Place the unit far enough from other equipments from good heat dissipation.


• Place the unit on a stable surface and out of reach of children to avoid damage to the unit or the risk of injury to people.




PLACEMENT OF THE SPEAKERS



DESCRIPTION OF THE FRONT PANEL OF SUBWOOFER AND REMOTE CONTROL

- 1-LED
- 2- IR: Wireless accept
- 3- MUTE: Controls the stand by of the system
- 4- VOL + / VOL -: To increase / decrease the master volume of the speaker system
- 5- SUB + / SUB -: To increase / decrease the volume of the subwoofer
- 6- STANDBY:Controls the standby or play state of the system
- 7- INPUT SELECT:To switch the input mode DVD,AUX,FM,AM of the speak System
- 8- SCAN+: To scan the tuner by manually or automatically
- 9- RESET:To set the volume of all channels into initialization

- 10- PRESET+/PRESET-:Read out the saved datas of tuner
- 11- ST/MO:To switch the output mode of tuner between FM stereo and single track
- 12- SAVE/CLEAR:To save/clear the datas of the tuner

1-AUS (L/R)

(3)SUB: Subwoofer Channel input connector.

(4)SL/SR: Surround Left / Right channel input connectors of the system.

3-OUTPUT (5.1CH)

(1)FL / FR: Front Left / Right channel output connectors of the system


(2)CEN: Center channel output connectors.

5-AC IN: AC power cord.




CONNECTIONS ILLUSTRATION:

< Connections of the Subwoofer, the Center, the Front Speakers >




- < Connections of the subwoofer and the audio source >
- 1. To PC, CD, MP3, Tape Player or any audio device offering a LINE-OUT audio connection.
- 2. To DVD



OPERATION

- 1-Press down the tip of the POWER rocker switch with a white "I" on the back of the subwoofer to turn on the system. The system is then turned on and the indicator light on the Digital Volume Display of the front panel will turn red.
- 2-Press the MUTE button on the remote control or the front panel of the subwoofer once, and the system will be switched to MUTE mode.
- 3-Press the following buttons on the front panel of the subwoofer or remote control to a suitable listening level.
 - (1) MAST + (VOL +) / MAST- (VOL -): to adjust the volume level of the system
 - (2) Press the SUB+ and VOL+ to adjust or SUB- and VOL- to increase or decrease the volume level of the subwoofer.
- 4-Press the MUTE button on the remote control once to turn off the volume of the system, and the mute indicator light on the front panel of the subwoofer will turn off. Press the MUTE button again and the mute indicator light will turn on.
 - * It is recommended that the POWER rocker switch on the back of the subwoofer be turned off and that the AC power cord be unplugged from the supply when the system is left unused for a long period of time.

BATTERY INSTALLATION:



Remember: The spring touches the " \ominus " side of each battery.

- < AC POWER >
- * Make sure that the power supply is correct and never handle the power cord or its plug with wet hands when plugging into, or unplugging from, and outlet.
