1. Safety precautions






4. Initial setup

 ✓ The photo frame is powered by the adapter which can directly connect with the frame or the cradle.

4.1 Plug for power

Insert the adaptor cable plug to the receptor which is either 1) on the right side of the photo frame or 2) at the bottom of the cradle. Connect the adaptor to the power outlet.



Right side of the photo frame


Bottom view of the cradle

When charging with the cradle, make sure the charging contacts of the photo frame are in contact with those of the cradle. The charging contacts are located at the bottom and

left panels of the photo frame.

Left panel (for portrait position)




Bottom panel (for landscape position)









4.2 Installation

You may place the photo frame onto the cradle for power in either portrait or landscape orientation.

Portrait position








✓ The larger end of the USB cable should be connected to the computer while the smaller end to the unit.

✓ Attention:

Make sure all data are transferred to the unit before unplugging the USB connection. Refer to the instructions of your computer system for safely unplugging the USB connection.

4.4 Loading media

4.4.1Transferring files to the unit from your computerTo transfer files to the unit, switch off the unit and connect it to your computer with a USB connection cable. The unit will appear as a removable disc drive on your computer.




From Windows Explorer, highlight all the files/folders you want to transfer to the unit and drag them to the drive letter that is associated with it.

After transferring files, please turn off the unit, disconnect the USB cable and power on the unit again. Such action is necessary to resume the unit to normal operation mode from PC-connection mode.

4.4.2 Inserting memory cards

You can insert either MS, CF, MMC, SD or xD memory card or USB device into corresponding memory card slot or USB connector. Refer to "Device mode" for selecting media source.












4.4.3 Care of memory card (not included)

- · Do not touch the golden electrodes.
- · Use a soft dry cloth to clean any dirt.
- · Do not bend memory cards.
- Do not operate or store the memory cards in places with frequent static electricity or electrical noise (e.g. speaker, TV set). Recorded data may be damaged.
- It is normal for memory card to get warm after being used for a long time.
- Always put it in storage case after removing from the unit.
- Do not store memory card near fire, places with high temperature/ humidity or in direct sunlight.

4.5 Switching on or off the unit

Slide the main power switch located on the right panel of the unit to power on or off the unit.



If you have more than one media source in the unit, a selection menu will show. Press \bigcirc or \bigcirc on the remote control to select your desired media source and then press **ENTER** to start using the unit.

Refer to the following sections for details on selecting files and playback of various types of file.





5.3 Remote control



OFF SCR - turns the unit's screen on or off

VOL + / – – increases or decreases volume

MENU - accesses the main menu

FUNCTION - accesses the function menu

Navigation keys (♠ ♠ ♦ ♦) – moves in the indicated

direction during menu navigation

ENTER – confirms selection

MUTE – mutes or restores the sound output

EXIT – returns to the previous screen

COMBO – starts photo slideshow and music playback in the internal memory

CLOCK – accesses the clock display function

MUSIC - plays music files in the internal memory

PHOTO - plays photo files in the internal memory

CALENDER – accesses the clock display function (refer to **CLOCK**)

SETTING - accesses the setting menu

FOLDER – accesses the folder mode in the internal memory


VIDEO - plays video files in the internal memory



✓ OFF SCR key only turns on or off the screen without switching off the power completely. The main power switch is on the right panel (refer to section 4.4).

5.3.1 Notes on the remote control

- On the remote control, remove the plastic tab from the battery compartment before first use.
- To replace battery, slide the release lock to the right and pull out the battery tray. (One button, type CR2025, battery required)
- When using the remote control, make sure you are pointing to the remote sensor located at the front of the unit.



CAUTION


Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly installed. Replace only with the same or equivalent type of battery.



6. Basic operations

Main menu can be seen once the unit is power on for selecting a mode.

> Available modes are: Photo (section 7), Music (section 8), Combo (section 9), Video (section 10), Folder (section 11), Clock (section 12), and Setting (section 13).





6.1 Main menu

Eight modes are available and shown on the main menu for selection, use the navigation keys (\bullet \bullet) to select one of them and press ENTER.



6.2 Volume control

- For media with sound output, press **VOL + / -** for volume adjustment
- Press MUTE to mute sound output temporarily. Press **MUTE** again to restore the sound output.







✓ Press FUNCTION for more features during playback.



✓ An example of the function menu shows at the bottom of the screen.

6.3 Function menu

- During playback of photos, music and movies, press **FUNCTION** on the remote control to show the function menu located at the bottom of the screen for more features.
- The availability of features depends on the type of file being played. Press or to select one of feature icons and then press **ENTER** for selection.









7. Photo mode

You can view digital photos (jpeg or bitmap) with this mode.

In the main menu, select the Photo mode icon as below:




7.1 Accessing Photo mode

 (♠ ♠ ♠) to select Photo mode and then press ENTER.



7.3 Auto tilting


This photo frame is equipped with Auto Tilting function, your photos will be displayed according to their orientation (portrait or landscape).

7.4 Photo function menu

- During slideshow, press FUNCTION on the remote control to show the function menu at the bottom of the screen for more features.
- 2. Press **⊙** or **⊙** to highlight one of the feature icons and then press **ENTER** to select the feature.


8.1 Accessing Music mode

In the main menu, use the navigation keys (♠ ♠ ♠) to select Music mode and then press ENTER.

OR

Press MUSIC on the remote control to access this mode directly.

8.2 Selecting music1. In Music mode, available media sources (e.g. SD or CF card) are listed on the screen, press the navigation keys ENTER.



2. Files available in the selected media source are listed, press the navigation keys (oo oo to select a desired file and then press ENTER to start playback of the selected file.










8.3 Music function menu

1. During playback, press **O** or **O** to highlight one of the feature icons and then press ENTER to select the feature.







2. Press **FUNCTION** again to exit the function menu.

8.4 Music playback mode

To activate repeat and random playback of music files. Refer to section 13.6 for details.



9. Combo mode

✓ In the main menu, select the Combo mode icon as below:



You can play both photo and music at the same time under this mode.


9.1 Accessing Combo mode

9.2 Selecting photos and music

 In Combo mode, available media sources (e.g. SD or CF card) are listed on the screen, press the navigation keys () to select a desired one and then press ENTER.



 Files available in the selected media source are listed, press the navigation keys (♠ ♠ ♠) to first select a desired Photo/Music file and then press ENTER to start slideshow from the selected file.



- To start slideshow with a specific photo file, select the desired photo file first and the first music file in the selected media source will then be played automatically while the slideshow is playing.
- To start slideshow with a specific music file, select the desired music file first and the first photo file in the selected media source will then be played automatically while the slideshow is playing.








9.3 Accessing photo and music function menus

1. During playback, press **FUNCTION repeatedly** on the remote control to show the photo or music function menu at the bottom of the screen for more features.


Video mode lets you watch digital movies from the unit.







In the main menu, use the navigation keys

OR

 Press FOLDER on the remote control to access this mode directly.

11.2 Selecting files

 In Folder mode, available media sources (e.g. SD or CF card) are listed on the screen, press the navigation keys () to select a desired one and then press ENTER.



- Files available in the selected media source are listed, press the navigation keys (♠ ♠ ♠) to browse items.
- Press ENTER while a folder is highlighted to view its content
- To exit from a folder, press .
- 3. Press **ENTER** while a file is highlighted to start playback.







- Read below for explanation of the function menu
- menu including "Return", "Paste" and "Delete".
 5. Press ♠ or ♠ to highlight one of the feature icons and then press ENTER to select the feature.

Return - return to file list

Paste – paste the selected file to a selected destination

For example: copying a file from CF card to internal memory:

- 1. Press to select a highlighted file (e.g. in CF card).
- 2. Press to go back to Folder / device menu.
- 3. Press the navigation keys () to select a desired device (eg. Internal memory) and then press **ENTER**.
- 4. Press **FUNCTION** of the remote control.
- 5. Select "Paste" and press **ENTER**.
- When you see the "Copy" menu, press ENTER to copy selected file to the Internal memory.

Delete - delete all selected files

- 1. Press to select a highlighted file.
- 2. Press **FUNCTION** of the remote control.
- 3. Select "Delete" and press **ENTER**.
- 4. When you see the "Delete" menu, press **ENTER** to confirm deleting file.







12. Clock mode

☑ In the main menu, select the Clock mode icon as below:



Refer to section 13 for setting the alarm.

Clock mode displays current date and time.

12.1 Accessing Clock modeIn the main menu, use the navigation keys (♠ ♠ ♠) to select Clock mode and then press ENTER.

OR

Press **CLOCK** on the remote control to access this mode directly.

12.2 Clock display

Refer to the diagram below for details:

- 1 = Calendar
- 2 = Current date
- 3 = Current time
- 4 = Alarm time (if set)



12.3 Setting date and time

To set the date and time for the unit, refer to sections 13.9 and 13.10 for details.

13.1 Accessing setting mode

In the main menu, use the navigation keys (\bigcirc \bigcirc \bigcirc) to select Setting mode and then press <code>ENTER</code>.

OR

Press **SETTING** on the remote control to access this mode directly.

13.2 Navigating in setting mode

1. Once you have entered Setting mode, the following setting items are available:



2. Press O or to highlight one of the items and then follow the instructions in the following sections for setting up respective item.







- Slideshow Mode defines how long each photo will be displayed in slideshow mode.
- ✓ Picture Play Mode defines the manner when photos change from one to another (e.g. from left to right, from up to down)
- Playback modes for both music and video: Standard or Random

The alarm clock setting can be checked in clock mode (section

13.3 Language Set

Press or to select the menu language.

13.4 Slideshow Mode

Press \bigcirc or \bigcirc to select the display time for each picture in the slideshow.

13.5 Picture Play Mode

Press • or • to select the transition mode for the slideshow.

13.6 Music Repeat Mode

Press • or • to select a repeat mode for music playback.

13.7 Video Repeat Mode

Press or to select a repeat mode for video playback.

13.8 Display Mode

Press or to select a screen display ratio (16:9 or 4:3).

13.9 Date

Press **ENTER** and then press **♦** or **♦** to shift among date, month and year. Press **♦** or **♦** to adjust values. When finished, press **ENTER**.

13.10 Time

Press **ENTER** and then press **②** or **③** to shift hour and minute. Press **③** or **⑤** to adjust values. When finished, press **ENTER**.

13.10 Alarm

Press **ENTER** and then press **O** or **O** to shift among hour, minute and ON/OFF of the alarm. Press **O** or **O** to adjust values. When finished, press **ENTER**.

13.11 Brightness

Press • or • to adjust the screen brightness.







14. Troubleshooting

If it appears that your unit is not functioning, first consult this checklist. It may be that something simple has been overlooked. Under no circumstances should you try to repair the unit yourself, as this will invalidate your warranty. Only qualified service personnel can remove the cover or service this unit.

The unit does not turn on.

 Make sure the unit is plugged into a working AC outlet or is fully charged (only for version with battery).

No picture

- · Make sure you have not selected output to external display device.
- · Make sure you have correctly insert media card.

The remote control is not working.

- · Make sure the battery is not empty.
- Make sure you are pointing the remote control directly at the unit while pressing the buttons.
- · Make sure you are not using the remote too far from the unit.
- · Make sure there is no obstacle between the remote control and the unit.

There is no sound from the unit.

· Make sure you have not pressed the MUTE button.



Buttons do not work.

• Try turn off the unit and turn on again to reset it. Do not touch the buttons until the main selection menu is shown.

Some files do not display on screen.

· Check if the files you are trying to play is encoded in a format supported by this unit.

Cannot play music, picture or video files.

- Make sure the mp3 files are not damaged. Try playing them on another player.
- Make sure the files formats are support by the unit. Refer to the table below.
