The Radio with FCC ID: VSOXP-100D was designed to operate in the frequency bands 136-174 MHz



Per the FCC's KDB634817 guidance, as an alternative to listing the exact frequencies, we acknowledge that it's a violation of the FCC Rules if this device operates on unauthorizedfrequencies.
