protecting Your Phone With Screen Locks</u>), you'll need to draw the pattern or enter the PIN/password to unlock your screen.

NOTE:

You can edit the shortcut icons on the lock screen. Select Select Settings > Display > Edit Lockscreen shortcuts from the home screen, touch a shortcut to change it, or touch Add shortcut to add one.

Using the Touch Screen

Your phone's touch screen enables you to control actions through a variety of touch gestures.

Touch

When you want to type using the onscreen keyboard, select items on the screen such as the application and settings icons, or press the onscreen buttons, simply touch them with your finger.



Touch and Hold

To open the available options for an item (for example, a message or link in a web page), touch and hold the item.



· Swipe or Slide

To swipe or slide means to quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.



Drag

To drag, press and hold your finger with some pressure before you start to move your finger. While dragging, do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.



Pinch

In some apps (such as Maps, web browser, and Gallery), you can zoom in and out by placing two fingers on the screen at once and pinching them together (to zoom out) or spreading them apart (to zoom in).





Rotate the screen

For most screens, you can automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways.

Getting to Know the Home Screen

The home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your home screen by adding shortcuts, folders, widgets, and more.

Status har



Extended Home Screen Panels

Your home screen is extendable, providing more space for shortcuts, widgets, and more. Simply swipe left or right on the home screen to see the extended panels. You can add or remove home screen panels, or adjust their order.

To add a new home screen panel:

- Touch the Home key > , or touch and hold an empty area of the home screen and select WIDGETS.
- Touch and hold an application icon or a widget and drag it to the right edge of the screen to create a new home screen panel and put the icon or widget on it.



No empty home screen panel is allowed to exist. If the icon, widget or folder is the only item on the current home screen panel, the panel will be deleted as you remove the item.

To adjust the order of a home screen panel:

- Touch and hold an empty area of the home screen and slide left or right to view the home screen thumbnails.
- 2. Touch and hold a thumbnail and drag it left or right to the place you need.

To open your favourite home screen app:

You can slide right on the home screen to open your favourite app quickly.

- Touch the **Home** key and then slide right if necessary to access the leftmost home screen.
- 2. Slide right on the screen to open your favourite app.



Touch the Home key >

> Settings > Display and touch Home Screen to turn on of off this feature, or touch Favourite Home screen app to select your favourite app.

Standard Home Screen and Simple Home Screen

The standard home screen has the standard Android layout, while the simple home screen provides improved accessibility and usability. You can switch between them at any time according to your preference.

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Home.
- 2. Select one home screen you need.

Personalizing

Changing the System Language

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Language & input > Language.
- 2. Select the language you need.

Setting the Date and Time

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Date & time.
- 2. Set the date, time, time zone, and time format.
 - ▶ To adjust the date and time automatically, turn on Automatic date & time.
 - To adjust the date and time manually, turn off Automatic date & time and touch Set date / Set time to change the date and time.
 - To adjust the time zone automatically, turn on Automatic time zone.
 - To adjust the time zone manually, turn off Automatic time zone and touch
 Select time zone to set the correct time zone.
 - To adjust the time format, touch Use 24-hour format.

Changing Ringtone and Notification Sound

You can customize the default incoming call ringtone and the default notification sound.

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Sound & notification.
- 2. Touch Phone ringtone or Default notification ringtone.

- Select the ringtone you want to use. Touch More Ringtones or More Notifications on the top of the ringtone list to choose more audio files.
- 4. Touch OK.



See <u>Set a Ringtone for a Contact</u> for how to assign a special ringtone to an individual contact.

Turning On/Off System Sounds

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > Settings > Sound & notification > Other sounds.
- Touch Dial pad tones, Screen locking sounds, Charging sounds, Touch sounds, or Vibrate on touch.

Adjusting Volume

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Sound & notification.
- Drag the sliders below Media volume, Alarm volume and Ring volume to adjust the volume for each type of audio.
- NOTE:

You can adjust the media volume when a media application is in use by pressing the **Volume** key. If no media application is active, press the **Volume** key to adjust ringtone volume (or the earpiece volume during a call).

Using Do Not Disturb Mode

You can limit interruptions with Do not disturb mode. This mode silences your phone so that it doesn't make sounds or vibrate when you don't want it to.

To turn on Do not disturb mode:

- Swipe down from the top of the screen with two fingers to access the Quick Settings.
- 2. Touch (Do not disturb).
- Touch Total silence, Alarms only, or Priority only depending on whether you
 want to allow exceptions. You can customize the exceptions when Priority only
 is selected.
- Touch Until you turn this off if you want to turn off Do not disturb mode
 manually; touch + or to set the time before Do not disturb mode turns
 off automatically.
- Touch DONE.

NOTES:

- Press and hold the Power key and touch
 \(\bigcirc\) to turn on Alarms only quickly, or touch '\(\bigcirc\) to turn on vibration.
- Press the Volume key when no media application is active to show the volume bar. Drag the slider to the left or keep pressing the Volume down key to turn on vibration. Press the key again to turn on Alarms only.
- To turn off Do not disturb mode quickly, press either end of the Volume key and then touch END NOW when the screen is unlocked, or press and hold the Power key and touch .

To set exceptions for Do not disturb mode (Priority only):

You can set reminders, events, and callers that you specify as exceptions when Do not disturb mode is set to **Priority only**.

1. Touch the Home key > Settings > Sound & notification > Do not

disturb > Priority only allows.

Turn on the switch next to the items you want to allow. Touch Messages or Calls and set notifications from who can alert you to messages or calls.

NOTE:

When **Repeat callers** is switched on, you'll receive a notification if someone calls you a second time within a 15 minute period, regardless of whether notifications from that person receive priority status.

To set a Do not disturb rule:

If you want to allow all notification alerts through most of the time, but want to limit alerts during certain times (like at night or on the weekends), you can set a rule for Do not disturb mode.

- Touch the Home key > Settings > Sound & notification > Do not disturb > Automatic rules.
- 2. Touch Add rule.
- 3. Enter the rule name, select Time rule or Event rule, and touch OK.
- For a time rule, set the days, the start and end times, and set Do not disturb mode. For an event rule, select a Google Calendar you want to make the rule for, select the type of reply you want to use, and set Do not disturb mode.
- NOTE:

To turn on or off a schedule, touch a rule to open its details screen and then touch the on/off switch.

Applying New Wallpapers

You can set the wallpaper for the home screen and lock screen.

- Touch and hold an empty place on the home screen and then touch WALLPAPERS.
- Slide left or right on the wallpaper panel to select a wallpaper or animation, or touch My photos to choose the image you want to use as the wallpaper. Pinch on the image to crop it if needed.
- 3. Touch Set wallpaper.
- NOTE:

Changing Screen Brightness

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Display > Brightness level.
- 2. Drag the slider to manually adjust the screen brightness.
- NOTE:

Your phone can automatically adjust the screen brightness for available light. Touch **Adaptive brightness** in the **Display** settings screen to turn the feature on or off.

Protecting Your Phone With Screen Locks

You can protect your phone by creating a screen lock. When it is enabled, you need to swipe up on the screen, draw a pattern or enter a numeric PIN or password to unlock the phone's screen and keys.

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Security > Screen lock.
- 2. Touch None. Swipe. Pattern. PIN or Password.
 - ► Touch None to disable the screen lock.

- Touch Swipe to enable screen lock and allow unlocking with a 'swipe' gesture. You can unlock the screen by touching the display and sliding up.
- Touch Pattern to draw and redraw a pattern that you must draw to unlock the screen.
- Touch PIN or Password to set a numeric PIN or a password that you must enter to unlock the screen.
- For Pattern, PIN, or Password lock, select how you want notifications and their contents to show when the phone is locked. Then touch **DONE**.



Remember the pattern, PIN or password you set. Otherwise, you will have to upgrade the phone software to use the phone.

Protecting Your Phone With Encryption

You can encrypt all the data on your phone: your accounts, application data, music and other media, downloaded information, and so on. If you do, you must draw an unlock pattern, or enter a numeric PIN or a password each time you power on your phone.

○ WARNING!

Encryption is irreversible. The only way to revert to an unencrypted phone is to perform a factory data reset, which erases all your data.

Encryption provides additional protection in case your phone is stolen, and may be required or recommended in some organizations. Consult your system administrator before turning it on. In many cases the pattern, PIN or password you set for encryption is controlled by the system administrator.

Before turning on encryption, prepare as follows:

· Set a screen lock pattern, PIN or password.

- Charge the battery.
- . Keep the phone connected to the charger.
- Schedule an hour or more for the encryption process: you must not interrupt it or you will lose some or all of your data.

When you're ready to turn on encryption:

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Security > Encrypt phone.
- 2. Read the information about encryption carefully.

The **ENCRYPT PHONE** button is dimmed if your battery is not charged or your phone's not plugged in.

If you change your mind about encrypting your phone, touch the Back key.



If you interrupt the encryption process, you will lose data.

- 3. Touch ENCRYPT PHONE.
- 4. Draw your screen lock pattern or enter your PIN or password, and touch NEXT.
- 5. Touch ENCRYPT PHONE again.

The encryption process starts. Encryption can take an hour or more, during which time your phone may restart several times.

When encryption is completed, you're prompted to draw the unlock pattern, or enter your PIN or password.

Subsequently you must draw your unlock pattern, or enter your PIN or password each time you power on your phone in order to decrypt it.

Protecting Your Phone With Screen Pinning

You can use the screen pinning feature to keep an app in view, so others cannot switch to other apps or access your personal information.

Turn On Screen Pinning

- Touch the Home key > Settings > Security > Screen pinning.
- 2. Touch the On/Off switch.
- If you want to ask for the unlock pattern, PIN or password before unpinning the screen, switch on Ask for unlock pattern / PIN / password before unpinning when the screen lock has been set.

Pin a Screen

- 1. Ensure that screen pinning is turned on.
- 2. Open the app you want to keep in view.
- 3. Touch the Recent apps key.
- 4. If there are many app tabs, swipe up to find on the front-most tab.
- 5. Touch .

Unpin the Screen

To unpin the screen and return to normal use, touch and hold the **Back** key and the **Recent apps** key at the same time.

If you have asked for the unlock pattern, PIN or password before unpinning the screen, swipe up on the lock screen and draw the pattern or enter the PIN/password.

Knowing the Basics

Monitoring the Phone Status

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides phone and service status icons on the right side. Below are some of the icons you may see.

Managing Notifications

Notification Icons

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides notification icons on the left. Below are some of the icons you may see.

Open/Close the Notification Panel

Notifications report the arrival of new messages, calendar events, and alarms, as well as ongoing events, such as when you are playing music. You can open the notification panel to view the details of notifications.

 To open the notification panel, swipe your finger down from the top of the screen. To close the notification panel, swipe your finger up on the screen or touch the Back key.

Respond to or Remove a Notification

In the notification panel, you can respond to a notification or remove the notifications. The notification panel also supports expandable notifications that let you perform additional actions right from the notification itself.

- · To respond to a notification, just touch it.
- Slide down with one finger to expand certain notifications. You can also swipe two fingers vertically or pinch-zoom to expand or collapse certain notifications.
- To remove a notification, swipe it left or right.
- To remove all notifications, touch below all the notifications.
- To manage notifications you have received, touch and hold a notification to
 identify the application that created it. You can then touch
 Block all to hide future notifications from this app, or enable Treat as priority to
 show them when Do not disturb mode is set to Priority only.

NOTE:

If you block notifications for an app, you may miss its important alerts and updates. The notifications of some apps cannot be blocked.

Use Quick Settings

The Quick Settings make it convenient to view or change the most common settings for your phone.

To access the Quick Settings, open the notification panel and drag the panel downwards, or swipe down from the top of the screen with two fingers.

You can find the following Quick Settings:

- Brightness: Drag the brightness slider to adjust the screen brightness.
- WI-FI: Touch to turn on or off Wi-Fi. To open Wi-Fi settings, touch the Wi-Fi network name. See <u>Connecting to Wi-Fi</u>.
- Bluetooth: Touch to turn on or off Bluetooth. To open Bluetooth settings, touch the word "Bluetooth". See <u>Connecting to Bluetooth Devices</u>.
- Do not disturb / Total silence / Alarms only / Priority only: Touch to turn on Do not disturb mode and select an option. Touch again to turn off Do not disturb mode. See Using Do Not Disturb Mode.
- Mobile data: Touch to view the mobile data usage, enable or disable data access over the mobile network, and access more settings.
- Flight mode: Touch to turn on or off flight mode.
- Auto-rotate/Portrait: Touch to turn on or off the auto-rotate screen feature.
- Torch: Touch to turn on or off the flash.
- Location: Touch to turn location services on or off. See Location.
- Hotspot: Touch to turn on or off the portable Wi-Fi hotspot. See <u>Share Your</u> Mobile Data Connection as a Wi-Fi Hotspot.
- NFC: Touch to turn on or off NFC. See <u>Exchanging Data via NFC</u>.
- Battery saver: Touch to turn on or off Battery saver. See <u>Battery</u>.



In the Quick Settings screen, touch at the top to get to the **Settings** menu; touch the battery icon to open the battery settings screen; touch to manage users or switch between them.

Managing Shortcuts and Widgets

Add Shortcuts and Widgets

Touch the Home key > ...

- or -

To add widgets, touch and hold an empty area of the home screen and select **WIDGETS**.

- 2. Slide up or down to browse the available applications or widgets.
- Touch and hold a widget or an application icon and drag it to a home screen panel.
- NOTE:

While holding the item, you can drag it to the right edge of the screen to create a new home screen panel and put the item on it.

Move Shortcuts or Widgets

- 1. Touch and hold a shortcut or widget on the home screen.
- 2. Drag it to the place you need.

Remove Shortcuts or Widgets

- 1. Touch and hold a shortcut or widget on the home screen.
- 2. Drag it to X (Remove) to remove it.

Adjust Widget Size

- Touch and hold a widget on the home screen and then release it.
 - An outline appears around the widget. Drag the outline to resize the widget.



Not all widgets can be resized.

Organizing With Folders

You can create folders on the home screen and add several shortcuts to a folder. You can move or remove folders the same way as moving or removing shortcuts.

- Touch and hold a shortcut on the home screen and drag it quickly over another shortcut.
- Release the shortcut. A new folder will be created and both shortcuts are added into the folder.
- To add more shortcuts into the folder, touch and hold each shortcut and drag it over the folder before releasing it.



Touch the folder and then touch the name field to rename the folder.

Rearranging the Primary Shortcuts

The home screen includes a customizable primary shortcuts area at the bottom visible from all home screens. You can keep at most four items in the primary shortcuts area. Drag shortcuts or folders in or out of the area to rearrange it.



Entering Text

You can enter text using the onscreen keyboard. Some apps open it automatically. In

others, you open it by touching where you want to type. Touch the **Back** key to hide the onscreen keyboard. You can also enter text by speaking with the Google voice typing feature.

Enable or Disable Input Methods

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Language & Input > Current Keyboard.
- Touch CHOOSE KEYBOARDS at the bottom.
- 3. Slide the switches beside the input methods to enable or disable them.



Some default input methods may not be disabled.


Change Input Methods

- When you use the onscreen keyboard to enter text, the icon appears on the status bar.
- 2. Open the notification panel and touch Change keyboard.
- 3. Select the input method you need.
- NOTE:

The icon appears only when more than one input method is installed and enabled.

Android Keyboard

The Android Keyboard provides a layout similar to a desktop computer keyboard. When screen auto-rotation is enabled, turn the phone sideways and the keyboard will change from portrait to landscape. The landscape keyboard is not supported in all applications.



- Touch the alphabetic keys to enter letters. Touch and hold some specific keys to
 enter associated accented letters or numbers. For example, to enter È, touch
 and hold E³ and the available accented letters and number 3 appear. Then
 slide to choose È.
- As you enter a word, candidates appear above the keyboard. Touch to select the correct one; touch and hold to see more possible options.
- Touch to use uppercase. Double-tap to lock uppercase. This key also changes to indicate the current case you are using: for lowercase, for uppercase, and when locked in uppercase.
- Touch ?123 to select numbers and symbols. You can then touch = \ < to find more.
- Touch to enter miniature icons, such as expressions, horoscopes, and animals.
- Touch to use Google voice typing.


 Touch and hold I to change the input language or set up the Android Keyboard.

Gesture Typing

The Android Keyboard supports the gesture typing feature. You can use this feature to input a word by sliding through the letters.

To enable and use gesture typing:

- Touch and hold on the Android Keyboard and then touch Android Keyboard Settings.
- Touch Gesture Typing and then touch Enable gesture typing if this feature is turned off.
- Move your finger from letter to letter on the keyboard to trace a word without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.



NOTES:

- . Touch when you want to. If you want to enter a single letter, go ahead and touch.
- . Lift your finger at the end of the word. A space is added automatically when you

begin to input the next word.

Google Voice Typing

Google Voice typing uses the Google voice recognition service to convert speech to text.

- Touch to access the voice typing feature when you are using the Android Keyboard.
 - Or flick down the status bar when entering text and touch **Change keyboard**, and then select **Google voice typing**.
- 2. When you see the microphone image, speak what you want to type.
- 3. You can continue entering text to keep it or to delete it.



Say "comma," "period," "question mark," "exclamation mark," or "exclamation point" to enter punctuation.

Input Method Settings

Choose the input method settings by touching > Settings > Language & Input from the home screen.

In the **Keyboard & Input methods** section, you can set the current input method and choose the settings for input methods.

Editing Text

 Move the insertion point: Touch where you want to type. The cursor blinks in the new position, and a tab appears below it. Drag the tab to move the cursor.

- Select text: Touch and hold or double-tap within the text. The nearest word highlights, with a tab at each end of the selection. Drag the tabs to change the selection.
- Cut or copy: Select the text you want to manipulate. Then touch CUT or COPY to
 cut or copy the text to the clipboard.
- Replace text with the clipboard text: Select the text you want to replace. Then
 touch PASTE.

Opening and Switching Apps

Open an App

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > to open the app drawer screen.
- 2. Slide up or down on the screen and touch an app to open it.



Drag the slider on the right side of the screen to the initial letter of the app you need, or touch the search box at the top to search for apps.

Switch Between Recently Opened Apps

- Touch the Recent apps key. The apps you've used recently are displayed in a series of tabs. Slide up and down to see all the tabs.
- Touch a tab to open that app.
- NOTE:

You can swipe a tab sideways or touch **X** on the tab to remove it from the screen. Touch to remove all tabs.

Uninstalling an App

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > to open the application list screen.
- Touch and hold an application icon and drag the icon to (Uninstall) at the top of the screen.
- 3. Touch **OK** to uninstall the app.



Some pre-installed apps cannot be uninstalled.

Connecting to Networks and Devices

Connecting to Mobile Networks

Control Mobile Data Use

To enable or disable data access:

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Data usage.
- 2. Touch the Mobile data switch to enable or disable mobile data use.

To get data services when roaming:

- Touch the Home key > Settings > More > Mobile networks.
- 2. Touch the Data roaming switch if it is turned off.

NOTE:

Data roaming may incur significant roaming charges.

Select Preferred Network Type

- Touch the Home key > Settings > More > Mobile networks > Preferred network type.
- 2. Touch the type of network you prefer to connect to.

Set Access Point Names

To connect to the Internet you can use the default Access Point Names (APN). And if you want to add a new APN, please contact the service provider to get the necessary information.

- 2. Touch
- 3. Touch each item to enter the information you get from your service provider.
- 4. Touch : > Save to complete.
- NOTE:

To set the APN to default settings, touch > Reset to default.

Select Network Operator

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > More > Mobile networks > Network operators.
- 2. Touch Search networks to search for all available networks.
- Touch a network in the network list to register manually.You can also touch Choose automatically to select preferred network automatically.

Connecting to Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that can provide Internet access at distances of up to 100 meters, depending on the Wi-Fi router and your surroundings.

Turn Wi-Fi On and Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

- Touch the Home key > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. Touch a network name to connect to it.
- 4. If the network is secured, enter the password and touch CONNECT.

NOTE:

Your phone automatically connects to previously used Wi-Fi networks when they are in range.

Get Notified of Open Networks

- Touch the Home key > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the WI-FI switch to the On position.
- Touch > Advanced.
- 4. Slide the Network notification switch.

When Wi-Fi is on, you receive notifications in the status bar when your phone detects an open Wi-Fi network. Switch off this option to turn off notifications.

Add a Wi-Fi Network

You can add a Wi-Fi network if the network does not broadcast its name (SSID), or to add a Wi-Fi network when you are out of range.

To connect to a secured network, you first need to get the security details from the network's administrator.

- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- Touch > Add network.
- Enter the network SSID (name). If necessary, enter security or other network configuration details.
- 5. Touch SAVE.

Connect to a WPS Network

Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) is a feature that makes it easy to add your phone to the access points which support WPS.

You can use one of the following methods to connect your phone to a wireless network using WPS.

Method one: WPS button (Recommended)

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- 3. Touch > Advanced > WPS Push Button.
- Press the WPS button on the access point and the access point will recognize your phone and add it to the network.

Method two: PIN number

- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- 3. Touch > Advanced > WPS Pin Entry.
- The WPS PIN number displays on the screen. Enter the PIN number into the access point's setup page.

After entering the PIN number, your phone automatically finds the access point and configures the connection.

NOTE:

For detailed information about the WPS feature of the access point, please refer to its user documents.

Forget a Wi-Fi Network

You can make your phone forget about the details of a Wi-Fi network that you added for example, if you don't want the phone to connect to it automatically or if it is a network that you no longer use.

- Touch the Home key > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- 3. Touch the Wi-Fi network name and then touch FORGET.

Adjust Advanced Wi-Fi Settings

- 1. Touch the Home key > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch : > Advanced to adjust the following settings.
 - Network notification: Get notifications in the status bar when Wi-Fi is on and an open network is available.
 - Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Set whether to keep Wi-Fi on in sleep mode.
 - Install certificates: Install certificates needed for connecting to certain Wi-Fi networks.
 - ▶ Wi-Fi Direct: Use the Wi-Fi Direct feature. See Using Wi-Fi Direct®.
 - WPS Push Button: Connect to a WPS network via the push button method.
 - ▶ WPS Pin Entry: Connect to a WPS network via the phone PIN method.
 - MAC address: Check the MAC address.
 - IP address: Check the phone's IP address.

Using Wi-Fi Direct®

Wi-Fi Direct allows Wi-Fi devices to share files and data directly by connecting to each other without the need for wireless access points (hotspots).

Connect to Another Device via Wi-Fi Direct

- 2. If Wi-Fi is off, slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- Touch Advanced > WI-FI Direct. Your phone will search for other devices enabled with Wi-Fi Direct connections.
- Touch a device name below **Peer devices** to connect with it.
 The other device will receive a connection prompt and need to accept the request for connection. Both devices may need to enter a common PIN.
- 5. Once connected the device is displayed as "Connected" in the Peer devices list.

Send Data via Wi-Fi Direct

- 1. Open the appropriate application and select the file or item you want to share.
- Select the option for sharing via Wi-Fi Direct. The method may vary by application and data type.
- Touch a device the phone has connected with or wait for it to search for new devices and touch one of them.

Receive Data via Wi-Fi Direct

When an attempt to transfer data via Wi-Fi Direct is received, you can see a notification in the status bar. Open the notification panel, touch the notification and select **Accept** to start receiving the data.

Received files are stored automatically in a dedicated folder (WiFiShare, for instance). You can access them with the File Manager app.

Connecting to Bluetooth Devices

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology. Phones or other devices with Bluetooth capabilities can exchange information wirelessly within a distance of about 10 meters (32.8 feet). The Bluetooth devices must be paired before the communication is performed.

Turn Bluetooth On/Off

- Touch the Home key > Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On or Off position.

When Bluetooth is on, the * icon appears in the status bar.

Change the Device Name

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Bluetooth.
- Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On position if Bluetooth is off.
- Touch > Rename this device.
- Edit the name and touch RENAME.

Pair With Another Bluetooth Device

- Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On position if Bluetooth is off.
 Your phone automatically scans for and displays the IDs of all available
 Bluetooth devices in range. You could touch * > Refresh if you want to
 scan again.
- Touch the device you want to pair with.
- Confirm that the Bluetooth passkeys are the same between the two devices and touch PAIR. Alternately, enter a Bluetooth passkey and touch PAIR. Pairing is successfully completed when the other device accepts the connection or the same passkey is entered.

NOTE:

The Bluetooth passkey may be fixed for certain devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits. You can try entering 0000 or 1234 (the most common passkeys), or refer to the documents for that device.

Forget (Unpair With) a Bluetooth Device

You can make your phone forget its pairing connection with another Bluetooth device. To connect to the device again, you need to search it and enter or confirm a passkey again.

- Touch the Home key > Settings > Bluetooth and ensure that Bluetooth is turned on.
- In the list of paired devices, touch the icon beside the Bluetooth device you want to forget.
- Touch FORGET.

Send Data via Bluetooth

- 1. Open the appropriate application and select the file or item you want to share.
- Select the option for sharing via Bluetooth. The method may vary by application and data type.
- Touch a Bluetooth device the phone has paired with or wait for it to search for new devices and touch one of them.

Receive Data via Bluetooth

- Turn Bluetooth on before trying to receive data via Bluetooth.
- 2. Flick down the status bar and touch *:
- Touch ACCEPT to start receiving the data.

Received files are stored automatically in a dedicated folder (*Bluetooth*, for instance) in the phone. You can access them with the **File Manager** app.

Exchanging Data via NFC

Near Field Communication (NFC) allows your phone to exchange data with another NFC-enabled device when they touch each other or in close proximity.

Depending on the applications that you have installed on your phone, you might be able to use your phone as a transit pass or as an access pass. To use this feature, tap the back of your phone against an NFC-enabled access point, subject to applicable terms and conditions from the particular vendor.

To turn on and use NFC:

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > More.
- 2. Slide the NFC switch to the on position.
- If you want to share web pages, contact information, YouTube videos or other content on your phone to another NFC-capable device, touch Android Beam and

slide the switch to the On position.

Using Tap & Pay

You can tap and pay with your phone at the merchants that accept contactless payments.

Set Up Tap & Pay

To tap and pay, you must turn on NFC on your phone.

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > More.
- 2. Slide the NFC switch to the on position.

Manage Apps Using Tap & Pay

If you have more than one app that lets you tap and pay, you can choose a default. Your default app is the one you'll automatically use when you tap and pay at a store. You can browse Google Play Store for more payment apps. Your payment apps need to support the tap and pay functionality in order to show up. Money transfer apps and Android Beam aren't supported.

To set your default payment app:

- 1. Open the payment app and turn on tap and pay.
- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Tap & pay.
- 3. Select your default payment app.

Turn Off Tap & Pay

You can turn off tap and pay in two ways:

- Turn off NFC on your phone. Touch the Home key > > Settings > More and then slide the NFC switch to the off position. This also turns off Android Beam and other NFC features.
- Turn off the tap and pay functionality in your payment app. Not all payment apps support this option.

Connecting to Your Computer via USB

You can connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable and transfer music. pictures, and other files in both directions. Your phone stores these files in the phone storage or on a removable microSDXC card.

If you are using USB tethering, you must turn that off before you can use USB to transfer files between your phone and computer.

Connect Your Phone to a Computer via USB

- Connect your phone to the PC with a USB cable.
- Open the notification panel and touch 2.
- 3. Choose one of the following options:
 - Charging only: Charge your phone via USB.
 - Transfer files (MTP); Transfer files on Windows® or Mac®.
 - Transfer photos (PTP): Transfer photos using camera software.

Connect With Windows Media® Player

You can sync music, picture, and video files from the computer to your phone via Windows Media Player on the computer.

Connect the phone with your computer via USB.

Open the notification panel and touch (USB for ...). 2.



- Touch Transfer files (MTP). 3.
- Open Windows Media Player and synchronize music, picture, and video files. 4.

Disconnect Your Phone From the Computer

To disconnect the phone from the computer, simply unplug the USB cable when vou're finished.

Using the microSDXC Card as Portable or Internal Storage

You can use your microSDXC card as portable storage when there's already content such as your media and other files so that you don't lose them.

If your microSDXC card is new or doesn't have content you want to keep, you can also set it up as an extension of the internal phone storage, and this requires formatting that prevents the microSDXC card from working with other devices.

Set Up the microSDXC Card as Portable Storage

When you install a microSDXC card that has not been used on your phone before, the phone will mount the card as portable storage by default.

You can also open the notification panel and touch the microSDXC card name, select Use as portable storage and then touch NEXT > DONE.

To remove the microSDXC card from your phone:

If you need to remove the microSDXC card used as portable storage while the phone is on, you must unmount it first.

Touch the Home key > > Settings > Storage & USB. 1.

- Touch next to the card name in the Portable storage section.
- When the screen prompts the card is safely ejected, you can now remove it from the phone.

NOTE:

If you unmount the microSDXC card, some apps may not work properly until the microSDXC card is remounted.

To erase and format the microSDXC card:

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Storage & USB.
- 2. Touch the card name in the Portable storage section.
- 3. Touch > Settings and then touch Format.
- 4. Touch ERASE & FORMAT.

CAUTION:

The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSDXC card, after which the files CANNOT be retrieved.

Set Up the microSDXC Card as Internal Storage

If your microSDXC card is new or doesn't have content you want to keep, you can format the card and use it as internal storage of your phone. If you move the microSDXC card to another device. it'll be formatted before it can be used.

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Storage & USB.
- 2. Touch the card name in the Portable storage section.
- 3. Touch * > Settings and then touch Format as internal.
- 4. Touch FRASE & FORMAT.

CAUTION:

The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSDXC card, after which the files CANNOT be retrieved.

The phone will prompt you to move your photos, files and some apps from the internal storage to the microSDXC card. Select **Move now** or **Move later** and touch **NEXT**. Follow the onscreen instructions to continue.

To move apps and data between the internal storage and the microSDXC card:

If you've set up your microSDXC card as internal storage, you can move your photos, files and some apps from the internal storage to the microSDXC card to free up internal storage space, or vice versa.

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Storage & USB.
- 2. Touch Internal storage or the microSDXC card name.
- 3. Touch > Migrate data.
- 4. Touch MOVE.

To move an app between the internal storage and the microSDXC card:

If you've set up your microSDXC card as internal storage, you can move your apps to the card when the internal storage space is not enough. The apps can also be moved back to the internal storage.

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Apps.
- 2. Touch the app you want to move.
- Touch Storage.
- Touch CHANGE and select Internal storage or your card name.
- 5. Touch MOVE.



Not all apps can be moved.

To remove the microSDXC card from your phone:

If you need to remove the microSDXC card used as internal storage while the phone is on, you must unmount it first.

- 1. Touch the Home key > Settings > Storage & USB.
- 2. Touch your card name below internal storage.
- 3. Touch > Elect.
- Touch EJECT.
- When the screen prompts the card is safely ejected, you can now remove it from the phone.

NOTE:

If there are apps that were moved to the card, you will not be able to open these apps after unmounting the card.

To reformat the microSDXC card as portable storage:

If you no longer want to use your microSDXC card as internal storage, you can reformat the card as portable storage.

NOTE:

Before the formatting, make sure to back up your media files to other devices and move the apps on the card to the internal phone storage.

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Storage & USB.
- 2. Touch your card name below internal storage.
- 3. Touch > Format as portable.
- 4. Touch FORMAT.

CAUTION:

The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSDXC card, after which the

files CANNOT be retrieved.

Sharing Your Mobile Data Connection

You can share your phone's data capabilities through tethering or by activating the Wi-Fi hotspot feature to create a mobile hotspot.

Share Your Mobile Data Connection via USB

You can access the Internet on your computer via the USB tethering feature of your phone. The feature needs data connection on a mobile network and may result in data charges.



You cannot transfer files between your phone and your computer when the phone is LISB tethered.

- 1. Connect your phone to your computer with a USB cable.
- Touch the Home key > > Settings > More > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Switch on USB tethering. A new network connection will be created on your computer.



To stop sharing your data connection, switch off **USB tethering** or disconnect the USB cable.

Share Your Mobile Data Connection via Bluetooth

If your computer can obtain an Internet connection via Bluetooth, you can configure your phone to share its mobile data connection with your computer.

Pair your phone with your computer via Bluetooth.

- Configure your computer to obtain its network connection via Bluetooth. For more information, please see your computer's documentation.
- Touch the Home key > > Settings > More > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Switch on Bluetooth tethering. Your computer is now sharing your phone's data connection.
- NOTE:

To stop sharing your data connection, switch off Bluetooth tethering.

Share Your Mobile Data Connection as a Wi-Fi Hotspot

You can share your phone's data connection with other devices by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot. The feature needs data connection on a mobile network and may result in data charges.

NOTE:

When the portable Wi-Fi hotspot feature is enabled, you cannot use your phone's Wi-Fi capability to access the Internet. You still remain connected to the Internet via your mobile data network.

- Touch the Home key > Settings > More > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 2. Switch on Portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

After a moment, the phone starts broadcasting its Wi-Fi network name (SSID).

On another device, locate your phone via Wi-Fi and connect with it to start using the phone's mobile data.

NOTE:

To stop sharing your data connection, switch off Portable WI-FI hotspot.

Set Your Wi-Fi Hotspot

You can change the name of your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID), secure your portable

Wi-Fi hotspot, and set other options.

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > More > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 2. Touch Set up Wi-Fi hotspot and set your name and security options as follows.
 - Network name: Enter or edit a network SSID (name) that other devices see when scanning for Wi-Fi networks.
 - Security: Choose a security option: None (not recommended) or WPA2 PSK (other users can access your Wi-Fi hotspot only if they enter the correct password). When you select WPA2 PSK, touch the Password field to edit the security password.
- 3. Touch SAVE to save your settings.

Connecting to Virtual Private Networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions to let people access local network resources when not on campus, or when connected to a wireless network.

Depending on the type of VPN you are using, you may be required to enter your login credentials or install security certificates before you can connect to your VPN. You can get this information from your network administrator.

Add a VPN

- Touch the Home key > Settings > More > VPN.
- Touch

 t at the top right corner and fill in the information provided by your network administrator.

Touch SAVE.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN screen.



You must set a lock screen pattern, PIN or password before using VPN.

Connect to a VPN

- Touch the Home key > Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Touch the VPN that you want to connect to.
- 3. When prompted, enter any requested credentials, and then touch CONNECT.

Modify a VPN

- Touch the Home key > Settings > More > VPN.
- Touch beside the VPN that you want to modify.
- 3. Edit the VPN settings and then touch SAVE.

Phone Calls

You can place calls from the Phone app, the Contacts app, or other apps or widgets that display contact information. Wherever you see a phone number, you can usually touch it to dial.

Placing and Ending Calls

Place a Call by Dialing

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > \sqrt{-.
- Touch and enter the phone number or the contact name with the dialpad.
 Touch to delete incorrect digits.
 - NOTE:

As you enter the phone number or the contact name, your phone searches for matching information in your contacts. If you see the number and contact you want to call, touch it to place the call immediately.

Touch below the keypad to dial.

You can also touch the search box at the top of the **Phone** app screen and enter the phone number or contact name you want to call. Touch the matching contact or **Call** [number] to place the call.

NOTE:

To make an international call, touch and hold the 0 key to enter the plus (+) symbol. Next, enter the country code, followed by the city/area code and then the phone number.

NOTE:

touch ugain.

End a Call

During a call, touch on the screen.

Answering or Rejecting Calls

When you receive a phone call, the incoming call screen opens, displaying the caller ID or the information about the caller that you've entered in the Contacts app. You can answer or reject the call, or reject it with a text message.

Answer a Call

When you receive a phone call, drag over to answer the call.

- or -

If the screen is unlocked, touch ANSWER to answer the call.



To silence the ringer before answering the call, press either end of the **Volume** key.

Reject a Call

When you receive a phone call, drag over to reject the call.

You can also drag over to reject the call and select a preset text message or edit one to send to the caller.

- or -

If the screen is unlocked, touch DISMISS to reject the call.



To edit the preset text response from within the Phone app, touch in the top search field and select **Settings > Quick responses**.

Working With the Call History

The call history is a list of all the calls you've placed, received, or missed. It provides a convenient way to redial a number, return a call, or add a number to your contacts. To open the call history, you can touch the **Home** key > \checkmark > \ddagger (in the top search field) > **Call History**.

Place a Call From the Call History

- 1. Open the call history.
- Touch beside a listing to call back.



You can touch MISSED or ALL to filter the records by call type.

Add a Number From Call History as a Contact

- Open the call history.
- 2. Touch the contact icon in front of a number.
- Touch on the contact information tab.
- To add the number to an existing contact, touch a contact in the list. To add a new contact, touch Create new contact.

Take Other Actions on a Call History Entry

Open the call history, touch a listing and then touch **Call details** to view more call information.

Touch to delete the entry.

- While viewing the call details, touch : > Edit number before call to edit the number in the dialer before calling it.
- Touch the contact icon in front of the entry to open the contact information tab from the bottom, where you can send a message, call back, edit the contact, add the contact to favourites, or add the number to contacts.



Touch : > Clear call history in the call history screen to delete all history records.

Calling Your Contacts

- Touch the Home key > \ Your favourite contacts and frequently called contacts are displayed in the tab.
- Touch a contact to place the call, or touch or swipe to the tab to view all
 your contacts, touch a contact and then touch its number to make a call.

Checking Voicemail

If you have set the phone to divert calls to voicemail, callers can leave voicemail messages when they cannot reach you. Here's how to check the messages they left.

- Touch the Home key > \(\subseteq \) > \(\bar{\text{\$\text{\$0\$}}} \).
- Touch and hold the 1 key in the dialer. If prompted, enter your voicemail password.
- 3. Follow the voice prompts to listen to and manage your voicemail messages.

NOTE:

See $\underline{\it Set Voicemail}$ for how to set your voicemail service. For detailed information, please contact the service provider.

Using Options During a Call

During a call, you will see a number of onscreen options. Touch an option to select it.

- Touch to turn on or off the speaker.
- Touch to mute or unmute your microphone.
- Touch *** to switch to the keypad when you need to enter a code (for example, the PIN for your voicemail or bank account) during the call.
- Touch II to put the call on hold.
- Touch to make another call separately from the first call, which is put on hold.
- Touch $\hat{\lambda}$ to merge the separate calls into a single conference call.
- Touch for more call options. You can transfer the calls.
- Touch On hold at the bottom to put the caller you are speaking to on hold, and switch to the other call that has been put on hold.
- Touch to end the current call.

₩ARNING!

Because of higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

Managing Multi-party Calls

When the call waiting and three-way call features are available, you can switch between two calls or set up a conference call.



The call waiting and three-way call features need network support and may result in

additional charges. Please contact your service provider for more information.

Switch Between Current Calls

When you're on a call and another call comes in, your phone screen informs you and displays the caller ID.

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

- Drag over to answer the call. (This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.)
- Drag over to reject the call.



You can also drag over to reject the call and select a preset text message or edit one to send to the caller.

To switch between two calls:

Touch On hold at the bottom of the screen.

Set Up a Conference Call

With this feature, you can talk to two people at the same time.

- Place the first call.
- Once you have established the connection, touch number. (This puts the first caller on hold.)
- 3. When you're connected to the second party, touch $\,\mathcal{L}.\,$

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all callers are disconnected.



Adjusting Your Call Settings

Set Contact Display Options

You can set the order of the contacts displayed in the tab of the **Phone** app.

- Touch the Home key > \(\simeq \) > \(\frac{1}{2} \) (in the top search field) > Settings > Display options.
- Touch Sort by or Name format to set the order of the contacts and the format of the contact names.

Set Sound and Vibration

Set the sound and vibration for incoming calls as well as dialpad sounds.

- Touch the Home key > \(\struct \) > \(\struct \) (in the top search field) > Settings > Sounds and vibration.
- 2. Touch the following options you want to configure.
 - ► Touch **Phone ringtone** to select the ringtone for incoming call notification.
 - Check Also vibrate for calls to enable vibration for incoming call notification.
 - Check Dialpad tones to play sounds when you touch the dialpad keys.

Edit Ouick Response to Rejected Callers

- Touch the Home key > \(\simeq \) > \(\simeq \) (in the top search field) > Settings > Quick responses.
- 2. Touch a text message to edit it.

Internet Call Settings

To add an Internet calling account:

- Touch the Home key > \(\) > \(\) (in the top search field) > Settings > Calls > Calling accounts.
- 2. Touch SIP accounts and touch ## at the top right.
- Follow the instructions from your Internet calling service provider to configure the settings for your account.
- Touch SAVE.

To configure which calls use Internet calling:

You can configure your phone to use Internet calling (via Wi-Fi or mobile data) to place all calls or just calls to Internet calling addresses.

- Touch the Home key > i (in the top search field) > Settings > Calls > Calling accounts.
- 2. Touch Make calls with.
- 3. Select the option you need.
 - ▶ If you want to use Internet calling for all calls, touch your SIP account.
 - If you only want to use Internet calling for calls to Internet call accounts, touch your mobile network.
 - If you want to make a choice each time you make a call, touch Ask first.



To select which accounts can make calls, touch **All calling accounts** in the Calling accounts screen and switch on or off the accounts.

To automatically stop Internet calls:

You can configure the phone to automatically stop Internet calls when the other party does not support Internet calling.

- Touch the Home key > \(\simeq \) > \(\text{in the top search field} \) > Settings > Calls > Calling accounts.
- 2. Touch Use SIP calling > Only for SIP calls.

To configure your phone to receive Internet calls:

By default, your phone is configured to make Internet calls, but not to ensure that you will receive them. But you can configure your phone to listen for Internet calls made to an Internet calling account you added to your phone.

- Touch the Home key > (in the top search field) > Settings > Calls > Calling accounts.
- Check Receive Incoming calls. Checking this setting will reduce your battery life between charges.

Set Voicemail

- 2. Touch Voicemail to configure voicemail settings.
 - Touch Service to select the voicemail service provider. Your carrier is the default.
 - Touch Setup > Voicemail number to edit the voicemail number.
 - Touch Sound to select the notification sound for new voicemails.
 - Check Vibrate to enable vibration for notification.

Use Fixed Dialling Numbers

Fixed Dialling Numbers (FDN) allows you to restrict outgoing calls to a limited set of phone numbers.

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > \(\simeq \) : (in the top search field) > **Settings > Calls**.
- 2. Touch Fixed dialling numbers and the following options are available.
 - ▶ Enable FDN: Input the PIN2 code to enable the FDN feature.

- Change PIN2: Change the PIN2 code for FDN access.
- ► FDN list: Manage the FDN list.



The PIN2 code is provided by your carrier. Entering an incorrect PIN2 code more times than allowed can get your micro-SIM card locked. Contact the service provider for assistance.

Forward Incoming Calls

Call forwarding feature allows you to forward your incoming calls to another phone number.

- Touch an available option (Always forward, When busy, When unanswered, or When unreachable) to enable it.

Set Caller ID and Call Waiting

- Touch Caller ID to choose whether your number is displayed when someone receives your outgoing call. Or check Call waiting to get notified of incoming calls during a call.



Please contact the service provider to check whether the caller ID and call waiting features are available.

Bar Certain Calls

Call barring feature allows you to forbid certain types of calls from your phone.

- 2. Set the restriction of specific types of calls from your phone.

Set Speed Dials

You can touch and hold the 1 \sim 9 keys from the dialer to call the corresponding speed dial number.

The number key 1 is reserved to speed dial your voicemail.

To assign a speed dial key:

- Touch the Home key > \(\struct > \) (in the top search field) > Settings > Calls > Speed dial.
- 2. Touch a speed dial key.
- 3. Enter a phone number or select one from the contact list.
- 4. Touch OK.

Contacts

You can add contacts on your phone and synchronize them with the contacts in your Google account or other accounts that support contact syncing.

To see your contacts, touch the **Home** key > ... From there, you can touch the tabs on the top of the screen to quickly switch to favourite contacts.

Checking Contact Details

- Touch the Home key > and touch the ALL CONTACTS tab to access your contact list.
- 2. Scroll through the list to view all your contacts.
- Touch a contact to view its details.
- NOTE:

If you have a lot of contacts stored, you'll see a slider on the right side of the screen. Drag the slider to the initial letter you need.

Adding a New Contact

- Touch the Home key >
- Touch to add a new contact.
- Choose where to save the contact. If a sync account is selected, the contacts will be synced automatically with your account online.

- Enter the contact name, phone numbers, email addresses, and other information.
- Touch \(\sqrt{} \) to save the contact.

Setting Up Your Own Profile

You can create your own name card in your phone.

- Touch the Home key > and touch the ALL CONTACTS tab.
- Touch Set up my profile.
 If a profile has already been set up, touch the listing beside ME and touch
- Edit your profile information.
- 4. Touch \(\sqrt{.}

Importing, Exporting, and Sharing Contacts

You can import/export contacts from/to your micro-SIM card, the phone storage or the microSDXC card. This is especially useful when you need to transfer contacts between different devices. You can also quickly share contacts using Bluetooth, Google Drive, Wi-Fi Direct, Gmail, Android Beam (NFC), Messaging, etc.

Import Contacts From the micro-SIM Card

- Touch the Home key >
- 2. Touch * > Import/Export > Import from SIM card.
- 3. Select an account in which to save the contacts.

4. Check the contacts you need and then touch <

Import Contacts From the Phone Storage or the microSDXC Card

- Touch the Home key >
- 2. Touch > Import/Export > Import from .vcf file.
- 3. Select an account in which to save the contacts.
- Touch and find the vCard file(s) on the phone storage or microSDXC card and touch one to import contacts.
 - NOTE:

Touch : > Show SD card if needed to find your vCard file(s).

Export Contacts to the micro-SIM Card

- 1. Touch the **Home** key >
- 2. Touch : > Import/Export > Export to SIM card.
- 3. Check the contacts you need and then touch \checkmark .

Export Contacts to the Phone Storage or the microSDXC Card

- Touch the Home key >
- 2. Touch > Import/Export > Export to .vcf file.
- Touch = and select the directory in which the vCard file will be saved. Touch
 Show SD card if needed.
- 4. Edit the file name if needed and touch SAVE to create the file.

Share Contacts

- Touch the Home key > and touch the ALL CONTACTS tab.
- 2. Touch and hold the contact you want to share.
- 3. Check more contacts if needed and then touch : > Share.
- Choose how to share the contacts. Options depend on the applications and services installed.

Working With Favourite Contacts

In the favourite contacts tab, you can find your favourite contacts and frequently contacted contacts.

Add a Contact to Favourites

You can add the contacts you use frequently to **FAVOURITES** so that you can find them quickly.

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > and touch the **ALL CONTACTS** tab.
- Touch a contact and then touch at the top.

Remove a Contact From Favourites

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > and touch the **FAVOURITES** tab.
- Touch a favourite contact and then touch at the top.

Searching for a Contact

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > ==.
- 2. Touch Q at the top of the screen.
- Input the contact name or any information the contact has to search for it. The contacts matched will be listed.

Editing Contacts

Edit Contact Details

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > =
- Touch a contact you need to edit and then touch .
- Edit the contact and touch

Set a Ringtone for a Contact

Assign a special ringtone to a contact, so you know who is calling when you hear the ringtone.

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > =
- 2. Touch a contact you want to set a ringtone for and then touch .
- Touch > Set ringtone.
- 4. Select a ringtone you like and touch OK.
- Touch ✓.

Delete Contacts

- Touch the Home key > and touch the ALL CONTACTS tab.
- 2. Touch and hold the contact you want to remove.
- Check more contacts if needed and then touch > Delete.
- 4. Touch OK to confirm.

Join Contacts

As your phone synchronizes with multiple online accounts, you may see duplicate entries for the same contact. You can merge all the separate information of a contact into one entry in the contacts list.

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > \(\begin{align*}
 \begin{align*}
 \begin{a
- 2. Touch a contact entry to display the contact's details and then touch ...
- Touch > Merge.
- 4. Touch the contact whose information you want to join with the first entry.
- Touch ✓.

The information from the second contact is added to the first contact, and the second contact is no longer displayed in the contacts list.

You can repeat these steps to join another contact to the main contact.

Separate Contact Information

If contact information from different sources was joined in error, you can separate the information back into individual contacts on your phone.

1. Touch the **Home** key > \(\begin{align*}

\begin{a

- 2. Touch a contact entry you have merged and want to separate, and then touch
- 3. Touch : > Separate.
- 4. Touch **OK** to confirm.

Web Accounts

Adding or Removing Accounts

You can add multiple Google accounts and Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync® accounts. You may also add other kinds of accounts depending on the apps installed on your phone.

Add an Account

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Accounts > Add account.
- 2. Touch the type of account you want to add.
- Follow the onscreen steps to enter the information about the account. Most accounts require a username and password, but the details may vary. You may also need to obtain some information from IT support or your system administrator.

When the account is successfully added, it is displayed in the **Accounts** menu.

Remove an Account

Removing an account will delete it and all information associated with it from your phone, such as emails and contacts.

- 1. Touch the Home key > > Settings > Accounts.
- 2. Touch the account category and then touch the account.
- 3. Touch > Remove account > REMOVE ACCOUNT.

Configuring Account Sync

Configure Auto Sync Setting

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Accounts.
- 2. Touch 3 and check or uncheck Auto-sync data.
 - When automatic sync is turned on, changes you make to information on your phone or on the web are automatically synced with each other.
 - When automatic sync is turned off, you need to sync manually to collect emails, updates, or other recent information.

Sync Manually

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Accounts.
- 2. Touch the account category and then the account you want to sync.
- 3. Touch * > Sync now. Or touch the types of information you want to sync.

Change an Account's Sync Settings

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Accounts.
- Touch the account category and then the account. The Sync screen appears, showing a list of information the account can sync.
- When auto-sync is enabled, switch on or off items as you need. The types of information switched on on the phone and the web will be kept in auto-sync.

When auto-sync is disabled, touch a listing to sync that type of information between the phone and the web.

Email

Touch in the home screen and select **Email**. Use it to receive and send emails

from your webmail or other accounts, using POP3 or IMAP, or access your Exchange ActiveSync account for your corporate email needs.

Setting Up the First Email Account

- 1. When you open Email for the first time, enter your email address and password.
- 2. Touch **NEXT** to let the phone retrieve the network parameters automatically.
 - NOTE:

You can also enter these details manually by touching **MANUAL SETUP** or when automatic setup fails.

3. Follow the on-screen instructions to finish the setup.

Your phone will show the inbox of the email account and start to download email messages.

Checking Your Emails

Your phone can automatically check for new emails at the interval you set when setting up the account.

You can also check new emails manually by dragging down on the message list.

Responding to an Email

You can reply to or forward a message that you receive. You can also delete messages and manage them in other ways.

Reply to or Forward an Email

Open the email you want to reply to or forward from the Inbox.

- 2. Do the following as you need:
 - To reply to the sender, touch
 - To reply to the sender and all recipients of the original email, touch
 or > Reply all.
 - ► To forward the email to someone else, touch → or : > Forward.
- Edit your message and touch

Mark an Fmail as Unread

You can return a read email to the unread state - for example, to remind yourself to read it again later. You can also mark a batch of emails as unread.

- While reading a message, touch
- While in a message list (for instance, the Inbox), touch the sender images beside the messages and then touch

Delete an Fmail

You can delete an email from its folder. You can also delete a batch of emails.

- While reading a message, touch
- While in a message list (for instance, the Inbox), slide a message left or right to delete it, or touch the sender images beside the messages and then touch
- NOTE:

If you accidentally delete one, touch UNDO to retrieve it.

Writing and Sending an Email

Open your email Inbox and touch .



✓ NOTE-

If you have more than one email account added on the phone, touch the sender line to select the account you want to use for sending the message.

2. Enter a contact name or email address in the To field. Separate each recipient with a comma.



To send a carbon copy or blind carbon copy to other recipients, touch \vee to open the Cc/Bcc field and enter the contact names or email addresses.

- 3. Enter the email subject and compose the email text.
- Touch Attach file to add audio files, images, videos and other types of files as attachments.
- 5. Touch at the top right of the screen to send the message.

Adding and Editing Email Accounts

Add an Email Account

After setting up your first email account (see Setting Up the First Email Account), you can add more email accounts and manage them separately.

- 1. Open Email to get the Inbox screen.
- Touch = > Settings > Add account.
- 3. Follow the prompts to set up the account as you did with the first one.

Edit an Email Account

You can change a number of settings for an account, including how often you check for email, how you're notified of new mails, your email signature, and details about the servers the account uses to send and receive mails.

- 1. Open Email to get the Inbox screen.
- Touch => Settings and touch the account whose settings you want to change.

Changing General Email Settings

General settings apply to all email accounts you add.

- 1. Open Email to get the Inbox screen.
- Touch ≡ > Settings > General settings.

Messaging

You can use Messaging to exchange text messages (SMS) and multimedia messages (MMS).

Opening the Messaging Screen

The **Messaging** screen opens, where you can create a new message, search for messages, or open an ongoing message thread.

- Touch to write a new text or multimedia message.
- Touch Q to search for a message using keywords.
- Touch

 to view all your messages, unread messages, or favourite messages.
- Touch an existing message thread to open the conversation you've had with a certain number.

Sending a Message

- On the Messaging screen, touch at the bottom right corner.
- 2. Add recipients by one of the following ways.
 - Touch the To field and manually enter the recipient's number or the contact name. If the phone presents a few suggestions, touch the one you want to add.
 - Select recipients from your contacts or call log by touching

- 3. Touch the Type message field and enter the message text.
- If you want to send a multimedia message, touch to add a message subject, pictures, audios, videos or other files to the message.
- 5. Touch



You can also include email addresses as recipients for a multimedia message.



Do not add a message subject or any attachment if you want to send a text message. Otherwise you may be charged for a multimedia message.

Replying to a Message

Messages you receive are appended to existing threads of the same number. If the new message comes from a new number, a new thread is created.

- On the Messaging screen, touch the thread that has the message you want to reply to.
- Type your reply in the text box at the bottom. You can touch if you want to reply with an MMS.
- 3. Touch >.

Forwarding a Message

 On the Messaging screen, touch the thread that has the message you want to forward.

- 2. Touch and hold the message and then touch Forward in the menu that opens.
- 3. Enter a recipient for the message and edit the content if you want.
- 4. Touch >.

Changing Message Settings

Touch \equiv > Settings in the Messaging screen to change the messaging settings.

Web Browser

Use **Chrome** to view web pages and search for information.

Opening the Browser

Chrome also opens when you touch a web link - for example, in an email or a text message.

Open a Web Page or Search the Web

- 1. Open the Chrome app.
- 2. Touch the address box at the top of the web page.
- Enter the address (URL) of a web page or enter terms you want to search for.
 You can also touch to search by voice.
- Touch a URL or search suggestion or touch enter key on the keyboard to open the web page or search results.
- NOTE:

Touch [♣] > × if you want to stop opening the page.

Set the Homepage

Your homepage shows when you touch the Home button on the left of the address box. Follow the steps below to edit the homepage.

1. Open the Chrome app.

- 2. Touch Settings > Homepage.
- 3. Slide the switch to the On position if it is turned off.
- 4. Touch Open this page.
- 5. Edit the homepage URL and touch Save.

Using Multiple Browser Tabs

You can open several web pages at the same time (one page in each tab) and switch between them freely.

To open a new browser tab:

Touch * > New tab. A new browser tab opens.

To switch between tabs:

- Touch the Recent apps key. The opened tabs appear together with your recent apps.
 - NOTE:

You can choose to separate the tabs and recent apps in the Chrome settings.

- 2. Swipe vertically to scroll through the list of opened tabs.
- 3. Touch the thumbnail of the tab you want to open.
- NOTE:

Swipe a thumbnail horizontally or touch its X to close the tab.

Downloading Files

Touch and hold an image or a link to a file or to another web page.

In the menu that opens, touch Save image or Save link.

The downloaded files are saved to your phone or the microSDXC card. You can view or open them in the **Downloads** app.

Changing Chrome Settings

You can configure a number of settings to customize the way you browse the web, including several that you can use to control your privacy.

To open the Chrome settings screen, touch * > Settings.

Camera

You can use your phone to take photos and record videos. Photos and videos are stored on the microSDXC card you have installed or in the phone storage. You can copy them to your computer or access them in the **Gallery** app.

Capturing a Photo



When the phone is in sleep mode or in the lock screen, press the **Volume up** key twice quickly to open the front camera, or press the **Volume down** key twice quickly to open the back camera.

Aim the camera at the subject and make any necessary adjustment. Auto camera mode is used by default.



Number	Function
1	Switch between the front and back cameras.
2	Set a time delay before the camera takes a picture automatically after you touch the shutter icon.
3	Change the flash setting, only available for the back camera.
4	Turn on or off the HDR feature.
5	Change the camera settings.
6	View pictures and videos you have taken.
7	Capture a picture.
8	Capture a video clip.
9	Select the manual or auto camera mode, or use filters, scene, smile detection, interval capture, panorama, or multi-exposure modes. Some camera modes are only available for the back camera.



Keep a safe distance when using the flash. Do not point the flash towards the eyes of people or animals.

NOTE:

You can spread or pinch on the screen to zoom in or out before taking pictures.

- Touch the area where you want the camera to focus, or leave the camera to autofocus on the center of the image.
- 4. Lightly touch .

Recording a Video



Aim the camera at the subject. You can touch any area on the screen that you want the camcorder to focus on before and during recording.



You can spread or pinch on the screen to zoom in or out before and during recording.

Touch to start recording. You can also touch to pause or resume recording.



While the recording is in progress, you can touch to save the frame as a separate photo.

4. Touch to stop recording.

Using Manual Camera Mode

You can use manual camera mode to adjust more camera options for you photo such as ISO, white balance, exposure, etc.

- 2. Touch Manual.
- 3. Aim the camera at the subject and you can make the following adjustments.
 - ▶ Drag to any area on the screen that you want to focus on.
 - ▶ Drag to any area on the screen where you want the camera to meter

exposure so as to adjust the photo brightness.

- ► Touch to show the grid or the golden spiral, or hide it.
- ► Touch to enable or disable the level guide.
- ► Touch to change white balance scenario or leave it at Auto.
- ► Touch 50 to select ISO level or leave it at Auto.
- ► Touch to adjust the photo exposure.
- 4. Touch the shutter icon to take the photo.

Using Other Camera Modes

Besides capturing photos and videos in the traditional way, your camera app offers other powerful and interesting camera modes. Touch **Mode** in the viewfinder screen to find them all.

- Filters: Use special filters to capture pictures.
- Scene: Select a scene to capture pictures.
- Smile detection: Capture pictures automatically when detecting smiles.
- Interval capture: Capture time lapse pictures at the interval you select.
- Panorama: Capture panorama pictures.
- Multi-exposure: Capture two pictures for collage.
- NOTE:

Some camera modes are not available for the front camera.

Customizing Camera/Camcorder Settings

Before capturing a photo or a video, you can touch to open the following camera and camcorder setting options.

NOTE:

Some camera and video options will change according to different camera modes.

CAMERA

- ▶ Picture size: Set the image size for your photo.
- Full screen: Set the viewfinder screen as full screen or not when the back camera is in use.
- Point-and-shoot: Available for the front camera. When this feature is enabled, you can touch the viewfinder screen to take a photo using the front camera.
- Shutter sound: Turn on or off the shutter sound.
- ▶ OR code reader: Read the QR code in the viewfinder screen.
- Location tag: Select whether to store the location information in your captured photos and videos.
- Review: Select whether to review the picture after you shot it. You can also set the review time.
- Volume key control: Use the Volume key as the shutter button or to zoom in and out.
- Save original image: Choose to save the original images when taking HDR pictures.
- Storage location: Touch Save location to change the storage location for captured photos and videos.
- Restore defaults: Restore default camera and video settings.

VIDEO

- Video quality: Set the quality for your video.
- Time lapse: Set the time interval between each frame when you shot time lapse videos with the back camera.
- Focus lock when recording: Select whether to lock the focus point on the center of the screen during video recording using the back camera.
- Location tag: Select whether to store the location information in your captured photos and videos.
- Storage location: Touch Save location to change the storage location for captured photos and videos.
- ▶ Restore defaults: Restore default camera and camcorder settings.

Gallery

Opening Gallery

Working With Albums

When you open Gallery, all pictures and videos on your phone are displayed in a number of albums. Swipe left or right to see them all.

To view album contents:

Touch an album to view the pictures and videos it contains.

To share albums, pictures, or videos:

- Touch and hold an album to select it or touch and hold an item after you open an album to select a picture or a video.
- 2. Touch more items that you want to share.
- 3. Touch and select how you want to share the items.

To delete albums, pictures, or videos:

- Touch and hold an album to select it or touch and hold an item after you open an album to select a picture or a video.
- 2. Touch more items that you want to delete.
- 3. Touch **□** > **OK**.

Working With Pictures

Touch a picture in an album to view the picture in full screen.



When viewing a picture in full screen, the following features are available.

- Swipe horizontally to see more pictures or videos.
- Pinch a picture or video to make it smaller. You'll then see a filmstrip-style view
 of all your pictures and videos in a row. Swipe left or right to scan through them
 all.

NOTE:

You can delete a picture or video by swiping it up or down in the filmstrip view. If you accidentally delete one, touch **UNDO** to retrieve it.

- Double-tap the picture, or pinch two fingers together or spread them apart to zoom out or in.
- Touch to edit the picture.
- Touch and select a method to share the picture.
- Touch to access more options. You can delete, edit, rotate, crop the picture, set it as the wallpaper or contact photo, check its details, browse the album contents in a slideshow, or print the picture.
- Touch to return to the album.

NOTE:

Some options may not be available for certain albums or pictures.

Retouching Your Pictures

You can edit any photos you took and some other pictures in Gallery.

- Touch or > Edit while viewing a picture in full screen.
- 2. Touch an edit option along the bottom of the screen and edit the picture.



Apply effects, such as punch, vintage, black/white, bleach, and instant on the picture.



Select a frame for the picture.



Crop, straighten, rotate, mirror, or doodle the picture.



Apply and adjust effects such as exposure, vignette, contrast, and shadows on the picture.

- 4. Touch **SAVE** to save the picture.

Playing Videos

- Touch an album in the gallery and then touch the thumbnail of a video.
- Touch at the center and select a player to start playing. Touch the video to view the playback controls.

Play Music

The **Play Music** application works with Google Music, Google's online music store and streaming service. You can stream via mobile data or Wi-Fi and listen to your favourite songs that you've added to your online Google Music library. You can also play audio files you've copied directly to your phone from a computer.



The availability of Google Music is dependent on your region. If it is not available, or you don't have a mobile data or Wi-Fi connection, you can only play music stored on your phone.

Playing Your Music

Touch the **Home** key >

Play Music. If you are prompted, select an account to access its online music library.

The app searches your online library and your phone for music and playlists before displaying your combined music library, organized by **PLAYLISTS**, **GENRES**, **ARTISTS**. **ALBUMS** and **SONGS**. You can touch

ARTISTS, ALBUMS and SONGS. You can touch > My Library to view all the music and playlists. To change views of your library, swipe left or right.

Touch a song to play it. When the song is playing, touch the summary information at the bottom to display the playback screen.



Number	Function
1	Song and artist information. Touch or drag down to return to the music library.
2	Album artwork (if available). Slide left/right to switch to the next/previous song in the playlist.
3	Toggle repeat mode. You can repeat the current track, repeat the current playlist, or turn off repeat.
4	Give the song a thumbs-up.

Number	Function
5	Playback control. Skip songs, or pause and resume playback.
6	Give the song a thumbs-down.
7	Turn on or off shuffle.
8	Drag the progress bar to jump to any part of the song.
9	Touch to see the current playlist (queue).
10	Get more options.

You can still control the music when you are not in the playback screen.

- In the music library of the Play Music app, touch the summary information at the bottom of the screen to restore the playback screen.
- In other apps, flick down the notification panel. Touch the song title to restore the playback screen, or just pause/ resume playback or skip songs.
- When the screen is locked, the song information, album cover as well as
 playback control is displayed on the screen. You can pause/resume playback
 or skip songs.

Managing Playlists

Create playlists to organize your music files into sets of songs, so that you can play the songs you like in the order you prefer.

To create a playlist or add a song to a playlist:

Touch next to a song and select Add to playlist.

To remove a song from a playlist:

- Touch > My Library in the Play Music app.
- 2. Touch PLAYLISTS and open a playlist.
- 3. Touch next to a song in the playlist.
- 4. Touch Remove from playlist.

To delete a playlist:

- 1. Touch > My Library in the Play Music app.
- Touch PLAYLISTS.
- 3. Touch next to the playlist you want to delete.
- 4. Touch Delete > OK.
- NOTE:

Certain automatically created playlists such as Last added cannot be deleted.

Video Player

Use the Video app to manage your video library and watch videos.

Opening the Video Library

Touch in the home screen and select **Video** to view your video library, where your video files are displayed in a list.

Swipe up or down to find the video you want. You can also touch ot to search for video files, or touch : > View or Sort to change the display mode or sort the list.

Playing and Controlling Videos

Touch a video in the video library to play it. Touch the screen to show the playback controls. You can control the video and audio or carry out other operations.

- Touch the play/pause button at the bottom to pause or resume the playback.
- Slide horizontally on the screen to rewind or fast forward.
- Slide vertically on the right or left part of the screen to adjust volume or brightness.
- · Pinch or spread on the screen to zoom out or in.
- Touch or to skip to the previous or the next video.
- Touch to change the video ratio.
- Touch to rotate the video.
- Touch to capture a screenshot.

- Touch to hide the control panel.
- Touch to play the video in a small window and continue with other tasks on the phone.
- Touch $\sqrt{}$ to trim the video.

Managing Video Files

Delete Video Clips

- 1. Touch : > Delete in the video library.
- 2. Check the videos you want to delete.
- Touch Delete > OK.

Share Video Clips

- 1. Touch : > Share in the video library.
- 2. Check the videos you want to share.
- Touch Share and select how you want to share them.

Trim a Video Clip

- 1. Touch a video to start playing it.
- 2. Touch on the right side of the progress bar.
- Drag the two tabs on the progress bar to select the portion you want to keep.
 If necessary, touch to preview the selected portion.

4. Touch The trimmed video is saved as a new video file.

FM Radio

With the FM radio, you can search for radio channels, listen to them, and save them on your phone. Note that the quality of the radio broadcast depends on the coverage of the radio station in your area. The wired headset works as an antenna, so always connect the headset when using the radio. When you receive an incoming call while listening to the radio, the radio will be turned off.

Scanning and Saving Channels

- Plug in a wired headset and touch the Home key > > FM Radio.
- Touch > Scan. Your phone scans for all available channels and saves them
 to the All channels list.



Touch = > All channels to view the list of saved channels.

Listening to FM Radio

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > > **FM Radio** while the headset is connected.
- 2. Touch > All channels and select a channel.

You can also drag the red line along the frequency panel or touch or to switch to other channels.



- Touch to add the channel to favourites. Favourite channels are put on the FM Radio main screen. Touch to view all favourite channels.
- . You can save at most 16 channels to favourites.
- Touch to listen to the radio through the phone speaker.

Editing a Saved Channel

- Open the FM Radio app and touch > All channels to display the list of saved channels
- Touch and hold a channel and select Rename or Delete, or touch the star to the right of a channel to add it to favourites.

Other Options and Settings

To turn off FM radio automatically:

Touch > Auto off and select the time you want to turn off the radio.

A count-down clock appears above the frequency and the radio is turned off when the clock counts down to 0:00.

To turn off FM radio immediately:

Touch the switch at the top of the screen.

NOTE:

Touch = > Exit to close the FM radio app.

To record the FM radio program:

Touch > Record/Stop Recording to record the current radio program. The recorded files are saved in the phone storage or microSDXC card.

Sound Recorder

Sound Recorder enables you to record voice memos and listen to them whenever you like.

Recording a Voice Memo

- Touch the Home key >
 Sound Recorder.
- Slide the HQ switch to turn on or off high quality recording.
- 3. Touch to start recording. During recording, you can do the following:

 - ► Touch X to cancel the recording.
- 4. Touch to stop recording. The memo is automatically saved.

If you don't want to save the memo after recording it, touch To > OK to delete it.

Playing a Voice Memo

To play a memo you just recorded:



To play any saved memo:

- 1. Touch at the top right of the screen to see all recordings.
- 2. Touch the title of a memo to play it.



Touch = next to a memo to delete, rename, share, trim it, check its file information, add a tag, or set it as your phone ringtone or notification ringtone.

More Apps

Calculator

Touch the **Home** key > (a) > Calculator to use the phone's convenient built-in calculator for some basic as well as advanced mathematical equations.

NOTE:

Slide left while holding the phone upright, or hold the phone on its side, to access advanced buttons.

Clock

Set a New Alarm

- 1. Touch the tab in the Clock app.
- Touch an existing alarm to configure it, or touch the at the bottom of the screen to create a new alarm.
- 3. Set the time and touch **OK**. Then edit label, repeat, alarm sound and vibration.

NOTES:

- To enable or disable existing alarms directly, just touch the switches on the right side.
- Touch > Settings to set more alarm options in the Alarms section.

Check World Time

Touch the tab in the **Clock** app to check local time around the world as well as the next alarm.

Touch at the bottom to add other cities.

Use the Stopwatch and Countdown

Touch the $\overline{\bigcirc}$ or X tab in the **Clock** app to use the stopwatch or the countdown timer.

Stopwatch allows you to record lap times, while countdown allows you to set a time and count down to zero.

Downloads

The **Downloads** app keeps a record of the files you have downloaded using apps such as **Chrome** or **Email**.

- Touch a file to open it with the appropriate applications.
- · Touch and hold a file to delete or share it.

File Manager

Quickly access all of your images, videos, audio clips, and other types of files on your phone storage, the microSDXC card and the connected USB device.

- Touch at the top right to find the file you need by category.
- Touch at the top right to browse folders and files.
- Touch at the top left and select your phone storage, the microSDXC card or the connected USB device.
- Touch and hold an item to access option icons such as Copy, Move, Share, or Delete.
- To copy or move an item, navigate to a new location and touch Paste.
- Touch to create a new folder in the current directory.

Google Apps

Open the Google apps to use Google services.



Some contents or Google services may not be available in your region.

- Calendar: Organize your time and reminds you of important events.
- Chrome: Use the Chrome app to browse the Internet and get your bookmarks, browsing history, and more synced with your Google account.
- Drive: Store files on Google servers for free after you sign in to your Google account. You can access them on your computers, your phones and other devices, share them, or collaborate with others.
- Gmall: Send and receive emails via your Gmail account or other personal email accounts.
- Google: Use Google search or get information when you need it with Google Now.

- . Hangouts: Chat with Google+ friends or send text or multimedia messages.
- Keep: Create, share, and collaborate notes quickly and easily.
- Maps: Find your place and find your way in the world.
- News & Weather: View weather forecasts and news stories about common topics. You can also customize the news topics that are displayed.
- Photos: Manage photos on the phone and your Google account.
- Play Movies & TV: Purchase, download and watch the latest and your favourite
 movies and TV shows.
- . Play Music: Play music on the phone and on your Google account.
- Play Store: Buy and download apps, games, and other content from the Google Play Store.
- Translate: Type, speak or point the camera at text to translate with Google Translate.
- Voice Search; Search for information with your voice.
- YouTube: Watch video clips from YouTube.com, or upload your own and share with the world.

Settings

Wireless and Networks

Wi-Fi

When Wi-Fi is on, touch * Advanced > WI-FI Direct in the WI-FI menu to share data between two devices via Wi-Fi directly. See *Using Wi-Fi Direct®*.

Bluetooth

Data Usage

Touch the **Home** key > Settings > Data usage to manage mobile data use.

Touch the **Mobile data** or **Set mobile data limit** switches to turn on or off mobile data or mobile data limit.

You can check how much data has been used during the time cycle you set, set mobile data limit and warning, see what apps have been using mobile data, or restrict background data for individual apps.

NOTE:

The data usage is measured by your phone, and your carrier's data usage accounting may differ.

Touch > Network restrictions to select Wi-Fi networks that are mobile hotspots.

Data usage on recognized mobile hotspots will be restricted to avoid high mobile data bills.

Flight Mode

Touch the **Home** key > (iii) > **Settings > More** and slide the switch beside **Flight mode** to turn flight mode on or off. All the phone's radios that transmit voice or data are turned off when flight mode is on.

Display

- Home Screen: Swipe right on the leftmost home screen to open your favourite app.
- Favourite Home screen app: Select the app opened when swiping right on the leftmost home screen.

- Lockscreen shortcuts: Show shortcut icons on the lock screen. You can swipe from a shortcut icon at the bottom of the lock screen to open the related app or feature.
- Edit Lockscreen shortcuts: Touch a lock screen shortcut to change or remove it, or touch Add shortcut to add one.
- Double tap to wake: Double-tap on the screen to turn it on when the phone is in sleep mode.
- . Brightness level: Set the brightness of the display.
- Adaptive brightness: Automatically adjust screen brightness.
- Touch key light duration: This feature lets you control the backlight of the touch keys (the Home key, the Back key, and the Recent apps key). Choose one of the following options to set the backlight duration.
 - 5 seconds / 30 seconds / 1 minute: The touch keys light for 5 seconds, 30 seconds or 1 minute each time you touch the touch keys while the screen is turned on.
 - Always off: Turn off the touch keys backlight.
 - Always on: Keep the touch keys backlight on while the screen is turned on.
- Wallpaper: Select a background image or animation for the home screen and the lock screen.
- Sleep: Set the length of time of inactivity before the screen turns off automatically.
- Daydream: Manage the Daydream function. When Daydream is enabled, clock, news and weather, photos or animations will be displayed as a screensaver.
- Pulse notification light: Flash the indicator light to notify you of missed calls,

new messages, and other events.

- Font size: Set the font size of the text on the screen.
- When device is rotated: Select whether the screen contents should rotate
 when the phone is rotated.

Sound & Notification

Touch the **Home** key >

Settings > Sound & notification. You can adjust different types of volume (see *Adjusting Volume*), set Do not disturb options (see *Using Do Not Disturb Mode*), set up ringtone and notification sound (see *Changing Ringtone and Notification Sound*), select system sounds (see *Turning On/Off System Sounds*), control notification display, and check the apps that have requested notification access or Do not disturb access.

Apps

Touch the ${\bf Home\ key>} \ \Longrightarrow \ {\bf >Settings>} \ {\bf Apps}$ to see apps installed on your phone and manage them.

Touch an app to see its information. The following options are available:

- Stop the app.
- · Uninstall the app.
- Disable or enable the app.
- Storage: Check its storage information, move it between the internal storage and the microSDXC card when the microSDXC card is used as internal storage, clear its data or cache.
- Data usage: Check how much data has been used by the app during the time cycle you set and restrict background data for the app.
- Permissions: Check or change the app permissions.

- Notifications: Manage the app notifications in the notification panel and the lock screen. You can set the priority, sensitivity, and more.
- Open by default: Check the app's supported links and set whether to open the links in the app, and clear the app's defaults.
- Battery: Check the battery use details of the app since last full charge.
- . Memory: Check how much memory has been used by the app.



Not all options are available for the apps.

Storage & USB

You can choose the default location for new data, such as files downloaded, photos captured, and voice recorded. Touch **Save location** and select **Phone** or **SD card** to store items in the internal storage or the installed microSDXC card.

Touch **Internal storage** to get a detailed breakdown of space usage by type. Touch a data type to see more information or delete the files you do not need, or touch **Explore** to view and manage all files in the storage.

For more information about using the internal storage and the microSDXC card, see <u>Using the microSDXC Card as Portable or Internal Storage</u>.

Battery

Touch an app or service to adjust its settings in order to save battery life. For

example, touch Screen > Reduce the screen brightness and/or screen timeout to change screen brightness and sleep.

Touch Seattery saver to manage battery saving mode. You can turn on or off Battery saver, or set a battery level at which Battery saver can turn on automatically.

Touch * > Battery optimisation. Battery optimization helps prolong battery standby time when you're not using the phone. If there are apps that you don't want battery optimization enabled, you can turn the feature off in those apps. Just touch Not optimised > All apps, touch the app name and then touch Don't optimise > DONE.

Memory

Users

Touch the **Home** key > Settings > Users to manage the user accounts of your phone.

You can share your phone with other people by creating additional user accounts. Each user with a separate account has his/her own storage space, wallpaper, screen lock and so on. Users can also adjust device settings like Wi-Fi that affect everyone and update apps for all other users.

By default, a Guest account is available for anyone who needs to use your phone temporarily. You can touch **Add user** to create more user accounts.



- Touch next to an account to configure its options. From there, you can remove the accounts you created.
- When a guest user has finished using your phone, he/she can touch Remove guest in the Users menu to delete all his/her data from your phone.

Tap and Pay

Personal

Location

Touch the **Home** key > (iii) > **Settings** > **Location** to manage location services, which help your phone and apps determine your location. To use location-related applications, such as finding your location on Google Maps, you must have location services turned on on your phone.

- 1. Slide the switch at the top right to turn location services on or off.
- When location is enabled, touch Mode to select location sources you want to use. To get your accurate location, choose High accuracy. To save battery power and get approximate location, choose Battery saving. To use only GPS to pinpoint your location, choose Device only.

Security

 Screen lock: Disable the screen lock or enable it with swipe, pattern, PIN, or password. See <u>Protecting Your Phone With Screen Locks</u>.

- Make pattern visible: Show the pattern as you draw it. This option is available
 when unlock pattern is set.
- Automatically lock: Set the time needed for the lock protection to be activated
 after the screen turns off. This option is available when unlock pattern, PIN or
 password is set.
- Power button instantly locks: Lock protection is activated immediately when you press the Power key. This option is available when unlock pattern, PIN or password is set.
- Lock screen message: Set the text that you may display on the lock screen.
- Smart Lock: Keep the phone unlocked when connected to trusted devices, in trusted places, or unlocked by trusted faces or voice, or unlocked when your phone is being carried on the body.



You need to sign in to your Google account on the phone to use the **Smart Lock** feature.

 Encrypt phone: Encrypt your data on the phone to protect your privacy. See Protecting Your Phone With Encryption.

Set up SIM card lock:

- Lock SIM card: Activate or deactivate the PIN lock to require PIN before accessing the micro-SIM card.
- Change SIM PIN: Change the PIN used to access the micro-SIM card.



Put all your confidential passwords in a safe place for future use. If you enter the wrong SIM PIN more times than allowed, your micro-SIM card will be locked and you cannot access the mobile phone network. Contact your

operator for a PIN Unlock Key (PUK) to restore the micro-SIM card.

- Make passwords visible: Display passwords as you enter them.
- Device administrators: View or deactivate apps you have authorized to be device administrators.
- Unknown sources: Check this option to permit installation of apps from sources other than the Play Store.
- Storage type: Check the credential storage type.
- Trusted credentials: Display trusted CA certificates.
- Install from SD card: Install certificates from the internal storage or the microSDXC card.
- Clear credentials: Delete all certificates.
- Trust agents: View or deactivate trust agents.
- Screen pinning: Keep a screen of your choice in view, so that others cannot switch to other apps and access your personal information. Touch this option to see how it works. See <u>Protecting Your Phone With Screen Pinning</u>.
- Apps with usage access: Turn on or off some apps' access to your phone usage information.

App Permissions

Touch the **Home** key > Settings > App permissions to check what apps have been allowed to access certain permissions. You can also change the app permissions.



Changing the app permissions may result in the app not working correctly or as originally intended.

Accounts

Touch the **Home** key > (iii) > **Settings** > **Accounts** to manage your web accounts and synchronization. Touch **Add account** to sign in to or create accounts on your phone.

Touch an account type to see that type of accounts you have added and adjust the accounts settings.

Google

Language & Input

- Language: Select a language for your system.
- Spell checker: Use Google Spell Checker to check for spelling errors when entering text.
- Personal dictionary: Add new words to the phone's dictionary or remove words from the dictionary. The words you add are used for spelling check and word suggestion.
- Keyboard & Input methods: Configure text input settings. See <u>Input Method</u> <u>Settings</u>.
- Text-to-speech output:

- Preferred engine: Select the speech synthesis engine you want to use or change its settings.
- Speech rate: Select how quickly you want the synthesizer to speak.
- Listen to an example: Play a brief sample of the speech synthesizer, using your current settings.
- Default language status: Check whether the text-to-speech output feature supports the current system language.
- Pointer speed: Select how fast the pointer/mouse should scroll when you
 connect the phone to a trackpad or mouse accessory.

Backup and Reset

- Back up my data: Back up app data, Wi-Fi passwords, and other settings to Google servers after you sign in to your Google account.
- Backup account: Set the Google account that the data is backed up to.
- Automatic restore: Restore previously backed up settings and data when you
 reinstall an app.
- Network settings reset: Reset all network settings including Wi-Fi, mobile data and Bluetooth.
- Factory data reset: Reset your phone to factory default settings. All your data in the internal storage will be erased during the process.

Touch the **Home** key > (iii) > **Settings** > **Accessibility** to configure accessibility plug-ins and services on your phone, such as using **Colour inversion** or **Large text** for users with sight problems.

Printing

Developer Options

Touch the **Home** key > Settings > **Developer options** to manage settings that are useful for developing Android applications. The menu is hidden until you touch **Build number** in the **About phone** menu 7 times.



The developer option settings are intended for development use only. They can cause your phone and applications on it to break or misbehave.

About Phone

Troubleshooting

If you encounter problems while using the phone, or if it performs abnormally, you can refer to the chart below. If your particular problem cannot be resolved using the information in the chart, contact the dealer where you purchased the phone.

Problem	Possible causes	Possible solution
Poor reception	The network signal is too weak at your current location, for example, in a basement or near a tall building, because wireless transmissions cannot effectively reach it.	Move to a location where the network signal can be properly received.

Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

General Statement on RF Energy

Your phone contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your phone transmits.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR)

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed

the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organization ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to assure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg and the highest SAR value for this device when tested at the head was xxx W/kg^* , and when tested at the body was xxx W/kg^* . As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in this user guide**.

As SAR is measured utilizing the device's highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum power required to communicate with the network.

Body Worn Operation

Important safety information regarding radio frequency radiation (RF) exposure:

To ensure compliance with RF exposure guidelines the phone must be used with a minimum of 15 mm separation from the body.

Failure to observe these instructions could result in your RF exposure exceeding the relevant guideline limits.

Limiting Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Fields

For individuals concerned about limiting their exposure to RF fields, the World

Health Organization (WHO) provides the following advice:

Precautionary measures: Present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for the use of mobile phones. If individuals are concerned, they might choose to limit their own or their children's RF exposure by limiting the length of calls, or using 'hands-free' devices to keep mobile phones away from the head and body.

Distraction

Driving

Full attention must be given to driving at all times in order to reduce the risk of an accident. Using a phone while driving (even with a hands-free kit) can cause distraction and lead to an accident. You must comply with local laws and regulations restricting the use of wireless devices while driving.

Operating Machinery

Full attention must be given to operating the machinery in order to reduce the risk of an accident.

Product Handling

General Statement on Handling and Use

You alone are responsible for how you use your phone and any consequences of the use.

You must always switch off your phone wherever the use of a phone is prohibited. Use of your phone is subject to safety measures designed to protect users and their environment.

- Always treat your phone and its accessories with care and keep them in a clean place.
- Keep the screen and camera lens clean. Unclean screen or camera lens may slow down the phone's reaction to your operations or lower image quality.
- Clean your phone and its accessories with a soft material such as cleaning cloth for eyeglass lenses. Do not use alcohol or other corrosive substances for cleaning or allow them to get inside.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to open flames or lit tobacco products.
- Do not expose your phone accessories to liquid, moisture or high humidity.
- Do not drop, throw or try to bend your phone or its accessories.
- Do not paint your phone or its accessories.
- Do not attempt to disassemble your phone or its accessories, only authorized personnel can do so.
- Do not expose or use your phone or its accessories in an environment with or that can reach extreme temperatures, minimum - [5] and maximum + [50]

degrees Celsius.

- Do not place your phone inside or near heating equipments or high pressure containers, such as water heaters, microwave ovens, or hot cooking utensils.
 Otherwise, your phone may be damaged.
- Please check local regulations for disposal of electronic products.
- Do not carry your phone in your back pocket as it could break when you sit down.
- It is recommended to use you device in good radio conditions to decrease the amount of radiation received. You might be in bad radio conditions in places such as trains, cars or parking. Before using your mobile phone, it is also recommended to check the receipt of indications of your network operator.

Small Children

Do not leave your phone and its accessories within the reach of small children or allow them to play with it.

They could hurt themselves or others, or could accidentally damage the phone.

Your phone contains small parts with sharp edges that may cause an injury or may become detached and create a choking hazard.

Demagnetization

To avoid the risk of demagnetization, do not allow electronic devices or magnetic media close to your phone for a long time.

Electrostatic Discharge (ESD)

Do not touch the metallic connectors of the micro-SIM card.

Antenna

Do not touch the antenna unnecessarily.

Normal Use Position

When placing or receiving a phone call, hold your phone to your ear, with the bottom toward your mouth.

Air Bags

Do not place your phone in the area over an air bag or in the air bag deployment area as an airbag inflates with great force and serious injury could occur.

Place your phone safely before driving your vehicle.

Seizures/Blackouts

Your phone can produce a bright or flashing light. A small percentage of people may be susceptible to blackouts or seizures (even if they have never had one before) when exposed to flashing lights or light pattems such as when playing games or watching videos. If you have experienced seizures or blackouts or have a family history of such occurrences, please consult a physician. To reduce the risk of blackouts or seizures, you can use your phone in a well-lit room and take frequent breaks.

Repetitive Strain Injuries

To minimize the risk of Repetitive Strain Injury (RSI) when texting or playing games with your phone:

- Do not grip the phone too tightly.
- Press the buttons lightly.

- Use the special features which are designed to minimize the times of pressing buttons, such as Message Templates and Predictive Text.
- Take frequent breaks to stretch and relax.

Emergency Calls

This phone, like any other wireless phone, operates using radio signals, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you should not rely solely on any wireless phone for emergency communications.

Loud Noise

This phone is capable of producing loud noises, which may damage your hearing. Turn down the volume before using headphones, Bluetooth headsets or other audio devices.

Phone Heat

Your phone may become warm during charging and normal use.

Electrical Safety

Accessories

Use only approved accessories.

Do not connect with incompatible products or accessories.

Take care not to touch metallic objects, such as coins or key rings, or allow them to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.

Never puncture the surface of the battery with sharp objects.

Connection to a Car

Seek professional advice when connecting a phone interface to the vehicle electrical system.

Faulty and Damaged Products

Do not attempt to disassemble the phone or its accessories.

Only qualified personnel can service or repair the phone or its accessories.

If your phone (or its accessories) has been submerged in water, punctured, or subjected to a severe fall, do not use it until you have taken it to be checked at an authorized service center.

Volume



Prolonged mobile phone use with a very high volume may damage your hearing. Turn down the volume before using headphones or other audio devices.

Radio Frequency Interference

General Statement on Interference

Care must be taken when using your phone in close proximity to personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids.

Please consult your doctor and the device manufacturers to determine if the operation of your phone may interfere with the operation of your medical devices.

Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15 cm be maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this, use the phone on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.

Hearing Aids

People with hearing aids or other cochlear implants may experience interfering noises when using wireless devices or when one is nearby.

The level of interference depends on the type of the hearing device and the distance from the interference source. Increasing the separation between them may reduce the interference. You may also consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Medical Equipment

Switch off your wireless device when you are requested to do so in hospitals, clinics or health care facilities. These requests are designed to prevent possible interference with sensitive medical equipment.

Aircraft

Switch off your wireless device whenever you are instructed to do so by airport or airline staff.

Consult the airline staff about the use of wireless devices on board the aircraft and enable flight mode of your phone when boarding an aircraft.

Interference in Vehicles

Please note that because of possible interference to electronic equipment, some vehicle manufacturers forbid the use of mobile phones in their vehicles unless a hands-free kit with an external antenna is included in the installation.

Explosive Environments

Petrol Stations and Explosive Atmosphere

In locations with potentially explosive atmosphere, obey all posted signs to turn off wireless devices such as your phone or other radio equipment.

Areas with potentially explosive atmosphere include fueling areas, below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, and areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders.

Blasting Caps and Areas

Power off your mobile phone or wireless device when in a blasting area or in areas where signs are posted to power off "two-way radios" or "electronic devices" to avoid interfering with blasting operations.

However, there is no guarantee that interference will not occur in a particular installation If this equipment does cause harmful interference to radio or television reception, which can be determined by turning the equipment off and on, the user is encouraged to try to correct the interference by one or more of the following measures:

- -Increase the separation between the equipment and receiver.
- Connect the equipment into an outlet on a circuit different from that to which the receiver is connected.

RF Exposure Information (SAR)

This phone is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the United States.

During SAR testing, this device was set to transmit at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands, and placed in positions that simulate RF exposure in usage against the head with no separation, and near the body with the

separation of 10 mm. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

The exposure standard for wireless devices employing a unit of measurement is known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR.

The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6W/kg.

This device is complied with SAR for general population /uncontrolled exposure limits in ANSI/IEEE C95.1-1992 and had been tested in accordance with the measurement methods and procedures specified in IEEE1528.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. For this device, the highest reported SAR value for usage against the head is 0.53 W/kg, for usage near the body is 1.18 W/kg.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirements.

SAR compliance for body-worn operation is based on a separation distance of 10 mm between the unit and the human body. Carry this device at least 10 mm away

from your body to ensure RF exposure level compliant or lower to the reported level. To support body-worn operation, choose the belt clips or holsters, which do not contain metallic components, to maintain a separation of 10 mm between this device and your body.

RF exposure compliance with any body-worn accessory, which contains metal, was not tested and certified, and use such body-worn accessory should be avoided.
