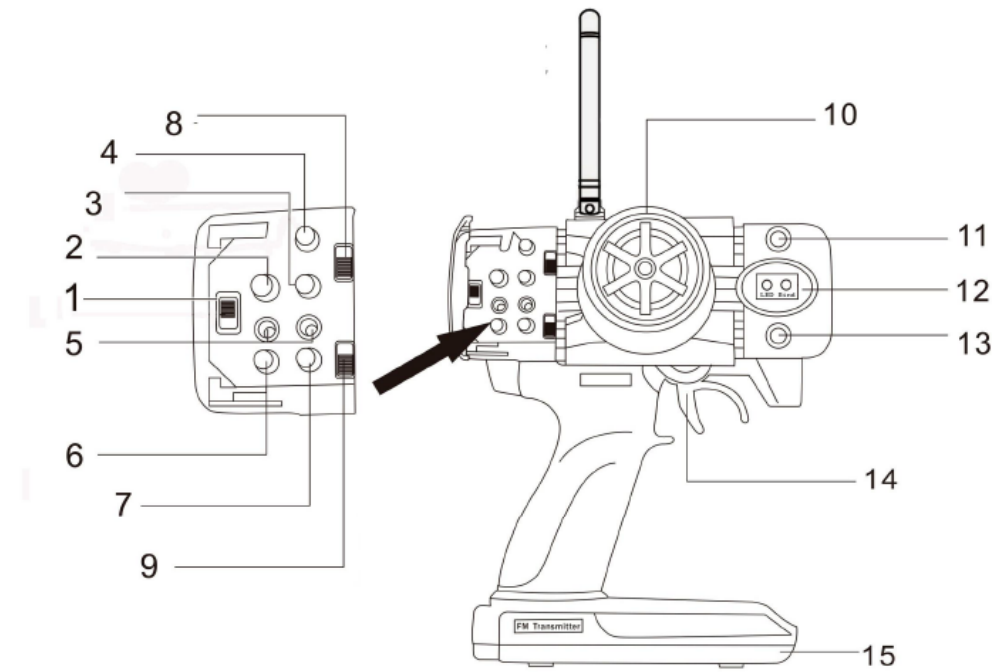


T3911-A User Manual



This device is a 2.4GHz transmitter used for model control.

Operation:

Match code—Turn on the power, press the coding button and the LED light flash. Then press the receiver's coding button, the LED will keep lighting after complete match code.

Avoid lose control setup—Normal condition, first setup the state of lose control every channel, then press the transmitter match code twice, the LED light flash three times, complete setup.
