1. Safety Information



Read this information before using your mobile device otherwise may result in personal injury or your device not complying with local laws.

Battery:

If a conductive material such touches the exposed terminal, short circuit may occur resulting in property damage, bodily injury or burn. To avoid risk of leaking electricity, take care when handling a charged battery particularly when placing it inside your pocket, purse or other container with metal objects.

Keep your mobile device from water:

Keep your mobile device dry.

Use while driving

Aircraft

Blasting areas

Potentially explosive atmospheres

When you inform the telecom company or agencies to lock your SIM card they need to know the IMEI No. of your phone, which you can find printed on the label on the back of your phone when taking off the battery. Please backup this number for future need For safety consideration, you can make preventative measures such as set PIN Code for your SIM card to prevent other persons using your SIM card without your permission.

Keep away from children

Keep the phone, battery and charger away from children to avoid any personal injury.

2. Use and Care

To care for this mobile device, keep it away from:



Any kind of fluid

Keep the device away from water, rain, humidity, sweat or other moisture.



Extreme heat or cold

Avoid the temperature below -10 $^{\circ}$ C/14 $^{\circ}$ F or above 45 $^{\circ}$ C/113 $^{\circ}$ F .



Microwave

Don't try to dry your phone in a microwave oven.



Dust and dirt

Don't expose your phone to dust, dirt, sand, food or other inappropriate materials.



Cleaning solutions

Use only a dry soft cloth to clean your phone. Don't use alcohol or other

3. Essential

3.1 Install the SIM card

Keep your SIM cards away from the children.

Please consult your SIM card franchiser about the services and usage. SIM franchiser can be the service provider, network provider or other franchisers.

Please turn off your mobile device and disconnect it with charger before removing the battery.

Note: turn off your mobile device and disconnect it with charger or any other device before removing battery door. Place the door on the phone before store and use your mobile phone.

1, Remove the battery door:

Press and jog the battery door let it glide to the top of the phone, then get the battery door off.

2, Insert the SIM card into the card slot:

Now you can see two card slots side by side, please insert the SIM cards with the right direction bases the chart.

3.2 Battery Use and Installation

Battery tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength, temperature, and accessories you use.

Always use Original batteries and chargers. The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-original batteries, charger and/or accessories.

New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge

When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.

When storing your battery, keep it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place.

Never expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F).

Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.

It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times. If you notice a change in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.

Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.

Battery installation

- 1, Slide the battery door up and then remove the door.
- 2. Aim the metal terminals of the battery at those in the battery compartment and then push down and into it.

Battery charging:

New batteries are not fully charged. Open the protective cover on your phone's accessory connector port, then insert the battery charger plug into the accessory connector port on the side of your phone as shown, and plug the other end into an electrical outlet. Your phone might require several hours to charge fully. When your phone is power off, it might take a few seconds to show charging display and it shows charge complete when finished. When your phone is power on, the battery icon flickers when it starting charging and become still with full bars in battery icon when finished.

3.3 Memory Card

You can use removable memory card with your phone to store information.

Caution: Don't bend or scratch your memory card. Keep it away from static electricity, water, and dirt.

Insert the memory card into the tray as shown below:

3.4 Turn it on/off

Caution: On power up, the phone may prompt you to enter your SIM card PIN code to unlock the SIM card. If your phone shows Input PUK code that express your SIM card is locked, please contact your web service provider.

To turn on your phone, press and hold the power on/off key for two seconds. If prompted, enter your four-to-eight-digit SIM card PIN code and/or four-digit unlock code.

If you don't insert a SIM card, your phone shows Insert SIM. None of the functions related to SIM card can be used and you can make an emergency call only.

To turn off your phone, press and hold the power on/off key for two seconds.

3.5 Make a call

1. Under the sleep mode, input the telephone number directly.

Steps will be different according to the options of call settings and set-ups of dual SIM:

Dual SIM open: Then press send key, you can choose menu -- SIM 1/SIM 2 to dial calls.

Only SIM 1 open/ only SIM2 open: If set only SIM1 or only SIM2, you can press send

key to dial calls.

3. After calling, press the power on/off key or end key to end.

3.6 Answer or Reject a call

When there is an incoming call, the phone rings and /or vibrates showing the number or

the corresponding name.

Now the phone provide three mode,

Not any key(set in profiles): Press answer key or enter option and then select answer

to receive a call. If you don't want to answer, you can press the power on/off key or right

soft key.

Any key: Except power on/off key and right soft key, press any key to answer a call.

Earphone/Bluetooth mode: when plugging the earphone(including bluetooth earphone),

you can answer a call by pressing the key on the earphone; when you are not convenient

to press the key, you can turn on the auto-answer mode (only in earphone mode) and

make sure the earphone is plugged, your phone auto-answers a call 5 seconds after it

rings and/or vibrates.

3.7 Operation during a call

Press Option to perform following operation during a call:

Hold Single: Hold this call

End Single: Hang up and end this call

New Call*: Enter a new dialing display to make a new call

PhoneBook: Enter the phone book

Messages: Enter messages

Mute: Set mute on or off. When setting mute on, your voice can not be

heard through the line.

Swap*: Switch between the current call and the holding call

Conference*: You can add additional parties to a call.

Note: the menus marked with * must be supported by your SIM card. For details, please

contact your service provider. Only when two or more calls are on can Swap and Conference show.

3.8 Insert international access code

When you are dialing an international call, keep press * **key** till the international call prefix "+" shows and then enter the number in the following order:

+ Country code complete number send key

3.9 Dial a extension or voicemail number

You need to enter P (pause) or W (wait) when dialing an extension number, keep press * **key** to switch between 'P' and 'W'. You can enter numbers as following:

District code exchange phone number P or W extension number send key

3.10 Emergency calls

You can make emergency calls as long as your current location is network-covered which you can know by checking the signal strength bar showing on the top left corner of the screen.

Note: Emergency numbers vary by country. The emergency number(s) in your phone may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

Note: "STK" shows different contents according to different service provider. When two SIM

Cards are used at the same time, two STK menus may be shown according to the type of the SIM Card.

6. Messaging

You can receive and send messages, and MMS including Multimedia Information, include photos, pictures, music and text. And can also use broadcast message and voice mail box. All the service is web service and need web supporter. Please contact the provider before using. Messages make it possible for you to exchange messages with other wireless phone users. Enter main menu from idle and then select **Message** to perform operation.

Entering the delete messages menu, you can choose delete all Inbox, Drafts, Outbox and send messages, and you can also choose Delete all messages to delete all messages in your phone.

6.7 Broadcast messages

After entering the Broadcast message menu, you need to select the SIM card—Broadcast message for card 1/card 2 to perform the following operations.

Cell Broadcast is messages sent from network operator to GSM phone users, such as weather broadcast, traffic situation, stock updates etc. every kind of Cell Broadcast has a fixed model number and the phone can automatically store it when you receive a Cell Broadcast from a new channel. The new Cell Broadcast message covers the old one if they are from the same channel.

Battery Tips
